11. PP Rtn Kailash Singhania extended a heartfelt vote of thanks to CA Gaurav Agarwal.

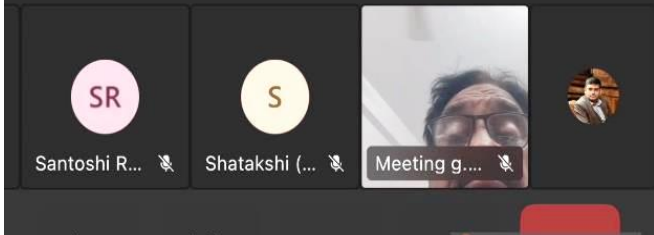
12. President Rtn Subhrajit Basu presented a token of appreciation to CA Gaurav Agarwal for his insightful talk.

Guest Speaker highlights - CA Gaurav Agarwal -



According to the announcement made under the latest budget, the revised tax slab applies to the new tax regime. The corresponding changes from April 1, 2024, are highlighted below:

Total Income	Tax rate
₹0 to ₹3,00,000	0%
₹3,00,001 to ₹7,00,000	5%
₹7,00,001 to ₹10,00,000	10%
₹10,00,001 to ₹12,00,000	15%
₹12,00,001 to ₹15,00,000	20%
Above ₹15,00,000	30%

- The standard deduction limit under the head salary has been increased from Rs. 50,000 to Rs. 75,000.
- Deduction on employer's contribution u/s 80CCD(2) has been increased from 10% to 14% of salary and dearness allowance.
- Rebate u/s 87A increased from 12,500 to Rs. 25,000 if taxable income is less than or equal to Rs. 7 Lakhs.

Switching Back to the Old Tax Regime

- From the financial year 2023-24, the new income tax regime will be valid as the default tax regime.
- If you plan to switch back to the old tax regime, submitting a form (Form 10-IEA) is vital while filing the tax return.
- The frequency of switching between old and new tax regimes depends on the type of your income. If it's professional or business income, you can switch between old and new tax regimes **only once during the lifetime**. But if the income type is other than professional/business income, you can switch between the old and new tax regimes yearly.

Changes In Taxation of Capital Gains:

- For classifying assets into long-term and short-term, there will only be two holding periods: 12 months and 24 months. The 36-month holding period has been removed.
- The holding period for all listed securities is 12 months. All listed securities with a holding period exceeding 12 months are considered Long-Term. The holding period for all other assets is 24 months.
- The taxation of Short-Term Capital Gain for listed equity shares, a unit of an equity-oriented fund, and a unit of a business trust has been increased to 20% from 15%. Other financial and non-financial assets which are held for short term shall continue to attract the tax at slab rates.

- For the benefit of the lower and middle-income classes, the limit on the exemption of Long-Term Capital Gains on the transfer of equity shares or equity-oriented units or units of Business Trust has increased from Rs.1 Lakh to Rs. 1.25 lakh per year. However, the rate at which it is taxed has increased from 10% to 12.5%.
- The exemption limit to Rs. 1.25 lakhs has been increased for the whole of the year, whereas the tax rate changed on 23rd July 2024.
- The tax on long-term capital gains on other financial and non-financial assets is reduced from 20% to 12.5%. While on the other hand, the indexation benefit that previously was available on sale of long-term assets, has now been done away with. So, any sale of long-term asset made from 23rd July 2024, will attract tax rate of 12.5% only without indexation benefit.
- However, it is to be noted that the provision regarding availing the benefit of FMV of asset as on 01.04.2001 as cost while selling the asset, is still available even after the recent changes.

STT on Futures and Options:

The Securities Transaction Tax (STT) on futures has been increased from 0.0125% to 0.02% .

STT on options has been increased from 0.0625% to 0.1%.

Introduction of TDS on Payments Made to Partners by Firms (Section 194T)

This budget introduced a new TDS provision for payments made by the firms (i.e., it covers both partnership firms as well as LLPs), to the partners by way of salary, remuneration, interest, bonus or commission.

