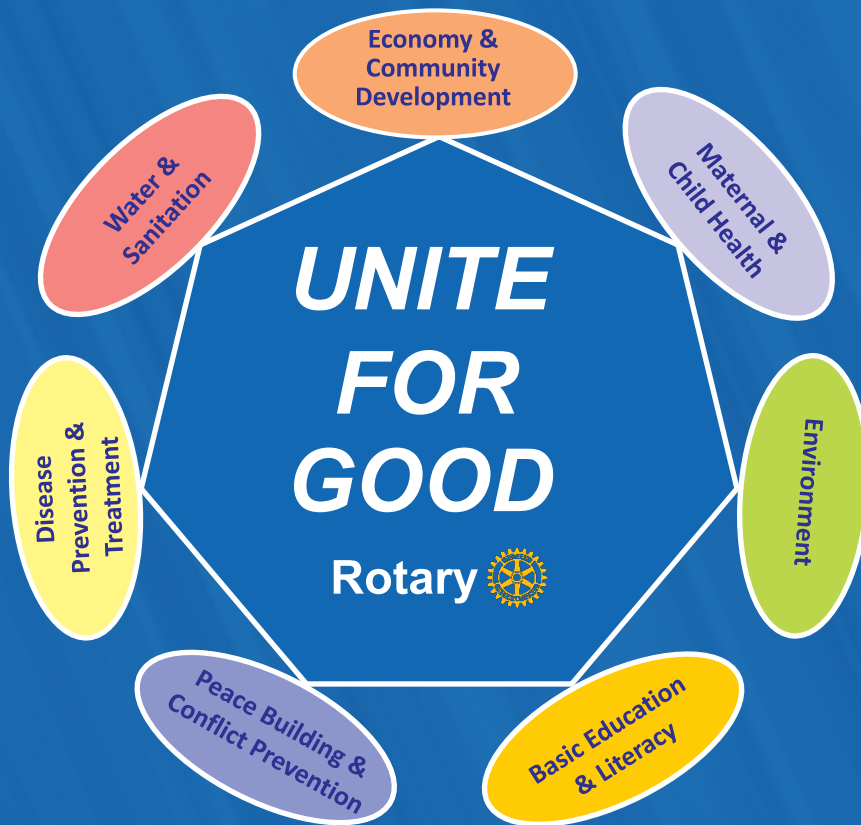

Programme- Ladies Night

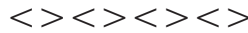
A fun- filled programme was put up to celebrate the Ladies of the club.

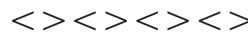


ROTARY RURAL DIALYSIS CENTRE - AN UPDATE AS ON 20TH MAY 2026

The **Rotary Jamshedpur Rural Dialysis Centre** at Bhilaipahari (NH 33) on the way to Ghatshila, a **Global Grant project initiated in Rotary Year 2020–21**, has been serving rural communities in and around Bhilaipahari village continuously since its inception. Despite challenges in ensuring regular availability of a nephrologist, the centre completed **236 dialysis sessions in RY 2025–26** at subsidized rates based on the patient financial condition.



The project is coordinated by Assistant Governor PP Rtn. D.N. Jena, under whose presidentship the initiative was launched, in collaboration with Fr. Vincent David, Director of St. Joseph's Hospital.
