Secrets to Year-Round Success in Rotary Foundation Giving

Rotary clubs that excel in fundraising adopt creative strategies and foster a strong sense of community, ensuring year-round success.

1. Unique Fundraisers:

1. Rotary Club of Alpharetta, USA: Their Polar Bear Plunge, despite mild Georgia winters, draws attention and raised over \$150,000 in 2023. The event enhances visibility, attracts members, and boosts donations.

2.Strategic Giving Campaigns:

1. Rotary Club of Taipei Nankong, Taiwan: Sets a baseline of \$100 annual donations per member and motivates members to contribute to special campaigns like polio eradication. The club has doubled donations through impactful projects like free health clinics in Taiwan, Myanmar, and Thailand.

3. Focus on Rotary Foundation Month (November):

1. Rotary Club of Toyohashi, Japan: Holds informational meetings to explain donation purposes, linking contributions to long-term projects like housing and education for Indigenous tribes in Thailand.

4.Project-Based Motivation:

1. Rotary Club of Edmonton South, Canada: Ties donations to hands-on initiatives like building playgrounds and supporting girls' education in Belize, fueled by members' active participation in projects.

5. Building a Strong Club Culture:

 Clubs prioritize engaging meetings, diverse membership, and nurturing a sense of belonging. Leaders avoid aggressive fundraising tactics, instead inspiring donations through member testimonials and shared ideals.

JAMSHEDPUR CLUBS IN THE DISTRICT NEWS

JAMSHEDPUR EAST

The Rotary Club of Jamshedpur east presented a collage created by SDDS students to the Director of MTMH Hospital in Jamshedpur, which was warmly received, with Dr. Tamal Deb leading the presentation. Club ID cards were distributed to all members, and an Interact Club's Board installation received coverage in the newspaper. All Jamshedpur clubs united for a polio awareness Walkathon, promoting the cause together. Additionally, as part of the "TB Awareness and Prevention" project, the club increased its monthly distribution of nutritional food packets to TB patients at the District TB Office in Rajendra nagar, raising the count from 5 to 10 packets under the leadership of Dr Tamal Deb and Club President Subhrajit



JAMSHEDPUR FEMINA

RCJ Femina organized a "Know You Numbers" health camp for teachers and staff at Kasidih High School, where a pathology team conducted blood pressure, height, weight, and blood sugar tests for 125 beneficiaries. A hand wash awareness program was held at a learning center in Dungari village, where hygiene supplies and educational materials were distributed to students and mothers. The club also conducted a river-cleaning project at Gandhi Ghat in Sakchi, Jamshedpur, in collaboration with the Lions Club and DBMS B.Ed college Rotaractors. Additionally, a twoday mushroom farming skill development program was organized for students, mothers, and teachers from Galudih village, with training led by Arnab Masroom and team, benefiting





JAMSHEDPUR GREEN

A PPH Camp for Baradwari morning walkers offered health checks for 66 participants, with guidance on lifestyle changes. The club ran a handwashing awareness session for schoolchildren, teaching proper hygiene steps and distributing soap. A "Cyber Crime" awareness program educated nursing students on online safety, while a Mental Health and Stress Management" session at Narayana IIT/NIIT Coaching Institute helped students address anxiety. To mark International Polio Day, the club led an End Polio Rally, raising awareness despite challenging weather. They hosted a Breast Cancer Awareness program for teachers, covering early detection methods. For Diwali, vocational training enabled seven underprivileged women to make and sell diyas, with earnings shared as gifts. The club also conducted CPR training for parents and celebrated the global neeting for peace, attended by District Polio Chair PP Kusum Thakur.





JAMSHEDPUR MID TOWN

The Rotary Club of Jamshedpur Midtown recently conducted impactful activities focused on health, safety, and community welfare. They organized a blood donation camp, weekly river clean-ups at Domugani Ghat, and a workshop on "Good Touch, Bad Touch" at Xavier's School, educating 600 students on safety and awareness. A CPR training session was also held at Central Public School, benefiting 500 students. Celebrating Diwali with children and mothers at a local care center, RCJMT shared sweets and crackers, and contributed ₹2,000 towards children's nutrition, sponsored by Rtn Sarita Ray. Additionally, they launched a free Mental Health Clinic at St. Mary's Hindi School to support students' well-being.





JAMSHEDPUR STEEL CITY

The Rotary Club of Jamshedpur Steel City organized a seminar on mental health and relationships for students at Arka Jain University, led by psychologist Ms. Jyoti Pandey. They also inaugurated a new Rotaract Club at the university. In support of the community, club donated mats for paralyzed animals at the Stray Army Welfare Centre. An ongoing project at MGM Hospital provided meals to attendants of patients, impacting around 300-350 people. Multiple general health checkups were held at Asia Bhawan for residents in slum areas, with free consultations and medicine distribution, assisting those without access to healthcare. An Aquaguard was donated to a government school for clean drinking water. At the Saraikela Kharsawan Literary and Culture Festival, the club promoted Rotary's mission and partnered with Kalamandir to showcase products made by tribal women. An end polio rally was organized, with club members contributing to the Polio Fund. Through these initiatives, club has continuously supported health, education, and community welfare in the region.



JAMSHEDPUR Rotary Club of Jamshedpur recently

completed numerous impactful initiatives. They provided shelter for 138 cancer patients, hosted health camps, and held awareness sessions on tobacco addiction and mental health. Their Rotary Play School supported 20 children with free books and uniforms, while the Rotary Saheli Centre offered vocational training. Community events included food distribution to over 300 villagers and a Diwali celebration with rural children. They launched the Rotary Jan Vikas Kendra for skill development, organized biodiversity mapping in schools, and conducted eye-screening camps. The club also raised awareness on polio and safety. Rtn Avinash Duggar proudly represented the club on his mountaineering journey, summiting Hurrah Top with the Rotary flag. These diverse efforts highlight the club's commitment to health, education, and community empowerment.

8 - FOUR AVENUES OF SERVICE

The term "Four Avenues of Service" is frequently used in Rotary literature and information. The "Avenues" refer to the four elements of the Object of Rotary: Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service and International Service. Although the Avenues of Service are not found in any formal part of the constitutional documents of Rotary, the concept has been accepted as a means to describe the primary areas of Rotary activity.

- "Club Service" involves all of the activities necessary for Rotarians to perform to make their club function successfully.
- "Vocational Service" is a description of the opportunity each Rotarian has to represent the dignity and utility of one's vocation to the other members of the club.
- "Community Service" pertains to those activities which Rotarians undertake to improve the quality of life in their community. It frequently involves assistance to youth, the aged, handicapped and others who look to Rotary as a source of hope for a better life.
- The Fourth Avenue, "International Service," describes the many programs and activities which Rotarians undertake to advance international understanding, goodwill and peace. International Service projects are designed to meet humanitarian needs of people in many lands.

When a Rotarian understands and travels down the "Four Avenues of Service," the Object of Rotary takes on even greater meaning.




CHANDALIKA


A Musical Dance Drama Written by Rabindranath Tagore

The importance of Chandalika lies in its timeless message of equality, human dignity, and inner transformation. It challenges deep-rooted societal norms and highlights the power of compassion and spiritual enlightenment to transcend barriers of caste and discrimination. Through this dance drama, Tagore not only advocates for social reform but also explores the individual's journey toward self-realization and liberation.





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