So, now any payment by a firm of the above nature exceeding Rs. 20,000 shall be subjected to the TDS at the rate of **10% u/s 194T**.

Increase in limit for Partner's Remuneration:

Under section 40(b), the partner's limit for remuneration has been increased in the Budget 2024 as follows,

Book Profit	Limit
On the first Rs.6,00,000 of book profit or loss	Rs.3,00,000 or 90% of the book profit, whichever is higher
On the remaining balance of book-profit	60% of the book-profit

GOLD Import Duty to 6%

Among the most prominent was the government's slashed import duties on **gold and silver to 6% from 15%**, a move industry officials say could boost retail demand and help curtail smuggling in the world's second-biggest bullion consumer. A higher demand for gold from India could boost the global prices, which hit a record high this year, although that could widen India's trade deficit and put further pressure on the ailing rupee.

Here's what's gotten cheaper:

- Mobile phones, mobile parts, batteries, mobile chargers**
Basic customs duty is reduced on mobile phones, chargers, and accessories to 15 per cent
- Gold, silver & platinum**
The customs duty on gold, silver reduced to 6 per cent, platinum to 6.4 per cent
- Cancer medicines, X-ray equipment**
Three major cancer treatment medicines and X-ray equipment are exempted from basic customs duty
- Fish and fish products**
The customs duty on fish, broodstock, shrimp, polychaete worms, and fish feed is reduced to 5 per cent
- Essential metals & minerals**
The basic customs duty on ferro nickel, blister copper and 25 critical minerals is removed. The duty for manufacturing resistors (oxygen-free copper) has also been removed.
- Solar panels, leather goods**
The list of exempted items to manufacture solar panels has been expanded, and the customs duty on leather goods has been reduced.

Support for startups and MSMEs

The Union Budget proposed the abolition of the **Angel Tax** to bolster the startup ecosystem and encourage more investments in new ventures. Similarly, enhancing the Mudra loan limit from ₹10 lakh to ₹20 lakh, along with new credit guarantee schemes, will support micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs).

Relief for e-commerce business

The budget reduced the tax deducted at source (TDS) rate on e-commerce transactions from 1% to 0.1%. The finance minister also withdrew the 2% equalization levy. These moves will provide relief to digital companies.

Direct taxation – Business income tax

The budget introduces a reduction in the corporate tax rate for foreign businesses, lowering it from 40% to 35%. There are also changes in tax structures for charities, foreign shipping companies operating domestic cruises in the country, and the calculation of capital gains.

What's Angel Tax ?

Angel tax refers to the income tax that the government imposes on funding raised by unlisted companies, or startups, if their valuation exceeds the company's fair market value. It falls under Section 56 (II) (viib) of the Income Tax Act.

Introduced by Pranab Mukherjee

Introduced in 2012, Angel Tax was enacted under the Finance Act of that year. At the time, Pranab Mukherjee, late President of India, was the Finance Minister of the country. While previously the angel tax applied only to local investors, the Budget for the 2023-24 fiscal year (April 2023 to March 2024) widened its ambit to include foreign investments.

'We are Rotary' – Session at Tata Motors Hospital

As a part of the Membership development theme, August 29, 2024, saw a team from RCJE conduct an awareness session with a cohort of Doctors practicing in Tata Motors Hospital.

The RCJE contingent led by President Rtn Subhrajit Basu presented an overview of Rotary with audio visual aids. PDG Pratim Banerjee, shared his experience on various Rotary initiatives and provided valuable insights during the session.

The session was attended by 30+ doctors, including the head of Tata Motors Hospital, Dr. Sanjay Kumar. The session was very well received by the participants, many of whom have expressed an interest in working towards various causes related to the Rotary cause. The doctors were also presented with a tent card displaying show casing Rotary's 4-way Test.

