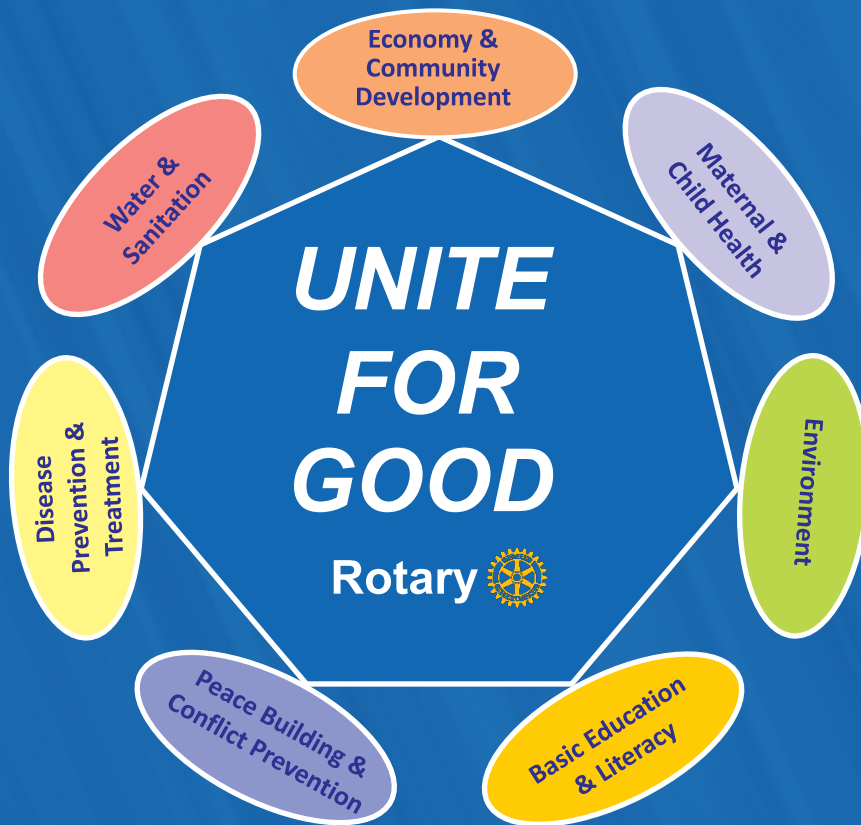

APRIL IS MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH MONTH

Rotary makes high-quality health care available to vulnerable mothers and children so they can live longer and grow stronger.



We expand access to quality care, so mothers and children everywhere can have the same opportunities for a healthy future. In 2020, an estimated 5 million children under the age of 5 years died, mostly from preventable and treatable causes. Approximately half of those deaths, 2.4 million, occurred among newborns (in the first 28 days of life). The leading causes of death in children under 5 years can all be prevented or treated with access to affordable interventions in health and sanitation.

Students participated in drawing competition and poem recitation. The best ones were rewarded with gifts sponsored by Rtn Santosh Ranjan.

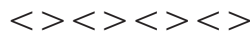

Organised at Jagannathpur & Dimkadih Villages on 18th April 2026, this was the 3rd event of March and 42nd Event of RY 2025-26.

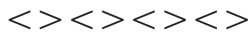

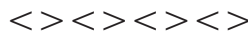
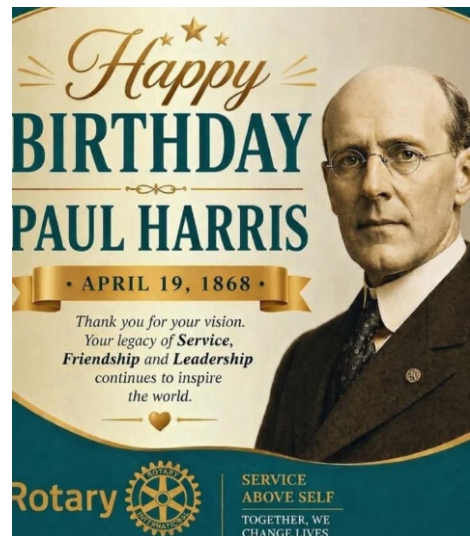

Message From District Governor

Fellow Rotarians and friends,

April reminds us that the future of our world is cradled in the arms of mothers and in the hopeful eyes of children. As Rotary focuses this month on Maternal and Child Health, we are called to strengthen the most fundamental bond of all that of a healthy mother and a thriving child – so that every family can dream without fear and grow with dignity.

Around the world, Rotary has shown that simple, timely interventions save lives: access to safe deliveries, essential nutrition, routine immunization, and education for caregivers. In our own district, I am proud of the quiet but powerful work Rotary has been doing from supporting antenatal check-up camps and anaemia screening, to providing newborn care kits, breastfeeding counselling, and ensuring children complete their vaccination schedules. Each intervention may seem small, but for one mother, one child, it can mean the difference between loss and life, between despair and hope.

This month, I urge every club to look again at the needs of mothers and children in their own neighbourhoods. Partner with local health centres, ASHA workers, paediatricians, gynaecologists, and NGOs. Strengthen government programmes through last-mile support. Adopt anganwadis and primary health centres to improve infrastructure, sanitation, and health education. Involve Rotaractors and Interactors as ambassadors of awareness, taking messages on nutrition, menstrual health, and hygiene into communities.

Let us also remember that care goes beyond the first thousand days. Children need safe water, a clean environment, mental well-being, and opportunities to learn and play. When Rotary serves the mother, we serve the entire family. When we protect the child, we protect our shared tomorrow.

Together, let us make April a month where every project, every partnership, and every act of service moves us closer to a world where no mother is left alone and no child is left behind.
