#### 2. Review of Key Achievements (Past Year)

- Audiometry Tests: Conducted to assess students' hearing health.
- New School Uniforms: Distribution of red T-shirts to promote unity and school spirit.
- Extracurricular & Cultural Activities:
- Sit and Draw competition held on August 15.
- Birthday card-making activity.
- Yoga competition.
- Participation in various sports events and performances.
- Christmas celebrations at SDDS.
- Saraswati Puja conducted at the school.
- Teacher Recognition:
- Introduction of Long Service Awards for teachers completing ten years of service.
- Implementation of a 50% salary increase for teachers to acknowledge their dedication.

**3. Future Plans & Proposals**

**A. School Revamp**

A comprehensive renovation plan was discussed, which includes:

- Painting and infrastructure upgrades.
- Procurement of new benches and tables.
- Installation of CCTV in the school for enhancing security
- Installation of smart interactive boards, computers, and bookshelves to enhance the learning environment.

**B. Proposal for Saturday as a Working Day**

To facilitate regular visits by committee members and oversee school improvements, it was decided to designate the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of each month as working days

**C. Women Empowerment Initiative (Master Tailor Course)**

In collaboration with USHA and Mjunction Services, a professional tailoring course is being introduced to empower women. Key points include:

- Student Participation: 2-3 senior SDDS students will have the opportunity to enroll.
- Parental Interest: Several parents expressed interest in this program for their children.

Logistics:

- Training costs will be covered by RCJE.
- Parents are responsible for arranging transportation, meals, and other expenses.
- No travel allowance (TA) or dearness allowance (DA) will be provided.
- Next Steps: Teacher Chandna will collect the names of interested students and share them with the committee for final selection.

**D. New ID Cards & School Diaries for Students**

Responding to parents' requests, the committee agreed to issue new ID cards and school diaries to enhance communication and organization.

**E. Student Files for Individual Development Planning**

A proposal was made to create individual files for each student to:

- Document strengths, weaknesses, and areas needing improvement.
- Identify potential future employment opportunities.

This initiative aims to facilitate personalized development plans for students.

**4. Discipline & Student Responsibilities**

The importance of maintaining discipline was underscored, with a call for parental support to ensure:

- Regular Attendance: Students attend school consistently.
- Identification: Students wear their ID cards while on school premises.
- Leave Protocol: Submission of an absence letter for leaves extending three or more days.
- Prohibited Items: Students refrain from bringing mobile phones to school.
- Transportation Safety: Students are not permitted to use motorcycles. The school assumes responsibility for students within the premises, while parents are responsible for their safety during travel to and from school.

### 5. Open Discussion & Parent Feedback

- **Additional Skill-Based Programs:** A few parents requested the introduction of more skill-based programs for students. The committee acknowledged this request and will explore potential opportunities.
- **Staffing Concerns:** One parent highlighted the need for an additional teacher. In response, President Subhrajit Basu emphasized that increasing student enrollment is necessary to justify the expense of hiring another teacher.
- **Teacher Workload:** Addressing concerns of parents about teacher workload, Chairperson Nidhi Basu acknowledged the issue and shared that RCJE has recognized this challenge. As a result, long-term service awards were organized for teachers, and their salaries were increased by 50% to appreciate their hard work.

### 6. Summer Camp Proposal

For the first time, SDDS plans to organize a summer camp during the upcoming vacation. This initiative aims to provide students with opportunities to learn new skills, engage in enjoyable activities, and boost their confidence. Details will be shared in due course.

### 7. Closing Remarks

Rotarian Nidhi Basu concluded the meeting by expressing gratitude to all attendees for their active participation and support. She reiterated the importance of continued collaboration among parents, teachers, and the committee to ensure the holistic development of the students.

The meeting adjourned with light refreshments arranged for all attendees.



## 50 Things Every Rotarian Should Know About Rotary

**15 - SHARING ROTARY WITH NEW MEMBERS** : Are you aware of the responsibility or obligation most Rotarians fail to perform? Paying their dues? Attending meetings? Contributing to the club service fund? Participating in club events and projects? Nonone of these! Of all the obligations a person accepts when joining a Rotary club the one in which most Rotarians fail is "sharing Rotary." The policies of Rotary International clearly affirm that every individual Rotarian has an "obligation to share Rotary with others and to help extend Rotary through pro posing qualified persons for Rotary club membership." It is estimated that less than 30 percent of the members of most Rotary clubs have ever made the effort to propose a new member. Thus, in every club, there are many Rotarians who readily accept the pleasures of being a Rotarian without ever sharing that privilege with another qualified individual. The Rotary policy on club membership states: "In order for a Rotary club to be fully relevant to its community and responsive to the needs of those in the community, it is important and necessary that the club include in its membership all fully qualified prospective members located within its territory" One merely has to glance through the yellow pages of the local telephone directory to realize that most clubs have not invited qualified members of all businesses and professions into Rotary Only a Rotarian may propose a customer, neighbor, client, supplier, executive, relative, business associate, professional or other qualified person to join a Rotary club. Have you accepted your obligation to share Rotary? The procedures are very simple, and everyone must know at least one person who should belong to Rotary.
