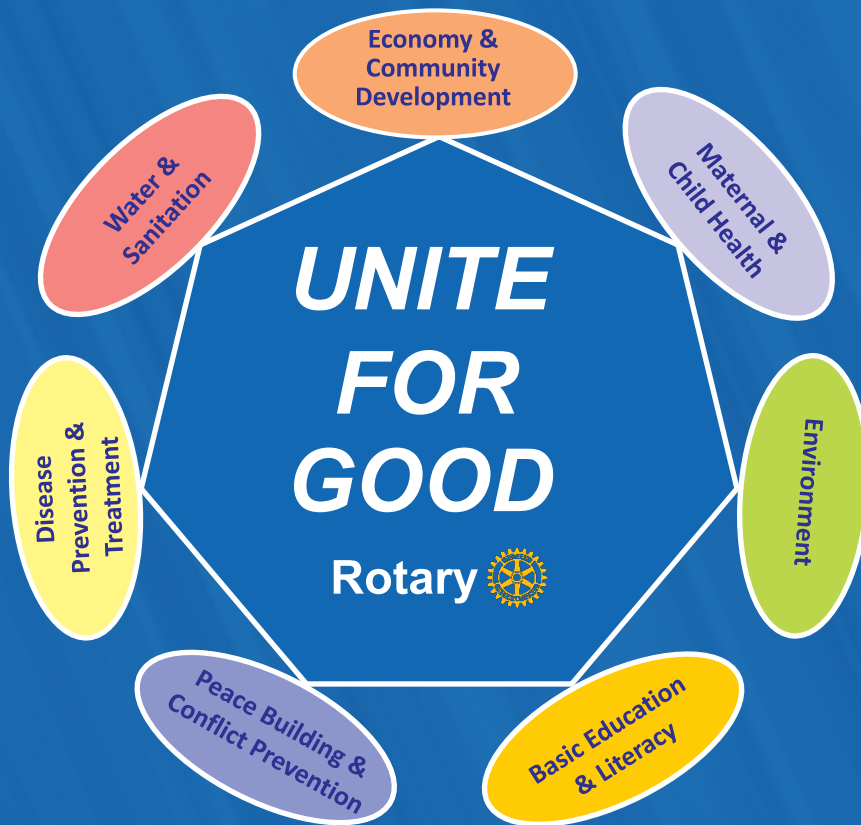

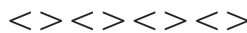
RCJ BHELAIPAHARI MOTHER & CHILD HEALTHCARE CARE CLINIC

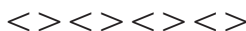
FOOD FOR ALL PROGRAMME

INTERACT CLUB ACTIVITIES

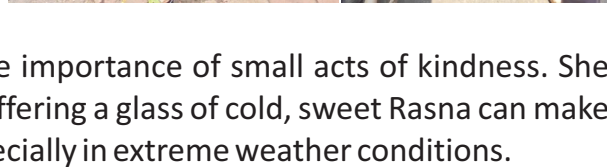

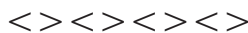
A Proud Moment for Us!

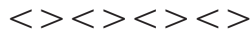

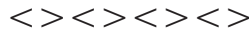