JAMSHEDPUR EAST

The members provided lunch to 32 residents of Old Age Home. A blood donation camp was organized at MGM Hospital where 46 units of blood was collected. TB awareness session & food packet are distributed to TB patients regularly. A Maternal & Child Health Care awareness program along with Baby show was held. A tree plantation drive was conducted at Theme Park where 150 fruit bearing saplings were planted. Press Coverage on Blood Donation and Annapurna Project. A Gymnastic programme was conducted in a SDD School.



JAMSHEDPUR FEMINA

Hosted a vital CPR training session for class XII students. 25 saplings were planted in the Industrial area of Jamshedpur. The club organized a Health Check up camp for Class VI to X students. A press conference was organized to spell club's vision & future Plans. Rice & Dal was distributed to 60 homeless & physically challenged women.



JAMSHEDPUR

A Rotary Satellite Eye Screening Van was stationed in a school where a no. of errors were found. Hot & nutritious food was distributed amongst 200 residents of 2 villages. Computer classes was started at a school in a village for 350 students. In a press conference, the club had informed to provide free treatment to children suffering from cancer & congenital heart disease. The club distributed fresh & nutritious meals to approx. 300 residents of 2 tribal villages. Spoken English Classes were held for around 60 mothers. Free medical check up & medicines were provided to approx. 57 patients. Vocational training like stitching & beautician classes are going on in Saheli centre. Around 220 shelters were provided to attendants of patients at cancer hospital. In a Play school books & uniform is provided to 22 children and monthly salary is paid to 2 teachers.



JAMSHEDPUR MIDTOWN

Rs.2000 was donated for fulfilling the nutritive needs of the children of creche. 20 fruit bearing plants were planted in the kitchen garden. A Saheli Centre was inaugurated to provide vocational training to women. A needy patient was provided free treatment for proximal Tibia Fracture. Rotary banners projecting the details of artificial limbs programme was displayed at 3 villages. An awareness talk was conducted for mothers on World Population Day. The club conducted a grooming & etiquette session in St. Mary's Hindi School. In artificial Limbs & LN4 camp, around 126 beneficiaries received free artificial limbs.



JAMSHEDPUR STEEL CITY

Around 350 residents of a village were screened for possession & benefits of Ayushman Card. PPH programme was conducted in a village Tapudang for 145 villagers. In the same village 427 villagers were screened for general health check up by a panel of specialist doctors. Around 60 Old villagers underwent screening for cataract. An awareness talk was given on oral hygiene to the children under 12 years. Freshly cooked meals were provided to approximately 300 to 350 attendants of patients in MGM Hospital. A total of 250 trees were planted, at Stray Army Campus. A general Health Check up camp was organized in a village Kuchai. In Industrial Health camp 49 employees were given CPR & First aid training.



JAMSHEDPUR WEST

In the foothills of Dalma, 500 saplings of Teak & fruit bearing trees were planted and distributed 10 trees to each family. Vocational training was given to women to uplift & empower them. The club constructed a pond to meet the water crisis. 21000 saplings of Mangrove, Casuarinas & Sundari trees were planted in the Sundarban. In a remote village a basic learning center has been started for 38 students of various age group. The club has been providing weekly ration to the children of impoverished labourers. Another learning center has been provided at Cyclone hit Ghoramara island.



JAMSHEDPUR DALMA

A regular health check up camp was organized for 22 pregnant women. They were also briefed about Hygiene & Nutrition. A three days joint project with all the clubs of zone 3 was held to provide artificial limbs & LN4 hands to about 84 beneficiaries. 120 fruit bearing trees were also planted. A survey for the construction of toilet was conducted in Bengal Muslim School.

Sangkoo Yun chosen 2026–27 RI President



Sangkoo Yun, a member of RC Sae Hanyang, Seoul, Korea, has been chosen by the Nominating Committee as RI president for 2026–27. He will be officially declared the president-nominee on September 15 if no other candidates challenge him. Yun received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the Syracuse University School of Architecture in the US and an honorary doctoral degree from The University of Edinburgh, Scotland. He is the founder and CEO of Dongshu Corp, which engineers and markets architectural material, and the president of Youngan Corp,





which operates in real estate and financial investment. He is involved in many civic organisations and has a special interest in the preservation of cultural heritage.

