Now, 50 years later, we commemorate his extraordinary service. Rtn. AVM Balu's impact, resonating both at the Club and District levels, is nothing short of remarkable.

Within the Rotary Club of Madras,

Rtn. AVM Balu served as Director of International Services, gracing the board for years. As the Director, he initiated the very first Exchange Programme with the Rotary Club of East Fresno, USA, fostering international friendships and cultural exchange.

He hosted the much-enjoyed "Kalyana Samiyal


Sadham," a full club fellowship fostering camaraderie.

In championing polio awareness, Rtn. AVM Balu played a pivotal role in the "My Flame My India" Project.

Originating in RCM, the Rotary Flame embarked on a global journey. Subsequently, Rtn. Balu took up the significant task of carrying this symbolic flame to several clubs within the district, amplifying Rotary's commitment to eradicating polio.

He has been twice honored as "Best Rotarian," Rtn. AVM Balu's benevolence and support for Rotary projects shine beyond titles and accolades. A humble person, he believes in the saying that the left hand should not know what the right hand does when it comes to charity.

At the District level, he adorned various key roles, including District Chairman for International Services under eight District Governors. His





legacy boasts organising international fellowships, leading Rotary delegations to diverse corners of the world, like East Africa, South Africa & Turkey.

Signing prestigious Sister Club agreements, notably with the Rotary Club of Dubai. Organising a Cycle Rally from Chennai to Malaysia for Rotractors

His influence extended to mentoring the Group Study Exchange Programme, steering District Conferences, advising President Elect Training Seminars, and championing the Awards Programme.

The Rotary Club of Madras had the pleasure of hosting a distinguished guest speaker, Kartiki Selena Gonsalves, renowned for her compelling documentary, "The Elephant Whisperers."

The event, skilfully and seamlessly moderated by Sanjay Madhavan, delved into Kartiki's extraordinary journey and insights into the world of documentary filmmaking.

This trailblazing Indian director and documentary filmmaker, holds the unique distinction of being the first Indian film director to receive an award for her exceptional work on "The Elephant Whisperers." Her multifaceted career includes roles as a cinematographer and co-executive producer, coupled with experience as a camera operator for globally recognized channels like Animal Planet and the Discovery Channel. Currently residing in the Nilgiris, Kartiki has not only made her mark in filmmaking but also founded Birth Spectrum in 2018. This organization harnesses the power of storytelling to raise awareness about diversity and cultural life.

Sanjay commenced the discussion by lauding Kartiki's dedication to attending the meeting of the Rotary Club of Madras despite the challenging weather conditions. He highlighted the emotional impact of "The Elephant Whisperers" and recommended it as a must-watch.

Kartiki shared her captivating journey, from her early years at IIT Chennai to her eventual immersion into nature in Ooty. Her initial ambition as a photographer transformed into a passion for visual communication, film making, and photography during her college days. A pivotal question about happiness and passion led her back to Ooty, where she discovered the world of wildlife photography and tour guiding. Living with the Muslim community near the India-Pakistan border fueled her transition to cinematography.

The turning point came with her encounter with Raghu, a baby elephant, on the side of the road. This marked the beginning of a remarkable journey that spanned six years, resulting in the emotionally charged and visually stunning documentary, "The Elephant Whisperers." The film gained global recognition after Netflix took over, opening doors for a broader audience and bringing attention to the plight of Asian elephants, leading to positive changes and recognised efforts of Bomman and Bellie, contributing to wild elephant conservation. Looking ahead,

Kartiki's next project focuses on the relationship between orcas and the First Nations in the Pacific Northwest of Canada. She envisions bridging the parallels between two matriarchal societies and continuing her storytelling journey.

The discussion then expanded with the entry of Sanjay Wadhwa and Lata Murugan posing crucial questions. Sanjay, the Managing Partner of AP International and an influential figure in the film industry, offered insights into the challenges of funding documentary films.

Lata Murugan, part of the AVM family with a background in film and documentary production, acknowledged her uncle Balu's 50th year at the Rotary and expressed the enthusiasm of her students at the L V Prasad school to learn from Kartiki, highlighting a growing interest in documentary filmmaking among the younger generation.

The dialogue touched on the challenges faced by documentary filmmakers, the evolving landscape of documentary filmmaking in India, and the potential for documentaries to make it to theatres through smaller platforms focusing on niche content. Technology's advancements were highlighted, as consumer-grade equipment now provides cost-effective alternatives. The

conversation also delved into the diverse nature of documentary filmmaking, from political propaganda to telling the stories of communities, often driven by passion and a desire to share meaningful messages.

Kartiki emphasised the need to change the perception of documentaries and advocated for fair compensation for filmmakers. She also pointed out the positive trend of Indian stories making a splash in the market, marking the beginning of a new era for documentary filmmaking. The essence of documentary filmmaking, she emphasised, lies not just in capturing visuals but in being open, listening, understanding communities, gaining trust, and telling their stories with authenticity.

In conclusion, the afternoon left the audience with a call to action from Kartiki. She urged aspiring filmmakers to tell stories with passion, stand strong with simple ideas, and believe in the world's eagerness to embrace their narratives. The conversation underscored the challenges and opportunities within the documentary filmmaking landscape in India, charting a promising course for the future.


two children's growing up to be honest and compassionate individuals, and excellent, young, dedicated professionals, in their respective fields.

rgan donation - the word conjures up various questions in one's mind. A noble cause alright, but fraught with difficulties, a brave man's fight for justice, a landmark judgement and its offshoot... an organisation that works towards a better and smoother functioning of the system.

The Interact Club of Venky Yoda organized a webinar on 26th November 2023 on the topic "Complexities of Organ Donation Law in India." It is significant to note that this webinar was the first of its kind in India. The webinar saw many participants.... Rotarians, social media influencers, transplant recipient, Interactors and faculty coordinators. The webinar was supported by Rotary district 3232 and RCM.

It was an honour to listen to the keynote speaker, eminent Advocate Prashanth Ajmera, a Canadian citizen of Ajmera Law Group.

Advocate Ajmera discussed about the challenges he faced when there was a need within his close family as a recipient of organ donation. He gave details of the problems and solutions to the system. He recommended that a National Registry be available in local language, a procedural manual which is standardized and centralized. Further the Government approved



co-ordinators to be trained in law and counselling, availability of application in written format, linking of organ donation to the Aadhar Card as a document of proof. The current scenario is that the interpretation and application of the law tends to lean towards individual perceptions creating confusion where precious time is lost.

His organisation 'One India One Law' run by volunteers works tirelessly to simplify the complexities of organ donation and effectively reach out to the recipients and donors.

The focal point was the law, its amendments and regulations that govern it were addressed including the prevention of commercial dealing and the creation of a National Portal. Thus the first of its kind webinar on the legalities of organ

> donation opened doors for more dialogues and positive changes, and brought awareness on this all important but often neglected topic.
