## Aarogya Mela 2026:

### A Landmark Healthcare Initiative



The Shrimad Rajchandra Aatma Tatva Research Center (SRATRC) - Jamshedpur, in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Jamshedpur Steel City and Team Aarogyamm, successfully organized "Aarogya Mela 2026." Hosted at Narbheram Hansraj School, this mega health camp provided comprehensive medical services to over 550 beneficiaries, including the domestic and office staff of several club members. The camp featured a systematic diagnostic workflow, beginning with comprehensive blood screenings followed by a nutritious breakfast for all participants. An extensive Out-Patient Department (OPD) was established, staffed by renowned general physicians and specialists across 12 disciplines, including Cardiology, Neurology, Orthopedics, and Dentistry. Furthermore, the vision screening unit distributed free reading glasses to those in need. This initiative exemplifies the spirit of Vocational Service Month, with Rtn Dr. Binayak Baruah and Rtn Dr. Vishal Lodha personally attending to patients. The seamless execution of the six-hour event was made possible by the meticulous planning of SRATRC, the tireless efforts of Team Aarogyamm led by Club Secretary Rtn Jitesh Choudhary, and the vital support of Health Chair Rtn Dr. Priyanka Singh. Special recognition is due to Rtn Milee Zatakia and Partner Pignesh for spearheading the collaboration, and to the NSU Rotaractors for their efficient crowd management.

