





Perhaps , in the millions of dollars pledged by obscenely wealthy Rotarians, our contribution might seem insignificant. In a melee of booming voices, our voice might drown. But we have been steady and steadfast in our contributions and our work. We have touched lives where no one cared to look, we have invested time, effort and money not just in and around us but also risen to every Rotary call, that comes from the District or elsewhere.

So isn't it only natural that when need arises closer home, we expect the larger fraternity to take heed too?

Fate was not kind to Rtn. Kalpana. It played a rather nasty game with her and turned her life topsy-turvy in a span of few hours. Her world capsized between a phone call and the time she awaited for her husband to call her again. What had been a pleasant journey till then suddenly became a difficult ride for her. Her husband, late Rtn Diwakar was a man who lit up every space he entered into. He was full of life and was usually 'the life' of most rotary parties and events. A committed rotarian ,he served RCD in different capacities since his joining in 2004 to 2022, when the club lost an integral member. His contribution to the Rotary Club of Darjeeling has been substantial and unforgettable. An alumunus of St. Augustine's School, Kalimpong, he held a Phd in Entomology and was an educator by profession. He pushed his wife to open a nursery school, which she reluctantly did ,at the time , but later went on to be her place of solace .

Rtn Kalpana says that she was lost in the dark after his demise. When she was trying to grapple with reality and life through meditation and counselling, Rotary came to her rescue once again. She says that she had reservations about late Rtn. Diwakar joining rotary back in 2004. She felt that with his work and hectic schedule, he would not be able to give the commitment required. However , as he delved deeper into Rotary, she too saw the work the club did, serving the society relentlessly. She became a part of the Annes, with whom she forged lasting and deep friendships.

She is thankful to the rotarians, who stood by her in her most trying days. So when Rtn. Mamta invited her for a meeting, she immediately said yes, without giving it much thought. She joined RCD in 2024. She was consoled by the fact that she felt deeply attached to the club that her husband so cherished and having female members now made her even more comfortable. She enjoys the meetings , the projects done by RCD and likes being amongst familiar faces but misses her husband- late Rtn Diwakar terribly. She feels deeply grateful to Rotary and DG Sukhvinder for recognizing and felicitating her husband posthumously in 2025.


She too believes in the selfless service the club renders to the society at large and feels grateful to be a part of RCD.
