In sports, the achievements of greats like Bob Beamon, Gary Sobers, and Mark Spitz, stood unchallenged for decades, but the records of these sportsmen were eventually surpassed by individuals like Mike Powell, Brian Lara, and Michael Phelps, who dared to dream bigger and reach farther.

It is this **spirit of determination and drive** that defines RCM's 95th President and his Board **Inspired by the legacy of those who led in the past 94 years**, this Board is committed to reaching new heights in service. This 95th Year at RCM has been extraordinary, and quite literally speaking, the man responsible for this is Rtn. Ravi Sundaresan, the 95th President of Rotary Club of Madras

I seek your indulgence in sharing a detailed background of President Ravi. Born in 1967 into a family rooted in **farming and handloom weaving**, Ravi faced adversity early in life with the loss of his father. However, he was fortunate to **inherit the resilience and determination** of his strong-willed mother. From a young age, Ravi **displayed traits** that would **shape his future as a leader in service**. His **unwavering faith in God, willingness to work tirelessly**, and an **indomitable spirit of never giving up**, have been the cornerstones of his character.

Graduating in Mechanical Engineering, Ravi



started as a Marketing Executive at AMUL, then joined MNC - TETRA PAK, where he honed his managerial skills until 1999. However, driven by a desire to create his own path, Ravi ventured into entrepreneurship, establishing **RELIANCE KRAFT PAPER INDUSTRIES.** His expertise in the kraft paper marketing sector earned him prestigious memberships in industry associations.

Family is central to Ravi's life. Wife Arunasree, a commerce graduate, is always by his side and his biggest supporter. Daughter - Shalini an Architect trained in Milan, Italy and Son - Santhosh Kumar, pursuing Post Graduation in UK, are his best friends.

Introduced to **RCM in 2010** by senior Rotarian Markand Desai, Ravi's journey in Rotary has been one of **continuous dedication and service**. His active involvement in various projects of **Community Service** and **Vocational Service** has been instrumental in making **14 villages open defecation-free, establishing a technical training centre for differently-abled students, renovating schools, initiating sustainable WASH projects and supporting women empowerment.**

Ravi's commitment to service has been recognised with numerous accolades and 11 awards, including recognition as the "Most Valuable Rotarian," "Best Rotarian" (twice), and many more from both RCM and the District. His philanthropic spirit is evidenced by his contributions as a **Major Donor** and by his **wife being a Paul Harris Fellow** herself.

A notable feature of Ravi's Presidentship is his constant focus on **RI's 5 Avenues of Service and 7 Areas of Focus** under his guidance, RCM has **added 14 new members** this year, implemented projects through **CSR and Global Grant**, and conducted **impact assessment** for several projects.

This year **member engagement has flourished** at RCM, with **weekly meeting attendance** increasing from **60 to 110**, strengthening of relationships **with leading outstation clubs**, and executing **joint projects for 5.1 million rupees with 25 clubs** within District 3232

His stupendous achievement has been in collecting 9,15,000 US Dollars, in just 7 months with a resolute aim to exceed 1 million USD by this Rotary year end. President Ravi's legacy is defined by action seen in Implementation of diverse projects, including housing, sanitation, and vital healthcare infrastructure.

President Ravi's **passion and vision to scale new heights** is made possible by a **dedicated team** that executes with **unwavering commitment and enthusiasm.**

Now, let us see the **remarkable achievements** of his Board Members: **Honorary Secretary**, Rtn. Sesha Sai has demonstrated **exceptional**



leadership. Has made **timely payment of District and RI dues** for our 277 members and done **prompt submission of reports.** He is diligently working on RCM's aspiration to achieve a **20% women membership** which **underscores our dedication to diversity and inclusivity**. Through **32 weekly meetings and 8 board meetings**, Rtn. Sesha Sai has ensured the **seamless functioning** of our club's **administrative processes**.