A Rotary member since 1987, when he was a charter member of RC Sae Hanyang, Yun has served RI as a director, trustee, committee member and chair, and RI learning facilitator. He served for eight years as co-chair of the Keep Mongolia Green Project, implemented by the Korean members of Rotary.

Yun received TRF's Distinguished Service Award in 2021–22. He was appointed an Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire by Queen Elizabeth II, awarded the Friendship Medal by the president of Mongolia, and recognised for distinguished service by the president and prime minister of Korea. He is a veteran of the Republic of Korea Army and an emeritus elder at Andong Presbyterian Church.

Yun and his spouse, Eunsun, are Rotary Foundation Benefactors, Major Donors and members of the Arch Klumph Society, the Paul Harris Society and the Bequest Society. They have two children.



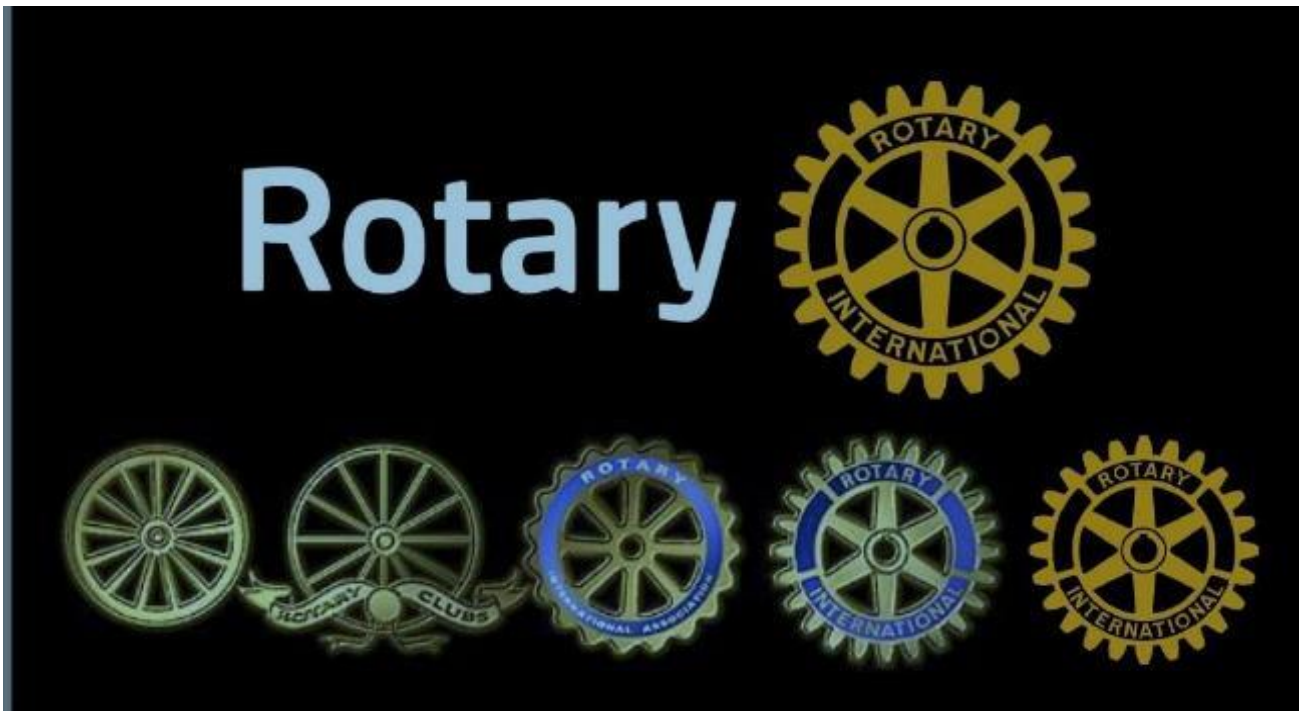

50 Things Every Rotarian Should Know About Rotary

3 - ROTARY'S WHEEL EMBLEM : A wheel has been the symbol of Rotary since our earliest days. The first design was made by Chicago Rotarian Montague Bear, an engraver who drew a simple wagon wheel, with a few lines to show dust and motion. The wheel was said to illustrate "Civilization and Movement." Most of the early clubs had some form of wagon wheel on their publications and letterheads. Finally, in 1922, it was decided that all Rotary clubs should adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem of Rotarians. Thus, in 1923, the present gear wheel, with 24 cogs and six spokes was adopted by the "Rotary International Association." A group of engineers advised that the geared wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a "keyway" in the center of the gear to attach it to a power shaft. So, in 1923 the keyway was added and the design which we now know was formally adopted as the official Rotary International emblem.

