INDIA IN SPACE WITH EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES

Rtn. Sumit Kalra opened the proceedings by an energetic introduction of the Speaker as the "Rocket Scientist Extraordinaire."

Dr. Sudhakar, Deputy Director, ISRO started off with some facts:

- 1. The Earth's atmosphere extends to about 100km from the earth's surface
- 2. Rockets Were Inspired by Fireworks:
 - First Century AD, Chinese used simple form of gunpowder to create explosions during festivals (sounds familiar?)
 - In 1232 AD, the Chinese repelled the Mon gol invaders by a barrage of "Arrows of flying fire"
 - The Germans used rockets against the British starting from the 16th century upto WW2
- 3. The sun is 109 times larger than the moon although they look about the same size from earth.
- 4. The Space Era Dawned on Oct 4, 1957 when the Russians launched Sputnik 1 putting the first human in space. Hence, Space Week is celebrated in the first week of October.

He then went on to articulate that when one thinks about how humans have interacted with space, **two broad categories stand out – Space Applications and Space Explorations.**

A. Space Applications:

Dr. Sudhakar made a compelling argument on how India has done exceeding well in the area of Space Applications. We have utilized space applications in numerous areas including:

- Agriculture
- Governance
- Communications
- Disaster Management
- Weather Forecast
- Resource Monitoring
- Navigation
- Health Care



His statement "If satellites were down for one hour, we would not have mobile phones, internet, banking services etc." led to a collective gasp in the audience.

B. Space Explorations:

This is a nascent area for India. Yet, India is globally recognized as a powerhouse in harnessing the benefits of space. We have placed 43 foreign satellites into orbit.

India's indigenous space program has been amazingly cost effective as shown in the table below:







his In every factory under stewardship, Ashok Bajaj was a visionary of innovative manufacturing techniques. His penchant for pushing boundaries embracing cutting-edge methodologies elevated standards of quality and efficiency, setting benchmarks for others to follow. His legacy lives on in the meticulous craftsmanship of every instrument bearing his imprint "SISCO".

He was not content with merely contributing to his field; he sought to shape its very foundations. As a distinguished member of the Bureau of Indian Standard, he lent his expertise to the formulation of guidelines that continue to govern the industry, ensuring safety and precision for generations to come.

Beyond the confines of professional realm, Ashok Bajaj was an ardent advocate for sports . His tenure as the General Secretary of the Tamil Nadu Badminton Association (TNBA) and Treasurer in the Badminton Association of India (BAI) spanning many fruitful years until 2016, is a testament to his dedication. Under his guidance, these organizations thrived. becoming bastions of excellence in the world of Indian sports. Representing India in the Beijing and London Olympics, he did our country proud. He was also the manager for the Indian Badminton team for the Common Wealth

games bringing Badminton into the limelight, as a sport to reckon with. He dedicated himself in building world class infrastructure at SiriFort Sports Complex making the sport accessible to youngsters from all facets of life.

Many who once sought his mentorship have now blossomed into successful entrepreneurs in their own right. His influence went far beyond the assembly line; it permeated the very essence of their professional journeys.

By sponsoring the education of many children of his workers, he sowed the seeds of a brighter tomorrow, one classroom at a time.

An avid golfer, a fantastic badminton player, however, it was off the field where Ashok's true fighting spirit shone the brightest. When confronted with the formidable adversary of stage IV lymphoma, he faced it head-on with remarkable resilience. Instead of succumbing to despair, he chose to live life to the fullest, embracing each day with unwavering determination.

He had a remarkable gift - he had the innate ability to light up every room he walked into. His presence was like a burst of sunshine with positivity, and an infectious energy that lifted the spirits of those around him.

As a husband, he offered his wife unwavering support and a love that knew no bounds. Through every challenge and triumph, he stood by her side, a source of comfort and strength. In his role as a father, he loved each of his three children, nurturing them to become independent, confident, and deeply empathetic individuals. He instilled in them the values of self-reliance and compassion, shaping them into remarkable human beings. dynamic personality, his incredible sense of humour and his ability to tell you the truth with such dignified wisdom lives on in all his children.

As we bid farewell to a Titan in the realm of Surgical Instrument manufacture, let us remember him not only for his professional achievements, but for the profound impact he had on lives and communities. His legacy is etched not only in the hearts of his wife and three children, six grandchildren but in the hearts and minds of all those fortunate enough to have been touched by his wisdom, generosity, and vision.