#### A Collaborative Initiative with All India Radio

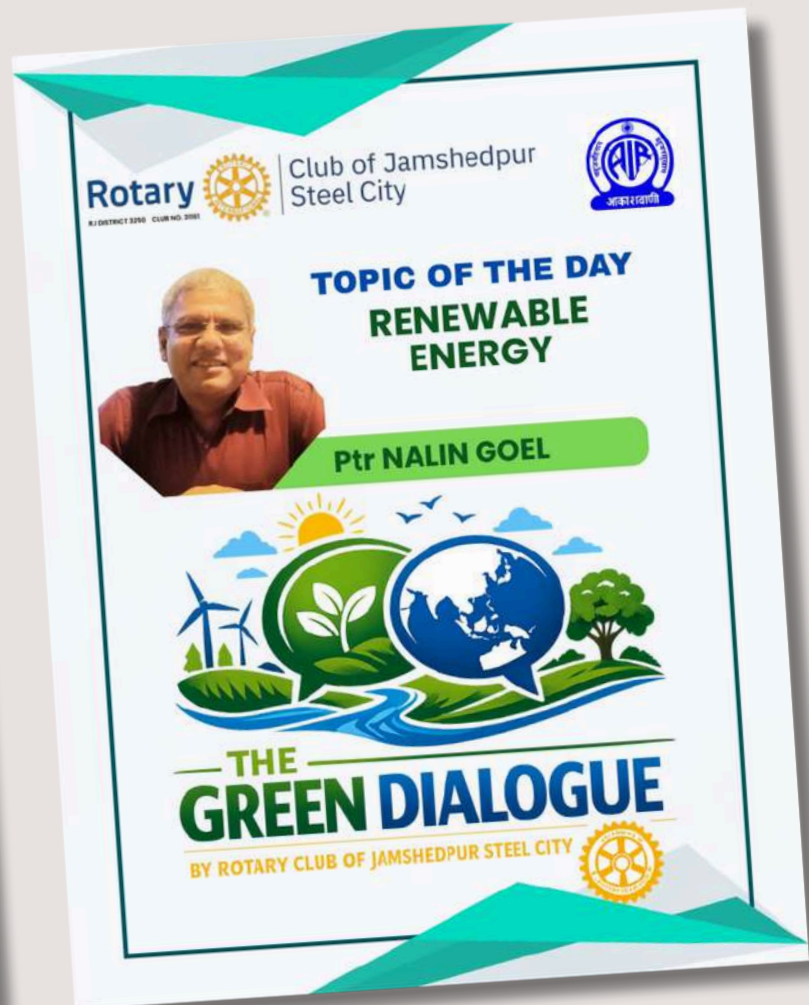

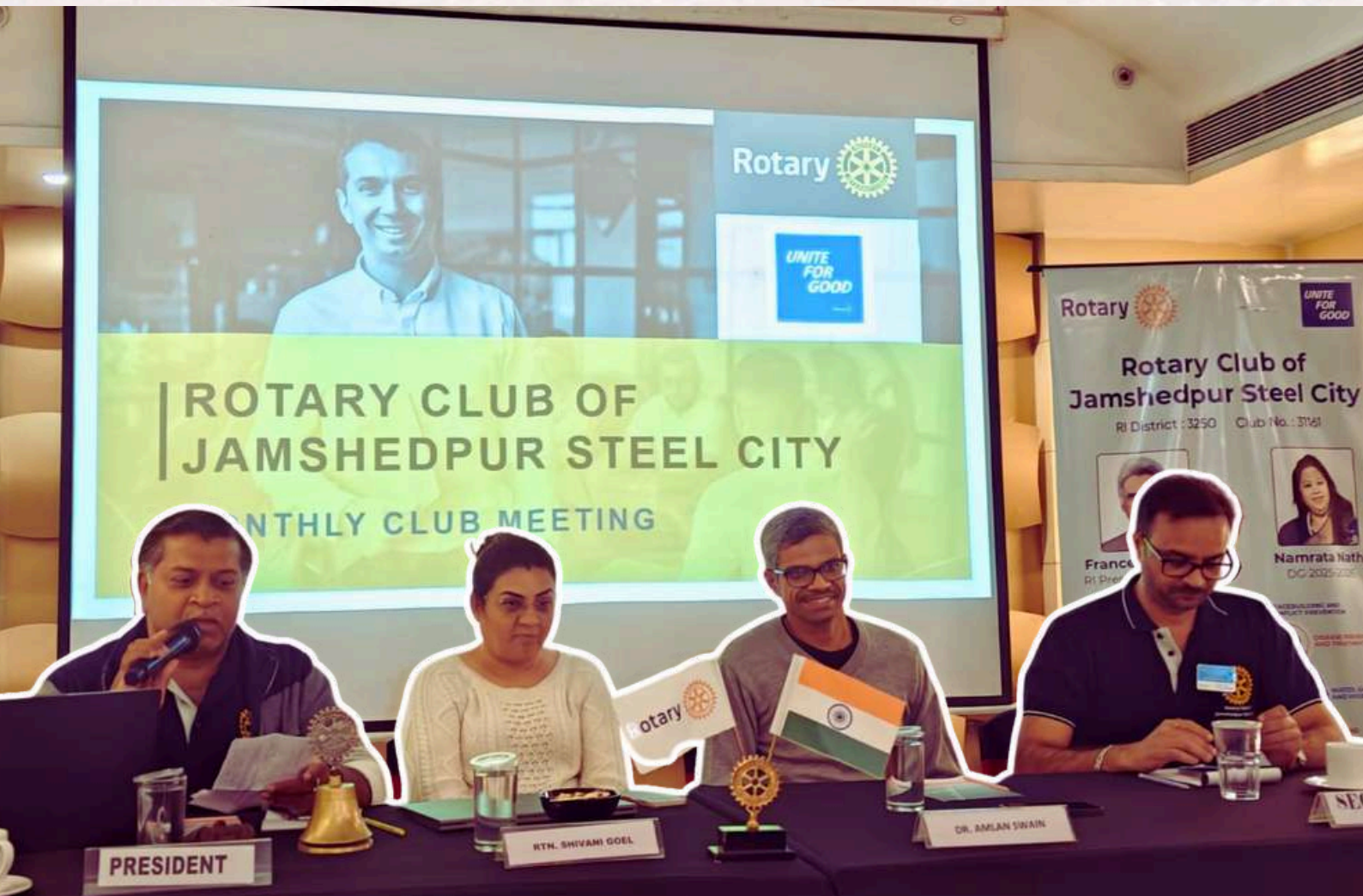


## Club Meeting Highlights

### Jharkhand Healthcare Summit: Advancing Rural Care

On March 28, 2026, the PHDCCI Jharkhand Chapter and National Health Mission (NHM) hosted the 3rd Jharkhand Healthcare Summit in Ranchi. The event convened over 200 policymakers, medical experts, and industry leaders to discuss infrastructure and technology in rural health.

The summit featured Shri Radha Krishna Kishore, Hon'ble Finance Minister of Jharkhand, as Chief Guest, while Dr. Ranjeet Mehta (CEO, PHDCCI) outlined the vision for a developed, healthy India.

Rtn Dr. Priyanka Singh delivered a keynote on the "Importance of Medicolegal Frameworks in Sustainable Healthcare." She highlighted how structured medicolegal practices protect both patients and professionals by ensuring transparency and accountability. Her primary recommendations included:

- **Continuous Medicolegal Education:** Making such training mandatory for practitioners.
- **Ethical Standards:** Implementing solutions to increase awareness of ethical medical practices.

The summit concluded with a unified commitment from stakeholders and the government to build an inclusive and efficient healthcare ecosystem for Jharkhand.

# RECIPE BY MEGHANA G. BARUAH

Here's a simple date cake recipe without eggs:

**HEALTHY Eating HEALTHY Living**

Healthy and quick as I had used atta and no added sugar. Sweetness from the good quality dates were just perfect for my taste buds.

