It was indeed a proud moment as an Indian!

IIT is opening it's first ever overseas campus and that too led by a lady. Prof Preethi is the first ever female Director of an IIT. The campus opens its door later this month in Zanzibar, Tanzania.

A bit about Dr. Preethi:

She grew up in Mysore, got her BTech in chemical engineering where she also met her future husband. Then onwards to post graduate degrees in MIT and Cambridge. Suitably impressed? Then she taught at II Mumbai and Madras. She is a great advocate for women in academia.

IIT Madras:

Dr. Preethi nicely traced the growth of IIT Madras. IIT M founded in 1959 with 40 students. Now 10,000 strong with 650 faculty.

- 30 per cent women,
- 100 international students.
- 50,000 alumni.

IITM was previously strong only in the undergraduate space but now it's a research and entrepreneurship hub. Further, there is increased engagement with the local community in various projects like water and the environment. Online courses for all ages and digital skills are also offered.

IIT Zanzibar

Subjects in IIT M are not taught in silos anymore but are increasingly interdisciplinary making students 'job ready'. This approach is being adopted in Zanzibar. In alignment with its

globalization focus, the IIT M's data science and AI emphasis will be felt strongly in the overseas campus.

The residential campus will be more than a college, with research and innovation taking centre stage. Extra-curricular clubs and entrepreneurship mentoring will enable West and East African students to become leaders once they graduate.

Diversity on campus with a good gender balance, 50 % Africans and the rest Indians.

Why Zanzibar? IIT M explored options in Sri Lanka, Uzbekistan, Nepal. Though they are autonomous, the Ministry strongly encouraged them to locate it in a place where there is a strong buy from the local govt. The fully funded 200 acre campus funded by the Govt of Tanzania swung the vote. Oct 24, 2023 on UN Day and Vijayadashmi (auspicious day for learning in Tamil Nadu) the first class will commence graced by the President of Tanzania.

The Admission Process

Since the programs are interdisciplinary, they have moved away from the JEE for admission. They have devised their own entrance exam - Math, English and Analytical testing - with an interview to cater to the International students. Offering both UG and Masters programs. Clearly a huge step in Indian education reaching the world!