Our Immediate Past President, Rtn. Jayshree Sridhar has made invaluable contributions to healthcare initiatives. Under her leadership, RCM inaugurated the Mammogram Project in Devakottai, providing free mammography services across four districts. Her efforts on free cataract surgeries and arranging life-saving medical equipment, have ably supported President Ravi's commitment to addressing critical healthcare needs.

President-elect Rtn. Chella Krishna has played a pivotal role in streamlining fund mapping and supporting our CSR committee. His dedication helped ensure our club meets the CSR Donors compliance and audit requirements, Chairing the Finance Committee he vetted all our projects estimates, thereby enhancing our reputation as a premier trustworthy organisation. His role is selecting and coordinating RCM's Awards this Rotary Year is noteworthy.

Our President Nominee, Rtn. Nikhil Raj, has **demonstrated exemplary leadership** by following up on **global and district grants, PHF schemes,** and **CSR engagements.** His smooth organising of an **online meeting with Rotary International President Nominee Rtn. Mario,** exemplify his commitment to advancing our **club's international interactions.**

Under Director Rtn. Vikram Chesetty, Club Service activities have flourished at RCM. Through **32** enriching **weekly** meetings and **8** vibrant **full club fellowships**, our club has fostered strong bonds among **1000 Rotarians**, **spouses**, **and guests**. His Team facilitated **20 firesides**, engaging over **600 members** in personal interactions. Provided thrilling **outstation visit** experiences to over 150 RCMers. Inducted 13 new members, emphasising on excellence. Implemented biometric attendance and standardised member databases and formed a Member Engagement Committee that is performing wonderfully this year.

RCM's active participation at District events, including SANGAMAM 24, where RCM was a silver sponsor with contributions of 2.2 million rupees, and RCM's Past President Dr. Vijaya Bharati chairing the recent PETS 2024 at Colombo all showcase RCM's commitment to collaborative initiatives with District.

Under Rtn. Balaji Chinni's leadership in Youth Service, RCM has seen Installation of **28 Interact Clubs and 11 Rotaract Clubs**, including formation of **1 new Interact and Rotaract Club this year**, providing opportunities for youth engagement. The completion of our signature project, **STREET SCAPES**, has beautified streets near **18 participating schools**, enhancing our community's aesthetic appeal.

As Director of Fundraising & Public Relations, Rtn. Rahul Saraogi, guided by Rtn. Abdul Kareem Sait, organised the **highly successful RCM Merchants & Bankers Golf Tournament.** He has coordinated collection of **38 million rupees** so far this year, for diverse club projects. He also has led by example, becoming an **Arch Klumph Member** this year.

Rtn. Ganesh Ananthakrishnan, Director of CSR, has tirelessly worked to **secure partnerships with new Donors** comprising top corporations like **HT Parekh Foundation and Redington**, resulting in RCM receiving generous CSR contributions for **44 million** **rupees** until now this year. Additionally, we commend his **engaging role as an anchor** for our Green Rotarians' introduction program, **My Job Talks.**

The dedicated efforts of Rtn. Sabina Narayan has led to remarkable strides during her tenure as Director of Rotary Foundation & International Service. Along with Chairperson Rtn PP Gunashekar, International Relations at RCM have flourished this year, revitalised ties with JWD and Sister Clubs. RCM members have visited several international and domestic clubs as our Goodwill Ambassadors The redesigned eco-friendly RCM flag is her brain-child. Along with President Ravi, she spearheaded fundraising efforts for The Rotary Foundation, achieving a record-breaking \$9,15,000 in just 7 months.International travel experiences, including a trip to Japan, and an upcoming trip to Baku in April. provided valuable insights into traditions and cultures of other nations.

