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Editorial Note

“A few days ago, while searching for images of water-scarce regions in Tripura on Google, I came across visuals that were deeply painful and disturbing—images that silently spoke of struggle, scarcity, and the harsh reality faced by countless people.”

The images of water scarcity emerging from Tripura are not just alarming—they are deeply unsettling. They remind us of a truth we often overlook: water, the very essence of life, is limited. Despite the vast oceans surrounding our planet, usable and drinkable water remains scarce and unevenly distributed. In our pursuit of development, we have begun to exploit one of our most critical lifelines—groundwater. The excessive extraction of underground water reserves, far beyond their natural rate of replenishment, has led to what is now widely known as groundwater depletion. This silent crisis carries severe and often irreversible consequences. Land subsidence, drying wells, contamination of water sources, and ecological imbalance are no longer distant possibilities—they are realities unfolding before our eyes. The link between water, sanitation, and hygiene is undeniable. Without access to safe water, basic hygiene becomes a challenge, sanitation systems fail, and communities become vulnerable to diseases. Water is not merely a resource; it is the foundation of public health, dignity, and sustainable development.

What makes this situation even more paradoxical is the knowledge that vast quantities of water exist elsewhere in the universe, such as around the distant quasar APM 08279+5255. Yet here on Earth, we are struggling to preserve the limited freshwater available to us. The irony is profound, but so is the urgency.

As members of Rotary International, we are uniquely positioned to act. Rotary has always stood at the forefront of humanitarian service, and the challenge of water conservation calls for our immediate and collective attention. Through initiatives such as rainwater harvesting, installation of safe drinking water systems, promotion of sanitation and hygiene practices, and community awareness campaigns, Rotary can continue to make a lasting impact.

The responsibility lies with each one of us. Conservation must begin at the individual level and extend to the community and beyond. Water is not an infinite gift—it is a shared trust.

Let us act today, so that tomorrow does not suffer for our inaction.

The month began with the vibrant celebration of Holi, where colours became a medium of connection, compassion, and joy. Celebrating with the children of Sree Maa Aurobindo Ashram transformed a festival into a moment of belonging—reminding us that true service lies in creating happiness for others.

A key highlight of the month was our Youth Skill Development Initiative, where 24 ITI Mechanical students successfully completed their On-the-Job Training at Maruti Jain Udyog Service Center. It stands as a testament to Rotary's commitment to empowering youth through skill-based education.

Healthcare interventions remained impactful and far-reaching. Further strengthening our healthcare mission, The 1st dental camp with Global Grant – Mobile Dental Clinic on World Oral Health Day marked a significant milestone. Our Blood Donation Camp, conducted in collaboration with Rotaract Clubs, saw 61 voluntary donors come forward—each unit of blood symbolizing hope, life, and humanity in action.

Under our Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) initiatives, hygiene kits were distributed to 24 inmates at Sindhakaya – A Home for Women, promoting dignity and well-being. Complementing this, a Handwash Awareness Program for children emphasized the importance of preventive health practices—proving that simple interventions can create long-term impact.

We proudly celebrated International Women's Day, fostering dialogue on women's rights, confidence, and social equity—reaffirming our belief that empowered women lead to empowered communities.

Strengthening Rotary's pillars of fellowship and leadership, we hosted visiting Rotaractors for cultural exchange and initiated a new Rotaract Club of medical professionals—expanding Rotary's reach and impact through young leaders committed to service.

