




"In 1996, my father sat me down and gave me a challenge," said Bharath Bala, the speaker for the week. The challenge was for Bharath Bala to channel all his creativity and expertise as an advertiser and filmmaker to "create an idea for India... an idea that will help youngsters feel a certain fervour and pride for the country."

Bharath Bala was so inspired by his father's words that he quit his career in advertising and began working on projects that document and celebrate the idea of India. His former career in advertising helped him as he embarked on this journey. From "thinking differently" to "learning how to say the most important things in 30 seconds," advertising had given him skills that helped him tremendously as a filmmaker.

One of his first projects involved documenting the Gandhian idea of "ahimsa" around the world. For this project, he had the privilege of filming Nobel peace prize winners, including Araftat, Mandela, and Shimon Peres. Bharath Bala quoted Shimon Peres who said, "Gandhi does not belong to the past, Gandhi belongs to the present and is still relevant." Bharath Bala often returned to the idea of Gandhi in his talk – Gandhi as a freedom fighter, a peacemaker, a person who could fire up our imaginations about the idea of India.

Bharath Bala's boldest new project is "Virtual Bharath," a project that aims to create 1000 short films about the diversity and beauty of India. In these films, he uses the Indian flag as a symbol of the nation, and he pairs powerful music with moving visuals of everyday people. We Rotarians had the privilege of watching a number of his short videos – from Lata Mangeshkar's rendition of "Vande Maataram" to short films that document interesting religious traditions among different communities. The highlight of these short films was the cinematography. By

including fabulous close-ups of people's eyes and faces, Bharath Bala created a deep connection between the audience and the ordinary people whose stories are explored in these short films. While the films we viewed alluded to social issues such as economic struggles or inter-caste strife, they focused predominantly on the idea of faith and the fascinating religious practices of different communities.

The entire talk was interesting and provocative. Many Rotarians expressed feelings of patriotism at the end of the talk, and everyone seemed to be thinking about the power of creativity and creative expression. A big thank you to Sanjay Madhavan for inviting Bharath Bala to share his creativity with our Rotary club!


HEALTHY CHUTTIES

The Rotary Club of Madras, in association with the Inner Wheel club of Madras executed a fantastic project for the visual impaired by providing them with SMART VISION GLASSES.

In my 35 years of service with the visual impaired, I have done many projects such as:

- 1. Basic walking stick which made Visual Impaired independent
- 2. Mobile track to record their lessons
- 3. Scanners to read their textbooks
- 4. Computer courses to learn Google

Help them type on a word document etc. Then came the ANDROID PHONE, which helped them climb the ladder of success. They were able to learn G Pay, phone pay, check bank accounts, WhatsApp and even book an Uber.

As soon as President Rtn. Ravi Sundaresan suggested and the list of beneficiaries was sorted, INNER WHEEL Club of Madras pitched in to support the project. This SMART VISION GLASS-ES changed the whole perception of life and has given them a reality check.

The SMART VISION GLASSES have many features:

- 1. It can scan the page and can speak with voice over.
- 2. It can detect moving forms ahead of you and obstacles too.
- 3. It has a face recognition mode and informs them about different colours too.

This is a remarkable and definitely a life changer for a visually impaired person and is indeed a noble and life-fending project.

SBI FUNDS MANAGEMENT LIMITED AND ROTARY CLUB OF MADRAS HANDED OVER THE DIGITAL MAMMOGRAM FACILITY AT DEVAKOTTAI

DEVAKOTTAI MAMMOGRAM

On Saturday, 28th October, the Rotary Club of Madras inaugurated a Digital Mammogram machine at Devakottai near Karaikkudi. The project is valued at 80 lakhs.

This is the first of its kind Free Digital mammography, which is available in that region. The project was fully funded by State Bank of India Mutual Funds, and the medical partner is Adyar Cancer Institute (WIA).

The Rotary club of Madras, as part of their Women and Health initiative, identified Devakottai as an area where free mammography was not available for 4 districts. Sivaganga, Ramanathapuram, Virudhunagar, and Pudhukottai have a sizeable women's population in rural areas and all of them had to travel to Madurai or Trichy for preventive screening as only those cities offered free Mammograms.









With a significant rise in the number of women needing breast cancer screening, this facility will be crucial in early detection.

Inaugurating the facility, the Chief Guest, Mr. S.Ganesan Chief Operating Officer of SBI FUNDS MANAGEMENT LTD, spoke about the importance of such initiatives in rural areas where a large number of women will benefit.

Dr Kalpana Balakrishnan, Director of Adyar Cancer Institute spoke about the increasing incidence of breast cancer among the female population.

Dr Malliga Subramaniam, Head of Preventive Oncology Adyar Cancer Institute spoke about the Devakottai Vallal Mena center and the help extended by local patrons.

Rtn. Ravi Sundaresan, President of the Rotary club of Madras highlighted the importance of spreading the message of cancer prevention in the villages and also said the Rotary Club of Madras is committed to creating more such outreach programs for the benefit of society.

RCM'S EXPANDING REACH: CONTRIBUTING TO MEANINGFUL PROJECTS BEYOND CHENNAI

President Rtn. Ravi Sundaresan, along with Advisor Ravishankar and Past President Jayshree Shridhar, CS1 Director Anuradha Ganesan , Krish Vijayan, Shivkumar Easwaran, Sakthivel & Arvind Shankar visited the project site in Madurai. Their destination was the Sakkimangalam village, where 45 families of visually impaired persons reside. In a heartwarming gesture, the Rotary Club of Madras stepped forward and contributed thirteen lakhs towards the construction of these last four houses, out of a total value of twenty lakhs and eighty thousand rupees.