Rtn. Anuradha Ganesan, as Director of Community Service 1, has spearheaded transformative initiatives in line with our vision of Integrated Village Development. Through "Home for the Homeless" initiative, 42 families in Thathiyar Kandigai village have already been given houses. Along with Rotary Club of Madurai Star, RCM provided 4 tailored houses for visually impaired individuals in Sakkimangalam village, Madurai, The implementation of WASH projects in 6 schools across Tamil Nadu helped provide safe and hygienic learning environments, benefiting over 1600 students and teachers. Under Rural Sanitation, the 205 toilets and awareness programs in JJ Nagar have enhanced hygiene practices, benefitting 900 individuals

RCM's Boys Town offers a nurturing environment, specialized tutoring, extracurricular activities, all enabling 107 boys, aged 11 to 16, have hope, opportunity, and a brighter future. RCM's efforts to restore water bodies reflect our commitment to environmental sustainability.Under the steadfast guidance of Director Bharat Pujara, our Community Service 2 initiatives have touched several lives, fostering health, hope, and well-being. A donation of 0.5 million rupees facilitated 100 cataract surgeries

at VHS Hospital.

Our project "Save a Little Heart" supported 140 children. In partnership with Inner Wheel Club, RCM provided 27 smart vision glasses to visually impaired individuals. Through 13 medical camps, RCM reached out to 1,345 individuals. Along with Vision Foundation, RCM conducted 46 eyes screening camps, distributed 325 glasses, and performed 306 cataract surgeries. Our dental camps, conducted in partnership with GCC and Suryoday, benefitted 41,918 children.

A digital mammogram donation at Devakottai has empowered women across four districts with access to crucial diagnostic services. Our efforts in dialysis, conducting 1,200 cycles monthly and donating a dialysis machine to the Rotary Yoda Dialysis Centre, Pune, have provided vital support to 140 patients. Jointly with the Raj Charitable Foundation RCM donated an Inhaled Nitric Oxide Delivery System, valued at 1.7 million rupees, to the Kanchi Kamakoti Childs Trust Hospital.

Rtn. Vijay Balaji has proven to be a **dynamic** leader. In his tenure as Director, our Vocational Service initiatives have empowered individuals with opportunities for growth and development: The Digital Learning Program, a collaborative effort between RCM and District 3232, has reached over 20,000 underprivileged high school students, equipping them with essential digital learning tools and content.

Recognizing excellence, we **bestowed awards upon distinguished individuals** such as Mrs. **Omana Thomas,** Sri **N.R. Narayana Murthy,** and Mrs. **Suchitra Ella,** acknowledging their outstanding contributions.

Industrial visits to reputed institutions like Saint Gobain in Sriperumbudur, HAL Tejas & Helicopter Manufacturing division in Bengaluru, coupled with a brewery tour at Byg Brewski, provided learning and fellowship opportunities.

Our "EmployABILITY" Career Fair, organised with the Ability Foundation, facilitated job interviews for over 600 differentlyabled candidates, as Flood Relief Activities RCM provided relief kits and grocery kits at Chindadripet, Rotary Nagar, Selaiyur and Sembakkam.

Our Treasurer BTS and Club Funds, Rtn. Prabha undertook extensive efforts at the beginning of this year to **sensitise and obtain approvals for cost of member engagement initiatives. She also admirably handled the Entertainment activities** at the recently concluded District Conference **SANGAMAM 2024.** Both our treasurers – Prabha Srinivasan and Palaniappan – through their tireless efforts have ensured smooth financial operations and integrity of our club, and deserve a big Thank You!

Our Assistant Secretary Rtn.Sunita Suresh, has published **31** timely issues of our informative weekly bulletin – Light House, Each issue has been well-received for its wide content having snippets from Rotary International and District coverage of Fireside events, showcasing service projects, and celebrating achievements of RCMers, thereby fostering a sense of pride and recognition for our club worldwide. I sincerely apologise for taking so much of your time, but reflecting on accomplishments of this Board fills me, and I am sure all of you too, with immense pride. From fostering community development to nurturing educational initiatives, from advancing healthcare to promoting vocational opportunities, each endeavour has been guided by RCMs unwavering commitment to service above self.

