


SDDS Students' Artwork Collage at MTMH

'When', not 'if': Progress continues toward ending polio

On World Polio Day, Rotary International leaders, including President Stephanie A. Urchick, and public health experts emphasized their commitment to eradicating polio globally, celebrating significant strides since the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) was established in 1988. Speaking at an event in Pittsburgh, the birthplace of Dr. Jonas Salk's polio vaccine, leaders highlighted Rotary's role in reducing wild polio cases by 99.9%. Despite ongoing challenges in Afghanistan, Pakistan, and recent cases in Gaza, Rotary leaders remain optimistic, reinforced by dedicated vaccination workers and partners like the Gates Foundation, which matches Rotary's fundraising efforts. Dr. Peter Salk honored his father's legacy, acknowledging Rotary's dedication to ending

polio and advancing global health.



Rotary commits funds to polio outbreak response in Gaza

Rotary International has committed \$500,000 to support a polio outbreak response in Gaza, where a recent detection of variant poliovirus type-2 in environmental samples and a confirmed case in a 10-month-old child have raised concerns. The humanitarian crisis has impacted routine immunizations, increasing the risk of vaccine-preventable diseases. Rotary's funds, channeled through the Polio Outbreak Response Fund, aim to assist the World Health Organization (WHO) and partners in delivering vaccinations under challenging conditions. Following a successful initial round that reached 95% of eligible children, ongoing conflict has delayed the campaign's third phase. Rotary remains committed to working with the Global Polio Eradication Initiative to end polio worldwide.

7 - FIRST NAMES OR NICKNAMES

From the earliest days of Rotary, members have referred to each other on a first-name basis. Since personal acquaintanceship and friendship are cornerstones of Rotary, it was natural that many clubs adopted the practice of setting aside formal titles in conversations among members. Individuals who normally would be addressed as Doctor, Professor, Mister, the Honorable or Sir are regularly called Joe, Bill, Charley or Jerry by other Rotarians. The characteristic Rotary club name badge fosters the first-name custom. In a few areas, such as Europe, club members use a more formal style in addressing fellow members. In other parts of the world, mainly in Asian countries, the practice is to assign each new Rotarian a humorous nickname which relates to some personal characteristic or which is descriptive of the member's business or profession. A member nicknamed "Oxygen" is the manufacturer of chemical gas products. "Trees" is the nickname for the Rotarian in the lumber business, "Building" is the contractor, "Paper" is the stationery or office supply retailer. Other members might carry nicknames like "Muscles," "Foghorn" or "Smiles" as commentaries on their physical features.

The nicknames are frequently a source of good-natured fun and fellowship. But whether a Rotarian is addressed by a given first name or a nickname, the spirit of personal friendship is the initial step which opens doors to all other opportunities for service.




