EDITORIAL



Dear Friends in Rotary,
Happy Rotary greetings to all of you.

All over the world Rotary International celebrates Vocational Service Month in January. Vocational service is a core principle of Rotary International that encourages members to use their skills and

expertise to help communities. It's a way to recognize the value of all occupations and to promote ethical business practices.

When professionals join a Rotary club, they do so as a representative of their particular business or profession. Basing on this the system of classification was developed, it means A Rotary club should have members from a wide range of classified professionals. This gives Rotarians the dual responsibility of representing their vocation within the club and of exemplifying the ideals of Rotary within the workplace.

This is the month in which our club should dedicate time to discuss the importance of The FourWay Test and the Rotary Code of Conduct. In particular, we should be sure to educate new members and prospective members on the importance of these documents as guiding principles for Rotary's commitment to integrity. During this month many clubs hold local or regional competitions for junior or senior high school students to address the theme "What The Four-Way Test means to me." These contests are an effective way to get young people engaged with the concepts of ethics and integrity.

In earlier days our club has done many work on vocational avenues. I remember the practice in those days in Rotary, we were visiting work places of many Rotarians and were highlighting the importance of Four-Way test. Such visits were fulfilling certain objectives like: increased closeness and bonding among ourselves and highlighting Four-way test, the guiding principles of Rotary.

John F Germ, RI President (2016-17) after his election for the RI President expressed his views on Rotary and told, I quote "Rotary to thrive, members must face current and future challenges and opportunities with passion, enthusiasm, perseverance, and above all, integrity. I envision Rotary boldly and creatively engaging the success of polio eradication, membership and identity

issues, strengthening clubs, work with youth-our future lifeblood, and the creation of critical, strategic partnerships," says Germ. "The 2016-17 Rotary year offers a tremendous opportunity for Rotary International and the Foundation partnership unified and thriving, on all levels, via the six areas of focus." Germ says no one should ever have to ask, "What is Rotary?" "We will enhance Rotary's public image by successfully and enthusiastically marketing who we are, what amazing things we are doing, and incredibly, have done locally and globally." With the global economy still unpredictable, Germ said Rotary must make participation affordable and "also be unfailingly diligent in efforts to ensure we spend every dollar effectively and efficiently," he said.

Here are certain ideas through which we can blend our professional skills and service work through Rotary:

Let us work with the club to create a recognition program for socially consciousness, responsible businesses in the community. For that it is required to establish rigorous criteria for considering businesses and award visible recognition to one, or multiple, selective establishments that meet the established standards.

Our club should host a friendly debate or interactive workshop about hypothetical ethical dilemmas that the club or community may face. We should work through possible outcomes and create expectations and processes for how dilemmas will be handled when they arise and view past ethical dilemma discussions for inspiration and come up with ones that are relevant to our club and community.

We may join the Rotary business fellowship to learn about and support fellow Rotary members' businesses and to share about our own.

We should explore how our same profession is practiced in another country and should share how ours is practiced in our community by participating in a vocationally oriented Rotary Friendship Exchange.

The best way is to keep contact with our district Rotary Friendship Exchange committee to get involved in district designed vocational projects.

With this I conclude my column today. Meet you again with a new topic in the next month. Till then Good Bye.

ensuring fairness in dealings with employers, employees, associates, competitors, and the public. It serves as a reminder of Rotary's commitment to recognizing the value of all occupations and the importance of integrity in business and professional life.

Vocational Service encompasses a range of activities aimed at skill development, employment training, career counseling, job placement, and on-the-job support. It empowers individuals to enhance their employability, transition between careers, or explore self-employment opportunities. Vocational guidance plays a crucial role in helping individuals identify their skills, interests, and long-term career aspirations, assisting them in making informed decisions about their professional journey.

Through vocational education and training, individuals gain practical experience in their chosen fields, equipping them with the necessary expertise even before they enter the workforce. The primary functions of vocational guidance include:

1. Adjustment - Assisting individuals in adapting to educational institutes, workplaces, and the community.
2. Orientation - Supporting career planning and long-term personal development.

Our club is dedicated to promoting vocational excellence and recognizes outstanding contributions in this field. Every year, we present the Late Past President P.D.Bagdi Vocational Award to five individuals for their exemplary contributions to society in their respective domains.

In addition, our RCC Ruchika Social Service Organisation has been actively engaged in skill development programs, offering a range of vocational training courses to empower marginalized communities:

- SMART Skill Training on Office Executive (210 students) - 4-month course covering computer applications, communicative English, workplace readiness, customer relations, and retail sales.
- SMART Skill Training on Customer Relations and Retail Sales (240 students) - 4-month course with similar modules tailored for customer engagement.
- SMART Skill Training on Beauty and Wellness (30 transgender individuals) - 3-month course focusing on beauty and wellness skills, alongside digital literacy and workplace readiness.
- Cutting and Tailoring - Training for 40 women from slum communities.
- Industrial Sewing Machine Operator Training - Skill development for 50 women from underserved backgrounds.
- Beauty and Wellness Training - Specialized training for 10 women from marginalized communities.