This year, our theme of CREATING HOPE IN THE WORLD has resonated significantly in the extraordinary efforts of this Board and I am sure this will inspire those to follow at RCM to serve even better, by building responsible communities, embodying the spirit of Rotary in all that we do.

The session on "a legacy worth emulating" led the series for the evening of 95 years of Rotary Club of Madras. The intangible facets of RCM were well covered and couldn't get better given the collective experience of the individuals in the session being over 98 years in Rotary. The panel consisted of PDG Benjamin Cherian (38 years in rotary), PDG J Sridhar (23 years in Rotary), along with President S Ravi. The precursor to this session was a well compiled video on the legacy projects of RCM. This provided the premise for the moderated session led by Rtn. Shanno Ravi.

RCM's intangible legacy is its people, and this was elucidated clearly by PDG Benjy (as he is fondly known to all of us) in his opening remarks. He said while the projects were the pride of RCM, the work done by RCMers in the past of transforming communities, being pioneers of largest projects, our club being the recipient of the largest grants, educating 1000s of students, changing lives for the future, forever were what made RCM where it is today. It was beautiful to hear that Rotary from its processes, creates over 35000 leaders every year, and the Rotary mandate of a new president every year, ensures more leaders. He believed that following the bylaws, maintaining punctuality, great bonhomie, quorum and conduct, being generous with time, effort and funding were key to the legacy of RCM.

PDG J Shridhar added to PDG Benjy's comments and highlighted that the first RI Director from India was from RCM and was given the posted under special circumstances despite the candidate not being a District Governor. A true feather in our caps. He said like in the past, it was always of utmost importance to bring grace to the chair (the office bearer be it president or anyone)and urged all of us that this was something that we had to build on ensuring that the grace is never taken away from the chair. PDG Sridhar said there were two ways to look at RCM, its internal working and how RCM showcases itself externally. He believed that ethics and principles were fundamental to the club's legacy. Externally, RCM has been the leader in taking up largest impactful projects and lead from the front. Be it the red measles vaccine, polio vaccine, the end polio flame and even RCM's recent involvement building the cold chain during the COVID pandemic, RCM is the forerunner and his was worth other clubs emulating. President S Ravi said he was humbled to have inherited such a legacy, and believed the continuous bedrock of fellowship, community engagement, the impact on the community including the philanthropy were all intangibles which were praiseworthy and have RCM in its pride of place today.

In conclusion, PDG Benjamin Cherian told the new leaders and leaders to be, that it was vital for the club to have a vision plan with the centennial year ahead and to plan for the decade, keeping in mind what the lesser privileged of the city need. He reiterated the vast base of land



RCM holds in Gummidipoodi and Seleiyur have and that these were legacies to build on. He said this called for a committee to be constituted to execute this vision.

Rotary's bedrock is fellowship yes, but service is the spice that sets apart Rotary from any other organization. This service spices comes from giving time, effort, and funds.

PANEL DISCUSSION ON ROTARY CLUB OF MADRAS PROJECTS



President Nominee Rtn.Nikhil Raj had a panel discussion with President Rtn.Ravi Sundaresan, DGE Rtn Saravanan and PP Rtn. N K Gopinath on the various projects done by RCM over the years.

Questions were posed to DGE Saravanan on the various Diseases Prevention and Treatment projects and Maternal & Child Health projects done by the Rotary Club of Madras. He divided his answer into 3 categories. 1. Immediate response projects due to the need of the hour. 2. Support for medical treatment. 3. Health camps and spoke about the various projects done my RCM under those heads.

PP Rtn NK Gopinath was asked about the Basic Education & Literacy projects and Community Economic Development projects of RCM. He covered projects like Boys Town, Rotary Nagar, Sembakkam, Selaiyur, TTC, Tsunami project, Perumbakkam, Homes for the Homeless and our Lake cleaning projects. President Ravi was asked to highlight about the Water Sanitation and Hygiene projects executed by our club.

