Rotary Convention Taipei 2026

More than 30,000 Rotary members from over 120 countries will gather in Taipei from 13–17 June 2026, giving the city an estimated US\$50–55 million economic boost. The event—Taipei’s first Rotary convention since 1994—will be held at the Taipei Nangang Exhibition Center and Taipei Dome, featuring global speakers and over 100 humanitarian project exhibits. Taipei’s leaders and Rotary organizers say they are ready to showcase the city’s culture, hospitality, and community service efforts.



Inspiring Young Dreamers

Rotary Scholar and singer Janet Chvatal, whose scholarship helped her study music in Vienna and launch a successful performing career, now uses her children’s book *The Wish Prince* to inspire kids to follow their dreams. Through her Wish Prince Project, she has given away 20,000 books and visits classrooms with Beaverton Rotarians to teach children how to set goals and believe in themselves.

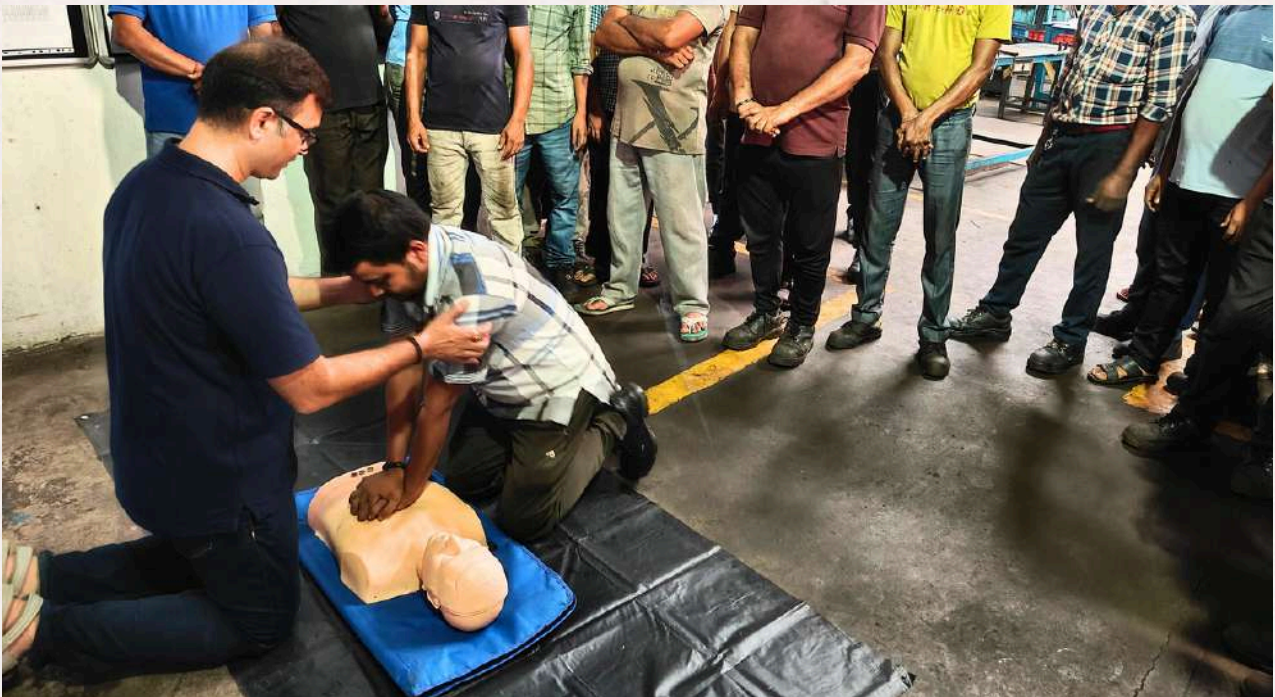
CPR Training Camp

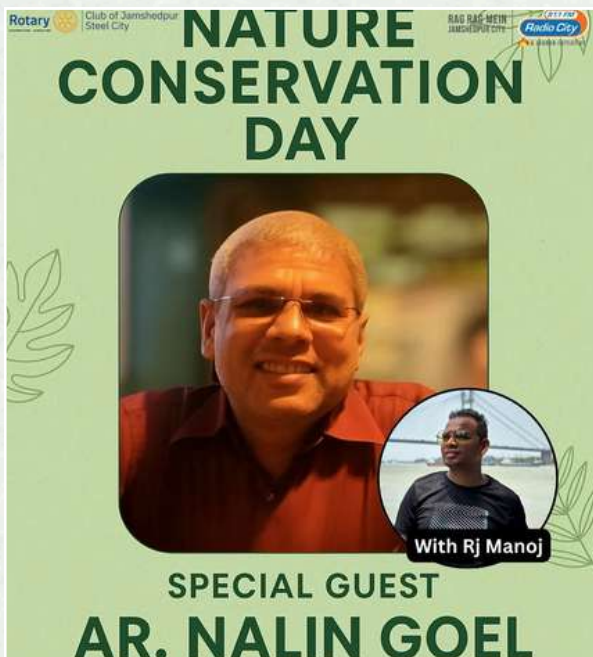
Tree Plantation Drive

PROJECT JALODAY – Water Conservation in Factories

Goal:

To reduce water consumption and promote sustainable practices in factories through efficient resource management.

Methodology:

- Install water meters to monitor usage and detect leaks.
- Implement rainwater harvesting for non-potable applications.
- Use aerator taps to reduce water flow.
- Adopt dual flush cisterns to minimize toilet water usage.

