A DAUGHTER OF INDIA!

A wonderful peace chant wafted through the air as we entered our regular meeting hall. And then a simple and effective video on "We Shall Overcome' played. What a lovely way to set the ambience! The presence of Inner Wheel Members and teachers from our Seliayur campus added energy in the room. We were all set!

President Ravi linked how today's event was a manifestation of what he had highlighted at his inauguration about peace being one of Rotary's pillars. Then, Rtns. Sandhya, Bhaswar and Fharzana took over. And how wonderful did they curate an excellent conversation with remarkable lady — Dr. Kriti Bharti, a true 'Angel of Courage'/ 'Real Sherani of India.'

Sandhya highlighted some key facts that had the audience enthralled and inspired:

- Dr. Kriti has successfully annulled over 50 child marriages and pre vented 1,500 of them.
- Over 20,000 victims have been rehabilitated
- The CBSE has included her work in the syllabus
- The BBC has included her in its list of 100 influencers

Dr. Kriti began with the traditional Rajasthani greeting – 'Khamma Ghani' (Many Greetings). Communicating in a very down to earth manner, combining English and Hindi and by balancing the serious topic with humor, Dr. Kriti won our hearts.

She spoke about being abandoned by her father before she was born and her mother being under severe pressure to have an abortion. She faced physical and mental abuse growing up and even being poisoned at age 10 which led to be bedridden for 2 years.

At 12 she made a decision to change her surname to avoid being identified by her caste and became the 'daughter of India' – Kriti Bharati was born! She spoke movingly about the choices she faced— to be killed or kill abuse and exploitation – bravely she choose the latter!

Bhaswar and Fharzana had prepared really well and asked well thought through questions. Here is a snapshot of the discussion:

Q: What causes child marriage?

A: • Following age old customs

- Saving the child from sexual exploitation
- Fear of elopement/love marriage
- One less mouth to feed (become more acute post covid – due to economic hardships)

Q: What are some notable examples you have dealt with?

A: Three instances:

The groom (under age) was the informer but did not want his identity revealed. The family replaced him with an older man when questioned!

A young girl was asked to pay Rs. Six Lakhs by community leaders for annulling her marriage. Her father too did not support her.

When questioned, the groom of a 16 year old girl said that there was no marriage even as there was no invitation card or official photos. Fortunately, social media told a different story.

Q: What are the different type of interventions vou undertake?

A: 5 types:

- 1. Child marriage annulment
- 2. Prevention of child marriage
- 3. Information campaigns and oath taking at community level
- 4. Rehabilitation of young brides who are isolated and unsupported
- 5. Using social media campaigns

Q: What is involved in rehabilitation?

A: Psycho-social support, livelihood, education, shelter and community education. Plus motivating them to continue their studies is the only fees her organization expects!


Dr. Kriti ended with three powerful thoughts

- Child marriages happen all across India and the world (even in the UK!)
- To gain peace, we have to be willing to have conflicts!
- We can each support this cause through time/money/resources without needing to be front line activists!

Rtn. Sabina epitomized elegance, warmth and thoughtfulness as she thanked the many many players involved in putting together this event. A special mention to President Ravi for giving the International team the freedom and support to curate this event and Chair-Person Guna for pulling it all together!

DAY OF PFACE

September 21st is celebrated as International Day of Peace. The United Nations' aim in assigning this date to Actions for peace, is to promote peaceful, just and inclusive societies that protect the human rights of women, children and the marginalized. Strengthening the ideals of peace involves fostering compassion and empathy to resolve all conflicts.

This is both an individual and collective responsibility. We at the Rotary Club of Madras invited Dr Kriti Bharti, who actively champions the rights of women and children, freeing them from the clutches of 'Child Marriage'.

She is a crusader who "annulled" India's first Child Marriage.

In 2012, her Saarthi Trust made history by annulling the first child marriage in India. As of date, she has annulled several hundreds of child marriages and prevented more than 1600 of them.

In 2022, Dr Bharti was honoured with the Global Youth Human Rights Champion Award by the Geneva Center for Human Rights & Global Dialogue, GCHRGD, as a Human Rights Champion.

PROJEC

n September 16, 2023, a ground breaking ceremony took place at Nemili Government High School. The event was attended by fellow Rotarians of our club, school children, school staff, and the contractors. The purpose of the project is to construct new toilet facilities and hand washing stations for the 195 boys, 230 girls, and 30 faculty members in the school. Additionally, a digital classroom is being installed, with RCM investing about 15 lakhs in the project.

It is worth mentioning the grand reception that the government school organised, which included NCC cadets playing in the band.

After the ceremony, the entire group of Rotarians proceeded to Sulerikattukuppam, where we had previously invested 6.5 crores in building houses, a community hall, a school, a cold storage facility, and 46 merchandise boats as part of our tsunami relief efforts. In order to assist the 210 households affected by the construction

of the desalination plant, we distributed 5 kgs of rice to each household. Rtn. Rajesh Somasundaram then hosted lunch for all the participants.