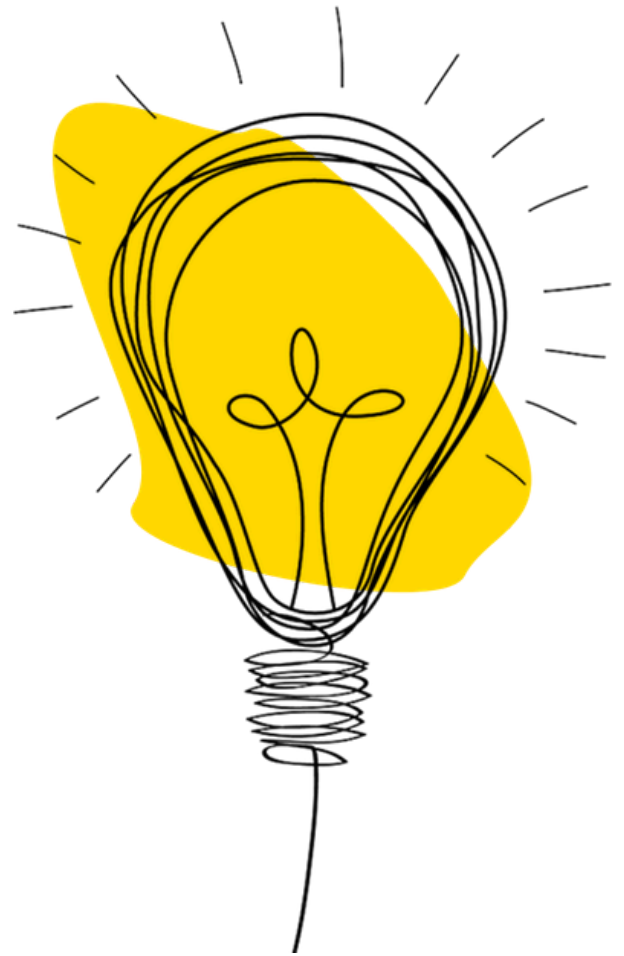

In observance of March as the Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) month in the Rotary calendar, Rotary Club of Agartala City undertook a compassionate outreach initiative at Snigdhaaya, a shelter home for vulnerable women. Rotarians distributed essential hygiene and care items including adult diapers, handwash solutions with dispensing pumps, sanitary kits, menstrual hygiene products, and soaps among 24 inmates. Anandamoyee Rotary Clinic- Free Health Care Services for the Underprivileged

We offer complimentary health care services for those in need every day from 4 PM to 6 PM, excluding Sundays and government holidays.

Services Provided:

- Free consultations
- Complimentary medications for beneficiaries

This initiative is run by Rotarians, with both Rotarian and non-Rotarian doctors, as well as dedicated Rotary volunteers.



Rotary Annapurna: A Complementary Meal Service

This initiative offers complimentary meal services for patients and their family members who travel from remote areas of the state to receive treatment at the Indira Gandhi Memorial Hospital in Agartala, all within the hospital premises.



Give vision is our mission :

We are committed to offering free cataract surgeries, along with the distribution of complimentary lenses and spectacles. This year, we aim to assist over 750 beneficiaries.

Maternal & Child Healthcare Clinic:

The immunization day, held on the first day of each month, holds significant importance for the families of migratory workers at the Laxmilunga tea estate. At the Laxmilunga Ayush Mandir, in collaboration with the state family healthcare service, a maternal and child healthcare clinic is organized. During this clinic, complimentary health check-ups are provided for ANC (Antenatal Care), PNC (Postnatal Care) mothers, and their infants, conducted by esteemed pediatricians and gynecologists.



Monthly Health Camp Bringing Smiles: The Rotary Club of Agartala City conducts a monthly health check-up camp for children at Shree Ma. Shree Aurobindo Ashram for Children, held on the first Sunday of every month. Led by Dr. Nihar Ranjan Das and Sukla Das Banik, the initiative ensures regular medical care and attention for the inmates.

Along with health check-ups, the team provides medicines, nutritious kits, and study materials, supporting both physical well-being and education. Continuous monitoring and follow-up care have led to a significant achievement—the complete elimination of skin diseases among the children. This sustained effort reflects Rotary’s commitment to service and community welfare, truly embodying the spirit of “Service Above Self.”

Netra Seva: Restoring Vision

The Rotary Club of Agartala City organizes Netra Seva, a regular eye check-up camp to detect glaucoma, cataract, and other vision problems. Patients are referred for treatment at Tripura Medical College and Hospital, Hapania. Conducted alongside maternal and child health camps at Laxmilunga Ayush Mandir, it ensures comprehensive community healthcare.
