EYE CHECK-UP CAMP



We are pleased to inform you that the Department of Handloom, Textiles and Handicrafts, Government of Odisha, in collaboration with Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar is launching a highly ambitious and challenging mission to cover the entire Weaver and Artisan community of Odisha within a record period of three months.

This innovative programme, the first of its kind in the country, aims to cover a population of nearly 1,50,000 weavers and artisans. As part of this initiative, we have planned to provide approximately 30,000 eyeglasses to mitigate refractive error–related vision problems. The eyeglasses will include near-vision glasses.

We have committed ourselves to mobilising resources for 10,000 R2C glasses for our proud weavers and artisans of Odisha. Their exceptional craftsmanship has brought international recognition to our state, and this small humanitarian support will help reduce occupational eye hazards and enable them to produce better-quality products.

The inauguration of this mission held on 4th February 2026 at 10:00 AM at Maniabandha, Buddha Vihar. For effective on-the-spot service delivery, we have arranged three mobile eye vans, including our Rotary Vision Care Mobile Van, ten eye-care teams, and an adequate stock of eyeglasses.

Drawing inspiration from the timeless wisdom of the Bhagavad Gita, Swamiji emphasized that our true existence is beyond the physical body and that human identity is fundamentally spiritual. He explained that this understanding, deeply rooted in our cultural inheritance, forms the foundation for inner peace and harmonious living.

He highlighted that self-respect begins with recognizing our true identity and understanding the purpose of life. When individuals become aware of their spiritual nature, ego-driven conflicts naturally diminish. He observed that negative behaviour is often a silent expression of a need for love and understanding.

By respecting others and valuing their contributions to society, conflicts can be transformed into cooperation and mutual growth.

Swamiji elaborated on the concept of Chetana (consciousness) and the influence of the three Gunas:

- Tama Guna (Mode of Ignorance): Leading to confusion, inertia, anger, and destructive tendencies.
- Raja Guna (Mode of Passion): Driven by

ambition, desire, and restlessness, often resulting in agitation.

- **Sattva Guna (Mode of Goodness):** Characterized by clarity, wisdom, balance, and peace.

He explained how these modes subtly capture and influence our thoughts and behaviour. By consciously cultivating Sattva Guna, individuals can elevate their consciousness, thereby fostering inner stability and contributing to societal peace.

The session was deeply reflective and inspiring, reinforcing the Rotary ideal that lasting peace begins within the individual. Members expressed appreciation for the profound insights shared and the practical spiritual perspective on conflict resolution.

Following an open forum discussion, PP Rtn. Sajjan K. Sureka extended heartfelt gratitude to Swamiji for enriching the Peace & Conflict Resolution Month with timeless wisdom.

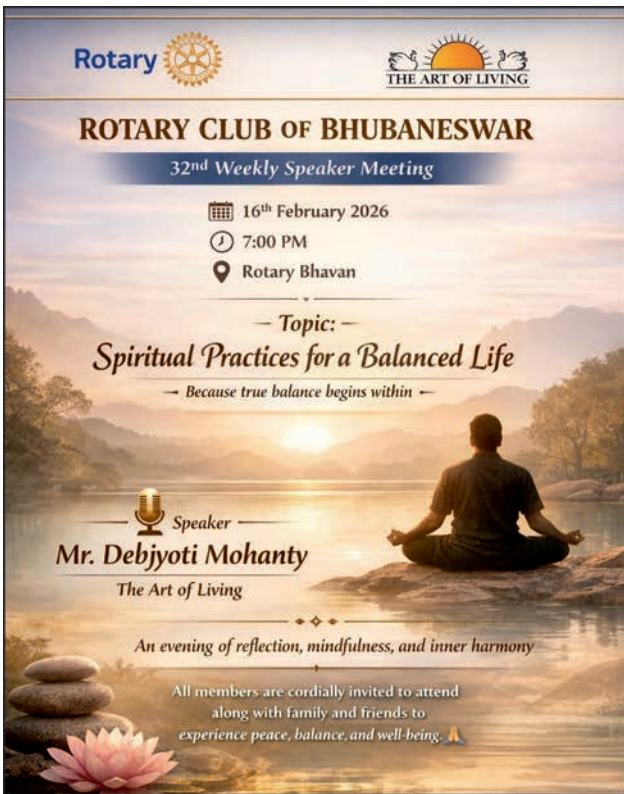
