Highlights of RWM No. 2290 held on 04th August, 2025.

- President informed that the RCD will participate in the upcoming Independence Day celebrations at the Duliajan College playground, under the leadership of the Co-DC of Duliajan Co- District and in collaboration with the local administration.
- President informed that a meeting between the Co-DC, RCD, and participating companies for the job fair will be held via Google Meet on Tuesday, 12 August 2025, at 4:30 PM. Members are requested to attend the meeting.
- President announced that the grooming program scheduled for 19th August will be held at Rotary Community Centre if the number of participants is 130 or fewer. If the number exceeds 130, the venue will be the Duliajan Club.
- President informed the House that she had approached the Hans Foundation to participate in the upcoming screening test. However, due to certain organizational limitations, they were unable to attend. The President assured the House that the Hans Foundation would cooperate with RCD in future health camps.

- President informed that she along with Secretary, Rtn. P.P. Hazarika and the tent house owner, visited the media center located at the Old Bus Stand for the screening test and the Union Office auditorium for the job fair. She instructed the tent house owner to promptly arrange for the construction of a temporary medical booth and the setup of 13 nos. of stalls for the job fair and other necessary preparations at the earliest and prepared a draft of the expenses.

- President informed the House that a Soft Skills Training Program for the underprivileged women will be inaugurated at the Mrinaljyoti Rehabilitation Center on Sunday, 17th August. Mrs. Annet Broekhuis, a renowned textile designer from the Netherlands, will conduct the training on the utilization of banana fiber. She requested all the honorable members to attend the program.
- President requested members to attend the Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) program in large numbers, to be held at Dibrugarh from 16th to 17th August 2025, organized by RC Dibrugarh, for updating and enhancing their Rotary knowledge. She also informed that Secretary Rtn. D.J. Bhuyan and Rtn. Madhurjya Sharma will be attending along with her.
- President expressed gratitude to Rtn. Luhit Das, Director of Community Service, for his generous donation of ₹10,000 for the month of July and August'25 in continuation of his commitment to contribute ₹5,000 each month to the Bank account of Rotary Club Welfare Fund in support of community projects.







Highlights of RWM No. 2293 held on 25th August, 2025.

- Sri Ashok Sahani, caretaker of the cremation ground Baikuntha Dham, informed the President of Rotary Club over telephone about his temporary move to Gopalganj, Bihar, upon which the President, along with Rtn. Probin Saikia who had also visited the cremation ground, requested him to come to the Rotary club on the day of the weekly meeting on 25th August with his reliever, Sri Deep Majhi, to introduce him to the Rotarians who will take charge of his responsibilities during his absence.
- To formally inform the Rotary Club, Sri Ashok Sahani, accompanied by his reliever Sri Deep Majhi, attended the weekly meeting on Monday, 25th August, and submitted a written application regarding his inability to perform duties for a few months. The President accepted his application, and Executive Secretary Rtn. P.P. Hazarika clicked a photo of the Reliever and recorded the details of the reliever. The President further requested Sri Majhi to submit a valid Photo ID proof at the earliest.
- President informed that she received many positive feedbacks about the Grooming Session organized by RC Duliajan on 19th August 2025, and expressed her gratitude to Rtn. Tridiv Hazarika, Mentor of the Session, for conducting it so effectively. She further informed the House that Rtn. Navajit Dutta, who had also been invited as a mentor, could not attend the session due to a pre-assigned official commitment.
- President informed the House that Smti. Kuntala Das, wife of Rtn. Luhit Das, had expressed her interest in joining Rotary and had communicated the same to the President. Being from a Rotary family, her induction would be a valuable addition to RC Duliajan, as she becomes a female Rotarian as well as a Rotary spouse member. Considering that August is designated as Membership Development and Club Extension Month, RC Duliajan officially inducted her as a member of the club with effect from 25th August 2025. She will be formally pinned by the District Governor during his official club visit.
- President informed the House that an Interact Club will be inaugurated at Assam Public School, Duliajan, on 30th August 2025. She urged all members to attend the programme and contribute to making it a grand success.
- President informed the House that this year Teachers' Day will be celebrated at the RCC in a befitting manner. A few renowned retired teachers of Duliajan will be invited and felicitated for their contributions to the nation. The members present suggested a few names of teachers for the occasion, which were duly noted by the Secretary. In addition, family members of RC Duliajan who are engaged in the teaching profession will also be invited and felicitated on this auspicious occasion.
- President highlighted the proposal to open a new RCC, as suggested by Rtn. Madhurjya Sharma, who had already taken the initiative as requested by her. Rtn. Sharma informed the House that he had discussed the matter with the Gaon Panchayat President regarding the establishment of a new RCC in Gajal Basti and Chiringkhat areas under Hugrijan Gaon Panchayat, and requested the members to conduct a recce visit to the site for further processing.
- Rtn. P.P. Hazarika shared his views that opening a new RCC would be a milestone for RC Duliajan. However, he emphasized that the presence of the President-Elect is essential, as he will be responsible for carrying it forward in the coming year.
