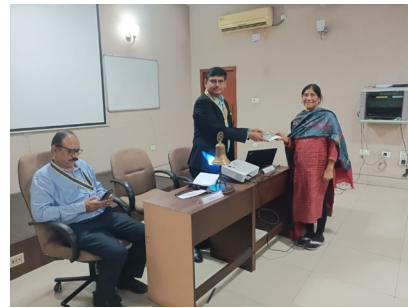

Subject: Long-Term Project Committees for a) Siddheswar Deaf and Dumb School (SDDS) b) Saheli Center

Long-term project committees play a crucial role in ensuring the success and sustainability of community initiatives, providing consistency and continuity. They ensure that goals and strategies remain aligned over time, allowing for a deeper, lasting impact on social issues. These committees ensure better accountability, monitoring, and calibration of projects, as needed. They also build trust with the communities we serve.

Based on the interest shown by members and their specific expertise, we are institutionalising the following **Long-Term Committees** for our two signature projects, as mentioned in the subject.

The fundamental principles for these committees are as follows:

1. Each committee will have Mentor(s), Chairperson, Secretary, and Members who will hold the position for 3 to 5 years or until they remain members of the Rotary Club of Jamshedpur East, whichever is earlier.
2. Members will rotate after 3 years in a manner that does not impact the continuity of the projects. For example, at the beginning of the 4th, 5th, and 6th year, one-third of the initial members will be reconstituted.
3. Members who have served on these committees can rejoin only after a gap of 3 years and only if positions remain vacant.
4. The committees can have their own bylaws, aligned with the principles of Rotary International and Rotary Club of Jamshedpur East bylaws.
5. The RCJE President, President-Elect, Secretary and Treasurer will be de facto members.

Key Roles:

1. **Mentors:** Provide guidance based on their experience, help connect the members with partners for resources, and support committees in their strategic direction.
2. **Chairperson:** Develop the vision and long-term strategy for the project, lead the initiative, and oversee governance, continuity, and overall progress.
3. **Secretary:** Ensure compliance with the bylaws, manage documentation, oversee administration and maintain financial prudence.
4. **Members:** Support the initiative by taking on key responsibilities as decided within the committee and ensure steady progress.

This month, as we come together for the International Assembly and the Presidential Peace Conference, we celebrate The Magic of Rotary — a unique blend of global connection, vision, and action that empowers us to create lasting change. One of the most inspiring examples is our Rotary Peace Fellowship program, a cornerstone of Rotary’s mission to build a more peaceful and just world.

For more than 23 years, Rotary Peace Fellowships have been transforming communities. Our Rotary Peace Centers, hosted at leading universities around the globe, have educated over 1,800 fellows who now work in more than 140 countries. These centers cultivate expertise in fields like conflict resolution, sustainable development, and peacebuilding, preparing fellows to tackle some of the world’s most pressing challenges. This program exemplifies how Rotary turns vision into action, creating a ripple effect of hope and change.

This month during the Presidential Peace Conference, we celebrate a significant milestone with the opening of our newest peace center in Istanbul. This center will focus on training leaders to address peacebuilding challenges in the Middle East and North Africa, further extending Rotary’s impact. Peace fellows are dedicated champions of transformation, addressing critical issues such as refugee resettlement, youth and women’s empowerment, and reconciliation in conflict zones. Many founded vital organizations or hold leadership roles in governments, nongovernmental organizations, and international institutions like the United Nations and World Bank.

One inspiring story is that of Ntang Julius Meleng, a 2024 Rotary Peace Fellow at Makerere University in Uganda. Through his Social Change Initiative, Julius has worked to empower young people in Cameroon to take active roles in peacebuilding and leadership. His project provided training in conflict prevention, civic engagement, and leadership to youths and community officials in areas affected by conflict, equipping people to drive sustainable peace efforts. Julius harnessed Rotary’s global network to overcome obstacles, including limited funding and security risks, and make a meaningful impact. The Rotary Peace Fellowship gave Julius the tools and support to turn his vision into reality. His work embodies The Magic of Rotary — the transformative power of connecting people, sharing resources, and uniting for a common purpose.

As we reflect on the achievements of our peace fellows and celebrate Rotary’s enduring commitment to peace, let us also recognize the role that everyone in our network of 1.2 million members plays in creating magic through service. Together, we can amplify our impact, inspire new generations of leaders, and build a brighter, more peaceful future.

The Rotary theme for February 2025 is Peace and Conflict Prevention. This month is dedicated to raising awareness about the importance of peace-building and conflict resolution.

Why is February important for Rotary?

- February is World Understanding Month.
- February 23, 1905 was the date of the first Rotary meeting, which is now celebrated as World Understanding and Peace Day.

One of the six (almost seven) areas of focus is Rotary peacebuilding and conflict prevention (the actual area of focus is named "Peace and Conflict Prevention/Resolution"), which is the theme for February.

It is often, however, the conflicts that occur throughout the world that are the root cause of poverty, despair, economic hardship, and poor health. Take for instance the major deterrent to polio eradication: the difficulty in vaccinating children in war-torn countries. Rotary International as an organization understands this relationship and therefore is deeply invested in supporting individuals and programs that will develop leaders who are committed to seeking ways toward peace.

The path toward peace begins with understanding and respect for the differences that make us unique.

These are the same types of values that are studied in the peace centers supported by Rotary International in association with several major universities across the globe. The mission of these centers is to “empower, educate, and increase the capacity of peacebuilders through rigorous academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities
