




Dear RCMers,



Secy ended by saying that Success makes everyone happy and that's what RCM does consistently.


The meeting was then adjourned. National Anthem was played. ■

The Rotary Club of Madras is thrilled to announce the launch of its highly anticipated community services projects, aimed at making a positive difference in our local community. These projects, which encompass various aspects of community development, will officially commence on July 9th at 10:30 AM at the Boys Town campus in Gummidipundi.

Water Body Management

As part of our efforts to restore and enhance the environment, the Rotary Club of Madras will undertake the restoration of the Poovalembedu Irrigation tank. This project, covering an area of 110 acres, aims to increase water storage capacity by about 63,000 cubic meters. Additionally, a oneacre water body will also be created at the Boys Town campus.

Budgeted at a total of INR 41,64,550, this project will be executed in collaboration with the Dhan Foundation, known for their expertise in environmental conservation.

These projects, which encompass various aspects of community development

Home for the Homeless

Recognizing the importance of providing shelter for the homeless, the Rotary Club of Madras will construct 15 houses at Thathiyaarkandigai for the Irular and Narikurava communities. Each house costs approximately 3 Lakhs and will span 271 square feet, with a total budget of INR 45 Lakhs. This initiative will be carried out in association with Ahaguru, an organization dedicated to uplifting marginalized communities.

Rural Sanitation

To promote hygiene, prevent diseases, and ensure a healthier community, the Rotary Club of Madras will construct 205 toilet blocks in JJ Nagar Palavakkam Panchayat, Uthukkottai, Thiruvallur District. With an allocated budget of INR 62 Lakhs, this initiative aims to create an open defecationfree environment and improve overall sanitation conditions in the area.

Community services committee invites all our Rotarians to join us at the Boys Town campus on July 9th, as we embark on this journey.

Rotary Club of Madras Digital Learning Program For Govt & Corporation Schools

A s you are all aware, in PE Rtn Ravi Sundaresan's year, a key & unique project under Vocational Services is the **RCM DIGITAL LEARNING PROGRAM** for government & corporation schools in and around Chennai, to be implemented in association with the Rotary Clubs in the District. The Technology partner is TATA Classedge – part of the TATA Group.

We kickstarted our activity for this project with a High Tea event on June 13,2023 held at Hotel Maris that was a resounding success. We had invited a cross section of Rotary Clubs and despite the short notice **16 Rotary Clubs including our own Next Gen club participated in the event** – and the good news is that **14 Rotary Clubs have prima facie shown great interest** to partner with us in this project, subject to their board approval. Keep in mind that a large percentage of the representatives from the clubs were President-Elects.

The Rotary Club of Madras team led by PE Rtn Ravi Sundaresan ably supported by Rtn Ravishankar, PP Rtn Dr Arulmozhi Varman, Rtn Vijay Balaji, SE Rtn Seshasai, Rtn Sanjay Chaganti and Rtn A.M. Viswanathan shared with the visiting Rotarians the RCM Digital Learning program Highlights, Objectives, Role & responsibilities. PE Rtn Ravi Sundaresan closed out the discussion with a detailed overview of each and every aspect of the program & process that really touched a chord in the visiting Rotarians that 14 out of the 16 Rotary Clubs present were unanimous in their appreciation of the hardwork put in already by RCM to present this project and for the unique nature of the project where Rotary Clubs get to partner RCM & the icing on the cake – this project is actually their Rotary Clubs project (not RCMs) though the technology, 90% of funding all are being provided by RCM.

We expect positive confirmations by June 20, 2023 that will give the new Rotary Year a solid start.