Benefits:

- ✓ Major water & cost savings
- ✓ Better monitoring and quick leak detection
- ✓ Reduced wastewater generation
- ✓ Strong sustainability and corporate responsibility profile

Implementation Steps:

1. Conduct water audits
2. Install water-saving devices
3. Enforce water-conservation policies
4. Monitor & review usage regularly

Conclusion:

Water-efficient solutions like metering, rainwater harvesting, aerators and dual flush systems can significantly reduce water usage, cut costs, and build sustainable industrial operations.

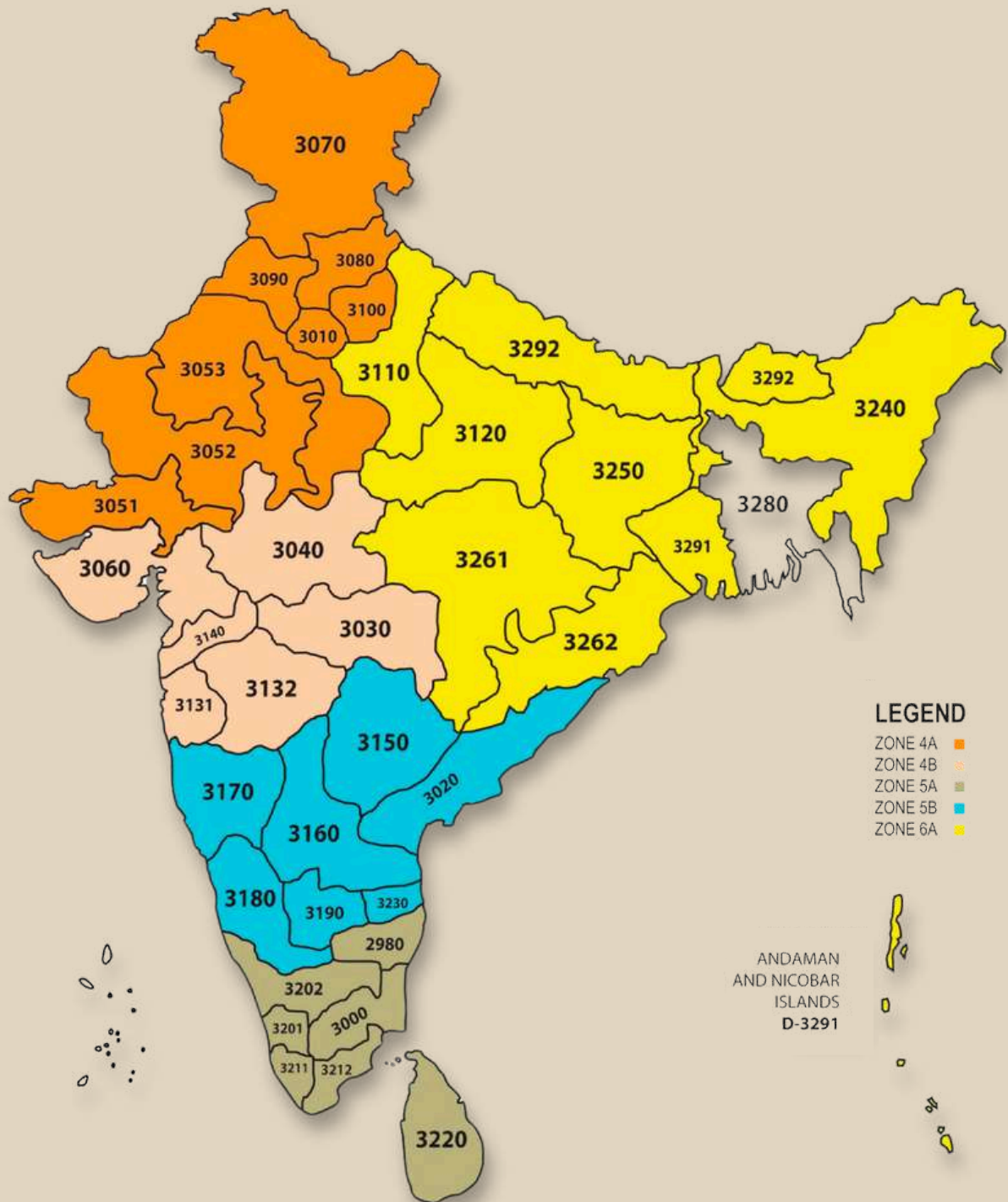

Rotary Club of Jamshedpur Steel City: Three Decades of Service & Fellowship

An interview with Charter President Smita Parikh
Founded in 1995 at the Tube Makers Club, Rotary Club of Jamshedpur Steel City began its journey with 30 charter members and Smita Parikh as its first President. Guided by leaders like District Governor Vijay Mehta, the club quickly embraced its mission of service and community transformation.

One of its earliest and most impactful initiatives was the development of Kathjor village in the Dalma region. Projects ranged from water conservation and agricultural support to housing under the Indira Awas Yojana and livelihood programmes. Health camps and education drives further deepened the club's rural outreach.

The club also made its mark culturally, with events like Tiranga Antakshari and Inter-Rotary cricket tournaments. Focus areas like women's empowerment and polio eradication became long-standing commitments.

Youth engagement has been vital, with a call to revive the Rotary Youth Exchange Programme for global exposure. Second-generation leaders such as Jalpa Parikh and Krishna Kharia continue the legacy.

As Smita Parikh reflects, "Rotary offers a platform for learning, networking, and aligning energies for service." Thirty years on, Rotary Steel City stands tall-rooted in fellowship, leadership, and impactful action.