All training programs include placement support, ensuring that the beneficiaries have meaningful employment opportunities upon completion.

Vocational Service remains a cornerstone of Rotary's commitment to community development, fostering skill enhancement and professional growth. By equipping individuals with the necessary tools for career advancement, we contribute to building a self-reliant and empowered society. As we observe Vocational Service Month, let us continue to champion initiatives that uphold ethical standards and create sustainable livelihood opportunities for all.

Together, let's make a difference through the power of vocational service.

10. **Address by Dr Sangram Mohapatra on the topic - Oxygen Administrations and requirement :** Rtn. Dr. Sangram Mohapatra

delivered a detailed presentation on oxygen administration, highlighting:

Oxygen therapy is administered to treat or prevent hypoxemia (low blood oxygen levels) and is indicated for:

- Acute or chronic respiratory distress
- COPD exacerbations
- Pneumonia
- Pulmonary embolism
- Asthma attacks
- Postoperative recovery
- Carbon monoxide poisoning
- Shock or severe trauma
- Neurological conditions affecting respiration

Oxygen Delivery System: Depending on the patient's needs, oxygen can be administered through different devices like Nasal Cannula, Face Mask and Mechanical Ventilator.

Steps for Oxygen Administration

1. **Assess Patient:** Determine oxygen requirement through SpO₂ and clinical signs.
2. **Select Device:** Choose based on severity and type of respiratory compromise.
3. **Set Flow Rate:** Begin with the lowest effective flow to achieve target oxygen saturation.
4. **Monitor:** Reassess oxygen levels, respiratory rate, and signs of respiratory distress regularly.
5. **Adjust:** Modify flow rates or delivery systems as necessary based on patient response.

Safety Precautions

- **Fire Safety:** Oxygen is flammable-keep away from open flames or sparks.
- **Humidification:** Use humidifiers for high flow rates to prevent nasal dryness.

- Skin Care: Check for pressure sores or skin breakdown around masks or tubing.
- Avoid Hyperoxia: Excess oxygen can cause oxygen toxicity or worsen respiratory conditions in COPD patients.

When to Seek Immediate Help

- Sudden drop in SpO₂ despite oxygen therapy
- Increased respiratory effort or cyanosis
- Confusion, agitation, or reduced consciousness
- Signs of oxygen toxicity (chest pain, coughing, shortness of breath)

Most importantly always follow institutional protocols and consult healthcare professionals for specific patient care decisions.

9. **Address by Dr Bharadwaj Mishra on the topic-Prevention of cancer cervix in women:** Dr. Bharadwaj Mishra delivered a comprehensive presentation on the prevention of cervical cancer in women, beginning with a sloka from the *Bhagavad Gita* to emphasize the selfless service rendered by Rotarians for the betterment of society. He highlighted that cervical cancer is the most prevalent cancer among women aged 15-44 years, underscoring the critical need for awareness among this demographic.

Dr. Mishra explained that breast cancer is more common among women who do not breastfeed their children for at least two years. He identified several risk factors contributing to cervical cancer, including sexual exposure, intercourse during ovulation, HIV infection, premarital sexual activity, and genital infections.

To combat cervical cancer, he advocated for regular screening and timely treatment. He also emphasized the importance of boosting immunity through practices like yoga, pranayama, physical exercise, and maintaining a healthy diet. Additionally, Dr. Mishra stressed the preventive role of the HPV vaccine in reducing the risk of cervical cancer.

4. Suggestion by PP Sajjan Kumar Sureka: PP Sajjan Kumar Sureka expressed his concern regarding the low attendance of members. He reminded the members that upon joining Rotary, they took an oath to:

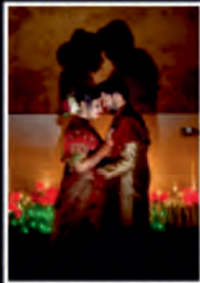

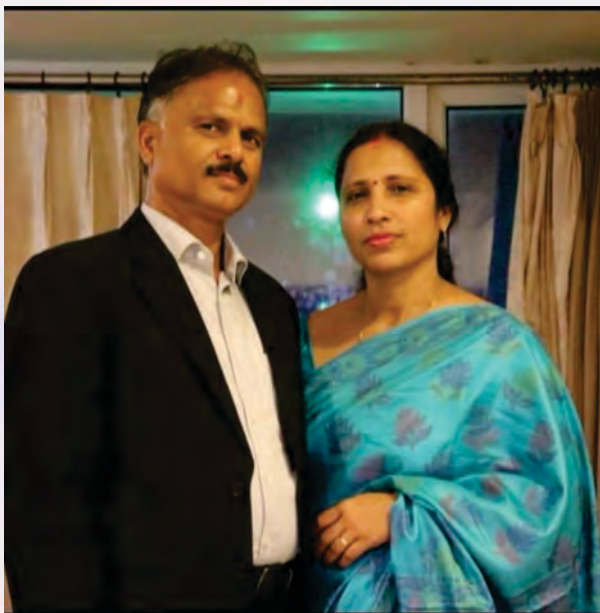
