
It was a busy week at RCM as usual.

Minutes of the 7th Meeting of Rotary Club of Madras August 15th, 2023 Held at Boys town Society. Gummudipundi

PP. Rtn. George Cherian collared President Rtn. Ravi Sundaresan, who called the 7th Weekly meeting of RCM to order followed by Silent Invocation.

The minutes of 7th weekly meeting were duly confirmed.

As the nation united to celebrate another year of independence, Boys Town was filled with an infectious festive atmosphere. On August 15th, the flag was raised by notable figures - President Ravi Sundaresan, Mr. James Rajan, MD, Wartsila, and District Governor Rtn. A.K.S. Ravi Raman, accompanied by RCM members.

The students of Boys Town, children from nearby villages, and members of the Interact Club of Shankara joined in singing patriotic songs and the National Anthem.

Following this, a formal program commenced with the dignitaries adorning the statue of Late Rtn. Markand Desai with garlands.

Rtn. Dr. Anuradha Ganesan, Director of Community Services 1, extended a warm welcome to the attendees. She emphasized the Rotary Club of Madras' 35-year presence at Boys Town, which has driven the club to bring about meaningful changes in the lives of those residing in the vicinity. Initiatives this year include constructing 100 homes for the homeless, building 200 toilets, restoring water bodies, setting up an anganwadi, and promoting





education and health through rural education centers in nearby villages such as Thathiyar Kandigai, Sedhilpakkam, Poovalembedu, and JJ Nagar.

President Ravi Sundaresan spoke about Boys Town's facilities and opportunities for children, while Rtn. Rakesh Jaiswal, Chairman of Boys Town, elaborated on RCM's efforts for the children and gave a brief history of the Boys town society.

The Independence Day celebration was animated by vibrant cultural performances by the children. Notably, the Yoga performance took center stage, showcasing the impressive skills of the boys in a synchronized display of talent.

District Governor Rtn. AKS Ravi Raman and Mr. James Rajan, MD of Wartsila, also addressed the audience, sharing their perspectives on the significance of Independence Day. Mr. Rajan highlighted RCM's exceptional work in maintaining facilities like Boys Town, providing children with dignified lives, independence, and equal opportunities for their future.

The event concluded with a spirited vote of thanks from Honorary Secretary Sesha sai, who captivated the young audience with his energy. A sumptuous lunch followed, delighting the children in attendance.

The meeting was adjourned.■





























Mário César Martins de Camargo of Brazil selected to be 2025-26 Rotary International President

Mário César Martins de Camargo, a member of the Rotary Club of Santo André, São Paulo, Brazil, is the selection of Nominating Committee for President to become Rotary International's president for 2025-26. He will officially become the nominee on 15 September if no other candidates challenge him.

De Camargo plans to boost Rotary's public image by working from the top down.

"Rotary today has strong competition for members and funds," he says. "We need to rejuvenate the brand, especially in some zones. We should utilize post-pandemic meeting tools ... to allow the president to address Rotarians all over the globe. We also need to develop more long-term partnerships with political, community, and business leaders. Let's emphasize our greatest asset: 1.4 million volunteers."

He also hopes to improve Rotary's process for appointments and governance.

"Rotary should adopt a more transparent system to appoint volunteers for positions, with clear criteria and data-based evaluation of results," he says.

De Camargo was president of Gráfica Bandeirantes and has been a consultant to the print industry in Brazil. He has also served as president and chair of several printing and graphics trade associations, including the Brazilian Association of Graphic Technology and ABIGRAF, the Brazilian Printing Industry Association.

He has served on the board of Casa da Esperança (House of Hope), a hospital sponsored by his Rotary club that serves 150,000 children with disabilities every year.

De Camargo studied in the U.S. and Germany and holds degrees from EAESP-Fundação Getulio Vargas in business administration and Faculdade de Direito de São Bernardo do Campo in law.

A Rotarian since 1980, de Camargo has served Rotary as director, trustee, RI learning facilitator, committee member and chair, and task force member.

De Camargo and his wife, Denise, are Major Donors and Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation.



Our President as usual added glitter to the event by making a special announcement – every student who has 90% or more attendance and who clears the certification programme will be gifted with a sewing machine!