## Ingredients:

- 1 cup dates, pitted and chopped
- 1 cup all-purpose flour or Atta ( optional)
- 1/2 cup sugar( optional or as per your taste preferences for sweetness)
- 1/2 cup oil
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon vanilla essence
- Chopped nuts (optional)



## Instructions:

1. Preheat your air fryer for 5mins in 180°C (350°F). Grease a cake tin.
2. Soak dates in milk for 30 minutes. Blend to a paste.
3. Mix flour, sugar, baking powder, and baking soda.
4. Add oil, vanilla essence, and date paste. Mix well.
5. Pour batter into the cake tin. Top with nuts (if using).
6. Bake for 15 to 20 minutes or till a toothpick comes out clean. All air fryer has different sizes and temperature control so keep checking in between.

## Tips:

- Use fresh dates for best flavor.
- Adjust sugar to taste.
- Try adding cinnamon or cardamom for extra flavor.

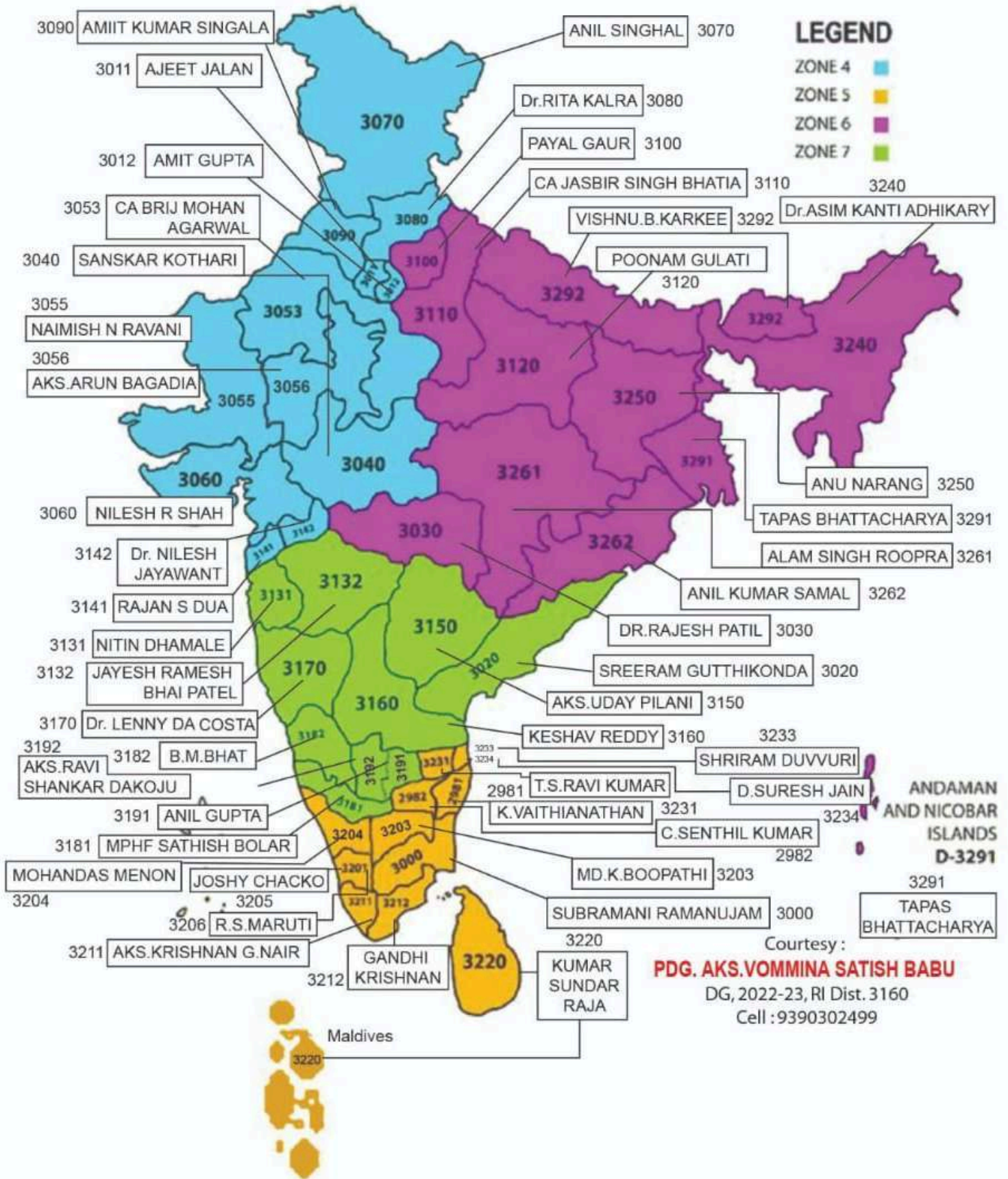
