Programs that facilitate cultural exchange for young people, promoting understanding and friendship across borders.

Rotary Clubs:

May also focus on local youth-related initiatives in their own communities during this month.

Focus on Empowerment:

The month's theme emphasizes the importance of empowering young people and providing them with opportunities to develop leadership skills and contribute to their communities.

Rotary's Fifth Avenue of Service:

Youth Service is one of Rotary's five core areas of service, along with Community Service, Vocational Service, International Service, and Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention.