DAY CLUB OF MADRAS

Children's Medical Camp at theChintadripet Higher Secondary School

Our latest children's medical camp was conducted on the 16th of August for the children of Chintadripet Higher Secondary School, which is one of our own Interact schools. Inaugurated by IPP Jayshree Sridhar, the camp was attended by President Ravi Sundaresan, Hon Sec Sesha Sai, Director Bharat Pujara, Rtn Visvanathan and Rtn. Dr. Sangeetha Viswanathan.

The camp saw the participation of over 85 children from the school as well as members of staff. The medical partners for this camp included the Kanchi Kamakoti CHILDS Trust (KKCT) Hospital (general medical check-up and screening), Yash Dental (Dental Health) and VHS Multi Speciality Hospital (Eye Screening).

The medical camp was held at the school with local volunteers and the RCM secretariat helping with the set-up, administration and guiding of the beneficiary children under the guidance of Ms

Subbu Kutti and Mr Gnanavel (headmaster of the school). In addition, we had the welcome addition of four young volunteers, Kugan, Naveen, Mageswaran and Sesuraj from Ventura Pranas (Rtn Prabha Srinivasan's firm). These youngsters volunteered their time to help with camp logistics and interacted with the schoolboys, giving them general guidance and career counselling and forming bonds for the future.

Mr Vinothkumar, the camp coordinator from KKCTH did a fantastic job of streamlining patient flow. The children first attended the registration desk where they were issued with a card listing the name and other details. They then moved to the General Check-up conducted by KKCT Hospital, where their heights and weights were measured, medical history recorded and general check-up done. Next up was the Dental Screening by Yash Dental and finally a comprehensive Eye Check up by VHS.







Outcomes from the camp were as follows:

10 children were identified to have vision problems. These children will need a detailed check which VHS has kindly offered to do and possibly require spectacles.

The majority of children had healthy teeth but around 30 children need filling, extraction or orthodontic treatment. Rtn Dr Yashwanth has kindly offered to do this free of cost at his dental clinics.

The medical cards and outcome reports have been handed over to the school administration and we will be coordinating with them to help the children access further treatment with our medical partners.



THIS CALL

FOR A CHARTER CONVENTION

To Adopt a Constitution and Thereby Establish A NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF ROTARY CLUBS OF AMERICA

ANNOUNCES that said Convention will be held as follows:

PLACE—In the City of Chicago, State of Illinois.

(Details as to headquarters, meeting places, etc. will be announced later.)

DATE—Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, August 15th, 16th, 17th, 1910.

(Details as to program for each day's business and entertainment will be published later.)

REPRESENTATION—Each local Rotary Club recognized by the National Board of Commissioners (or by the Convention when in session) shall be entitled to participate in the business of the Convention and cast a vote therein upon the basis of one vote for each fifty (50) members or major fraction thereof.

DELEGATES—Each participating Club shall decide for itself how many delegates it will send to the Convention and how its delegates shall be selected and in what manner such delegation shall east the vote which that Club is entitled to cast. That is to say: Suppose a certain Club has 285 members and therefore is entitled to six (6) votes in the Convention; that Club may send six delegates, or it may send twenty delegates (or any other number,) or it may send only one delegate; in any case the representative, or representatives, of that Club shall cast six votes in the Convention. All delegates shall have the privileges of the floor and shall be eligible to serve as officers and committeemen of the Convention.

ENTERTAINMENT—A splendid program of entertainment will be provided by our hosts—Rotary Club of Chicago.

(Details later.)

RAILROAD RATES—While it has not been possible to secure any special rates from the railroads for our Convention, attention is called to the fact that the Rotary Convention will occur in the week following the great Triennial Conclave of the Knights Templar in Chicago, and any one who is able to start so as to arrive in Chicago not later than the 8th of August can avail himself of the special Triennial Conclave rates which will be in effect during the early days of August. Full information as to these rates can be obtained from your local railroad offices. Delegates who are Knights Templar will find the time scheduled particularly fortunate as they can avail themselves of the cheap rates and at the same time attend both functions. It is also thought that many who are not Knights Templar will desire to avail themselves of the opportunity afforded to visit Chicago during this gala week.

ALL ROTARY CLUBS are requested to publish and circulate the information contained in this Call to all their members and take steps to assure the attendance of as large delegations as possible at the First National Convention.