He spoke about the toilets constructed in numerous villages like Ambarapedu, Kannankottai etc and schools like Arani , Sri Sarawathi Vidyalaya which have benefitted over 12,000 residents and 30,000 students

He also spoke about the Public Convenience project (His and Her Place) and the plans to add 2 more similar projects.

The session ended with some quick fire questions to the panelist which were deftly answered!





President Elect Rtn Chella Krishna had a panel discussion with President Rtn S Ravi, District Governor Rtn Ravi Raman and DG Nominee Rtn Vinod Sarogi on the concept of the Gift of Giving. Prior to panel beginning its deliberations, Rtn Chella read out the contributions made by individuals and corporates which were cumulatively exceeding 1 Million USD till date and this was met with acclaim.

The panel began with Rtn Chella asking DG Ravi Raman about what motivates him to give and continue giving. The DG replied that he started slowly and it was only around 2015 onwards that he on the persuasion of a fellow member of his club Bala had involved himself in a watershed project in Krishnagiri which resulted in vast impact. He then made huge efforts as District Chairman International service resulting in his visiting over 60 countries and close to 90+ global grants. His motivations he mentioned have come from teaming up with partners around the world to do projects and in visiting beneficiary sites and seeing the benefits of the work that is being done.



The next question was to DGN Vinod on his motivations for giving. DGN Vinod reiterated the need for visiting projects. He also talked about the Global grants which he was involved in and some excellent partners with who he had worked. He also mentioned that he get a "Feeling inside" which prompts him to give when he visits these projects.

The final question was to President Ravi was to understand the secret sauce to raise funds. He mentioned that a good cause, measurability, achievability and finally accountability, compliance and statutory in dealing with compliance.

All in all in it was a panel which touched on the motivations for giving and some imperatives on the persons accepting the grant. A useful session which helped everyone learn.



RCM BOYS TOWN VISIT TO CHENNAI PORT – CITPL CONTAINER TERMINAL



As part of the outreach programs for the Boys Town boys, a visit was arranged to Chennai International Terminal Private Limited (CITPL), a privately licensed container terminal in Chennai Port on 17th Feb 2024.

The visiting boys, accompanied by 2 staff and Rtn. Rakesh Jaiswal and NK Bhatia, were visibly excited and arrived at the terminal by 10:15 hrs. Rtn. Suresh Amirapu, who is an Advisor to CITPL, welcomed the visitors, and gave an introductory talk on how a port functions, what services it provides. The visitors were given a Safety Briefing and then a guided tour of the port facility.

They get to see the huge cranes and other equipment used to load and unload containers from ocean-going vessels, transport them and stack them in the yard and deliver them to the importers.

It was an unusual experience, thrilling in its own way and also giving them a rare insight into an industry of which not much is known to the general public.

After reassembling in the conference room with snacks and refreshments, the Head of Human Resources of CITPL gave the boys a rundown of the various functions performed by the different departments in the Port terminal and the employment opportunities available. Next followed a brief talk by Capt. KG Ramakrishnan, a former ship's captain and representative of the Company of Master Mariners of India. He gave a gripping account of life at sea, the adventures and rewards the sea life provides, and employment opportunities.

Throwing the floor open for Q&A, with boys incentivized to ask interesting questions, saw them shed their inhibitions and ask numerous questions about life and employment in the Port terminal and on ships.

Rtn NK Bhatia proposed a vote of thanks. After a hearty rendering of the National Anthem, the groups posed for photographs. CITPL thoughtfully arranged for some safety helmets and high visibility jackets which the boys wore and took photos for some fond memories of their visit.



Overall, the objective of the visit was to introduce the boys to a facility which they had not seen before, learn about the port and shipping industries and even give a glimpse of the employment opportunities therein. The speakers were inspiring, and the boys were clearly left with the conviction that if they were prepared to work hard and learn new skills, they have a good chance of success as anyone else.
