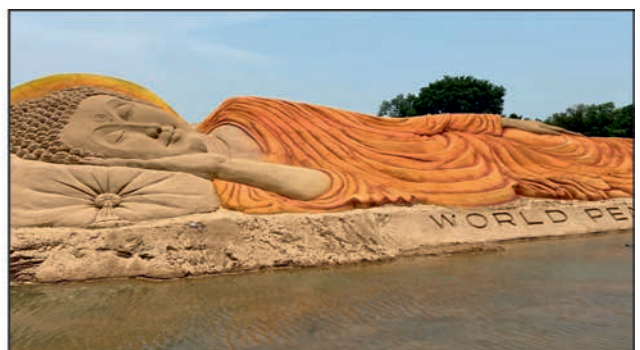
World Record Achievement by Rotary District 3262
