DISTRICT GOVERNOR Rtn P K RAMAKRISHNA

Ramakrishna Puthiakunhan Kannan who goes by the popular moniker Ramki; was born on December 23rd, 1952, in Oorgaum, Kolar Gold Fields. Embarked on a remarkable journey after graduating from KGF First Grade College. Pursuing his academic aspirations, he enrolled at Manasagangotri, University of Mysore, earning his M.Sc. in Organic Chemistry.



His professional trajectory took an intriguing turn when he joined the Central Electro Chemical Research Institute in Karaikudi. For a year, he delved into the classified realm of Mercuric oxide button batteries, a vital component for the Defence Forces, specifically the Air Force's SARAH (Sea Air Rescue and Homing) project. This initiative aimed at locating lost pilots. Notably, his work involved handling Mercury, leading to research on Mercury poisoning or Minamata disease.

Transitioning to the private sector, Ramki contributed to Sunanda Aromatic Industries in Mysore. In the lab, he played a pivotal role in producing diverse fragrance intermediates for incense, soaps and cosmetics. His entrepreneurial spirit flourished in 1981 when he founded FLOWERSYNTH, a fragrance chemicals manufacturing unit producing over 100 ingredients for the Fragrance and Flavour industry. Ramki is a life member of the Flavour and Fragrance Association of India (FAFAI).

Beyond his professional pursuits, Ramki engages in various ventures. He is a partner at Well-Bloom Agro Products, a company focusing on plant-growth promoters and serves as a Director at Regain Biotechnologies Pvt Ltd, a start-up.

As a member of the American Chemical Society, Ramki incorporates Neuro Linguistic Programming into his professional practice. In 1986, he joined Rotary Mysore Midtown, becoming its President in 1995-96 under the theme 'Act with Integrity, Serve with Love, and Work for Peace'. Over the years, he took on diverse roles at the District Level, including RYLA Chairman, WCS Chair, District Conference Food Committee Chair, District Joint Secretary, Rotaract Awards Chairman, and District Grants Sub-committee Chairman for eight terms, spanning until 2022-23. He actively participated in Matching Grants and Global Grants.

Ramki, a 4-Avenue service awardee, received a District Rotary Foundation Citation in 2001-2002. His commitment extends to training roles at Pre-PETS, PETS, District Assemblies, and AGTS within and outside the district. While his earlier interests revolved around Table Tennis, Carroms and Ball-Badminton, Ramki now finds solace and passion in Meditation, Reading, Research and Fragrances
