The Rotary Foundation is not just a fund; it is Rotary's engine of impact. Established in 1917 with a modest donation of \$26, today TRF is one of the most trusted humanitarian foundations globally. Its mission is simple yet powerful: **to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.**

What TRF Does for the World

Through TRF, Rotary carries out life-changing projects in more than 200 countries and regions. Some of its key focus areas include:

- **Disease Prevention & Treatment** – Fighting polio, supporting immunization, health camps, cancer screening, maternal and child health.
- **Water, Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH)** – Providing clean drinking water and sanitation facilities.
- **Basic Education & Literacy** – Scholarships, digital classrooms, teacher training.
- **Maternal & Child Health** – Saving lives through better healthcare access.
- **Economic & Community Development** – Skill development, livelihood projects.
- **Peace & Conflict Prevention** – Peace Centers and peace fellowships worldwide.

The most visible success story is Polio Eradication. From 350,000 cases annually to just a handful today, Rotary's leadership, funding, and advocacy through TRF has brought the world to the brink of eliminating polio forever.

TRF Impact in Our District RID 3132

In RID 3132, TRF is not just a concept, it is action on the ground. Through District Grants and Global Grants, our clubs have been actively engaged in:

- Medical equipment donations to hospitals
- Cancer screening and diagnostic support
- Water purification plants

- Maternal and neonatal care
- Community health vans and outreach programs

Every Global Grant, every District Grant, every life touched in our communities begins with one thing — **a Rotarian's contribution to The Rotary Foundation.**

Why the Annual Program Fund (APF) Matters

When a Rotarian contributes to the Annual Program Fund (APF), the money is not lost or locked away. Rotary follows a unique and transparent model called SHARE.

Here's how it works simply:

- Your APF donation is invested for 3 years by TRF.
- After 3 years, it is split:
 - **50% becomes District Designated Fund (DDF)** for our district.
 - **50% goes to the World Fund** for global projects.

The **DDF comes back to RID 3132**, and we use it to:

- Fund District Grants
- Match Global Grants
- Support large-scale service projects
- Multiply the impact of club initiatives

In short:

You donate once, and Rotary multiplies it many times over.

Your contribution today becomes your project tomorrow.

Every Rotarian, Every Year

TRF works best when every Rotarian participates. The philosophy of **"Every Rotarian, Every Year" (EREY)** ensures that the Foundation remains strong, sustainable, and capable of serving future generations.

Contribution is not about capacity, it is about commitment. Whether it is \$25, \$100, \$500, or more, what matters is participation with purpose.

When we give to TRF, we are not donating money; we are investing in:

- healthier communities
- educated children
- empowered families
- peaceful societies
