The Last Piece of Bread

It was a quiet Tuesday night. I was having my dinner while watching TV—just one of those casual evenings where the day winds down with the comfort of food and familiar noise in the background. As I finished the last bite of my meal, I noticed a bit of gravy still left on my plate. Not much, just enough for one nivala—a perfect final scoop, if only I had a piece of bread.

I looked around, hoping to find one, but the breadbasket was empty. I sighed, a bit disappointed. That small amount of gravy didn't feel worth the effort of getting up or rummaging around. So, I let it go. I left the gravy untouched, placed my plate in the sink, and began clearing the dining table.

And then—just as I moved a bowl aside—I saw it. A single, untouched piece of bread, slightly hidden behind a tissue box.

For a moment, I stood there, smiling at the irony. The bread had been there all along. I had wanted it, but I didn't bother to look properly. All it needed was a little shuffle, a little more effort.
