


#### Dear RCMers,

#### Call to Order and Invocation:

#### President Ravi Sundaresan:

President Ravi Sundaresan thanked PP Mohan Raman for collaring him and called the 37th weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Madras to order.

He welcomed everyone and requested confirmation of the minutes of the 36th weekly meeting held last week.

# From the 37th Meeting of Rotary Club of Madras March 19, 2024






I see trees of green, red roses too, I see them bloom, for me and for you, And I think to myself, What a wonderful world

It is indeed a wonderful world depending on what you see! But is seeing truly believing? What the eye doesn't see and the mind doesn't know, doesn't exist (even if it does exist) In other words, the eye only sees what the mind knows and more importantly, can comprehend.

The afternoon of March 19, 2024, our guest Karun Raman, opened our eyes, mind and hearts to his life and many others who deal and live life differently.

An acclaimed and successful fashion choreographer, a "Youtuber", and an Influencer, Karun Raman's journey seems glamorous and glitzy. But the road was not easy. An openly gay transgender, who was born and raised in Chennai, had more than a fair share of hurdles, and difficulties getting to this position of respect, dignity and influence and social status.

His transformational journey in the then Madras society, which was not so aware,, inclusive, and open-minded was therefore fraught with a lot of confusion, conflict and isolation. So much that he didn't pursue his education beyond the 10th grade. Lief at home was not so easy either: his father too was abusive and an alcoholic and



was completely not supportive of his gender orientation. His expectation was that his son should marry a woman and have kids made it more difficult for Karun at home. School was also no fun. Kids bullied him verbally and physically for his mannerisms and he spent most of his time hiding in the bathroom.

He made his debut in a Tamil movie named Madhavan. His expectation of the creative field to be more aware and open was sadly disappointing. He was brutally abused by a stuntman in the studio for his gender characteristics.

Through all the trauma and pathos, the only silver-lining was the unwavering unshakeable and fierce and wholesome support and love from his mother. Karun is very cognizant of his special situation where he has his mother as his pillar and rock with her undeterred and unconditional support as always.

Whether it was his schooling and education or job opportunities or even

renting as place for his own independent living it was an uphill task and he felt like an outcast.

Karun bears no ill-will or bitterness through all of his agonizing past and current struggles. He is appreciative and grateful for few good people who gave him his breaks. He left the acting arena and forayed into dancing. He mentions a special friend who was not challenged by his cross dressing and took him as he is and introduced him to the elite madras club as a dance teacher. He also decided to start his own fashion choreography company mainly with an aim to provide a safe space for all this aspiring to enter this filed, irrespective of their gender orientation. His company holds a Limca record for the most number of shows in a day totaling about 82-85 in one day at the Chennai Trade Fair!

He is also aware that mental health and abuse and difficulties exist even in the "straight" communities, but draws attention to the fact that it perhaps manifold in the "LGBTQ+ Community". On asked what is the meaning of all these letters are and what does it mean to him or where are we going with all of this: he has a simple answer: it really doesn't matter. In fact, he easily and very simply shifts the focus towards equality rather than naming each kind of person, which in fact further categorizes a person. In fact, he doesn't even prefer a pronoun to his name and would happily go by a mononym.

Karun goes on to state that there almost 2-3 transgender deaths a week due to suicide which is a bitter and harsh reality that speaks volume of the mental agony and lack of support systems. He finds himself fortunate, content: but perhaps not very happy. He is acutely aware and empathic to the struggles of his community folks. Whether it be in finding a job, or the safety at the workplace for them, or the suspicion with which they are

treated or sometimes even persecution they are met with.

He implores all parents of straight or otherwise, to communicate more with their children. In this age of technology and camps and extracurriculardriven childhood, there seems to be no connection. And most children are swayed by a fake social media world and that leads to more mental health issues. And even though he has felt despondent and at the brink of self harm or worse, he has held off: knowing that guilt a parent would fell afterward , is worse than what the child may go through in a lifetime.

Karun hopes that transgender find mainstream jobs like Uber drivers, Doctors, Lawyers, Teachers etc.

He engages with NGOs and also does a show like "flowers have thorns too" to bring awareness and put the spotlight on these issues. He would like to see more toilets for his community. And although he feels that Tamil Nadu is perhaps the safest state currently for his community, he wishes there was more active engagement from all spheres of the society, governmental and otherwise. More counseling centers for transgenders thinking of sex change. He brought to light a subterranean community of a lady Trans who adopts a "trans child" and supports them and when the "adoptee is socially and financially secure; they pay it back to adoptive parent. However not all is hunky-dory. There are still so called seemingly safe spaces which still support a negative loop.

Despite all the pathos and sadness and darkness, Karun Raman is not bitter or angry or vengeful.

He carries a sense of hope a purpose of engagement and a positivity of inclusivity and equanimity and equality. There is not hate or divisiveness. He aspires for a better future for ALL kids irrespective of their gender orientation.

Truly: What a wonderful world it would be!
