In case of female, menstrual hygeine plays a crucial role to maintain reproductive health, and poor practices can inhance the risk of infections and long term health issues, which includes cervical cancer. In many parts of the world, women and girls face challanges in accessing clean water, sanitation facilities, and menstrual products, leading to unhygeinic practices during menstruation. This can result in bacterial and fungal infections, which may contribute to the development of cervical abnormalities and increase the risk of cervical cancer.

The human papillomavirus (HPV) is a primary cause of cervical cancer, and certain factors related to menstrual hygeine such as the use of unclean menstrual products or inadequate genital hygeine, may increase the risk of HPV infection. Furthermore, poor mentrual hygeine practices may lead to chronic inflammation and infections, whuch may contribute to the development of cervical abnormalities.