I love our many Rotary traditions, especially our emblem: the wheel. Whenever I put on my Rotary pin, admire a new club’s logo, or spot the emblem on a volunteer’s t-shirt, I am inspired by the possibilities that wheel represents.

Early in Rotary, our predecessors envisioned it as a gear, part of a sturdy machine making great things happen. It remains that, and much more. To me, it also symbolises cycles and movement on our journey of doing good in the world. August is Rotary’s Membership and New Club Development Month, and I encourage you to think about the cyclical connection between membership and The Rotary Foundation.

When we have engaged members in dynamic clubs, *The Magic of Rotary* happens. Members — both new and experienced — deepen their commitment to each other and their communities. And that local engagement attracts attention and more members.

Gradually, the new members realise their club is part of a powerful organisation that is making lasting change in the world. They learn about the Foundation, support it, and perhaps apply for a grant. They see themselves as part of the

movement that will eradicate polio. As our members’ experience deepens, so does their commitment to Rotary at all levels. The public sees our impact, making Rotary irresistible. New members join, new clubs are formed, and the cycle continues. With each turn of the wheel, we grow Rotary and our Foundation.

There are countless ways this magical connection between clubs and our Foundation can unfold. For instance, 100% Paul Harris Fellow clubs, where every member is a Paul Harris Fellow, showcase how engaged clubs are directly connected to the Foundation. 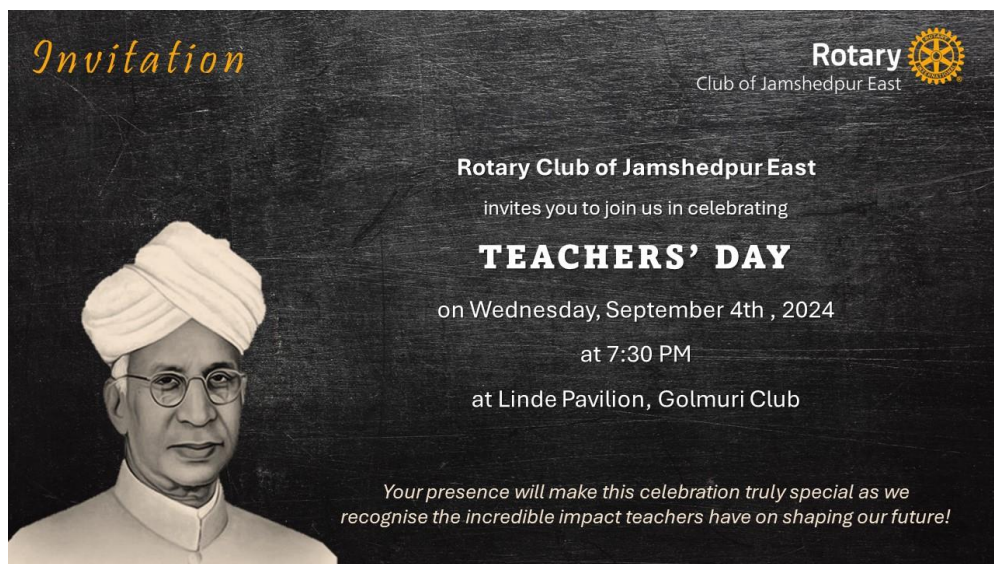
