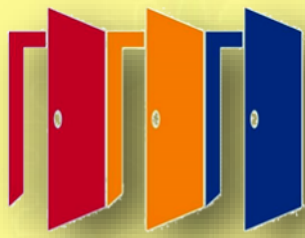

NOMINATE YOUR ROTARACT CLUB(S) FOR THE ROTARY CITATION.

Nominate your Rotaract club(s) for the Rotary Citation.

You will be asked to confirm certain information about each Rotaract club, such as club ID, complete name, and district number, as well as some details about the club's activities.



Only officially chartered, active Rotaract clubs, recognized by Rotary International are eligible for the Citation. A separate nomination must be completed for each eligible Rotaract club. If you wish to nominate more than one Rotaract club you may return to this link and submit another form. However, only one nomination can be accepted for each Rotaract club.

We are aware that in some cases multiple Rotary clubs sponsor a Rotaract club. Only the first nomination received for a Rotaract club will be considered. If your Rotary club and another Rotary club co-sponsor a Rotaract club you may wish to discuss among yourselves which Rotary club will submit the nomination form. Please be advised that not being the nominating Rotary club does not imply that your club is not co-sponsoring the Rotaract club, nor does it negatively impact your achievement of the goal in the Rotary Citation for Rotary clubs for sponsoring or co-sponsoring a Rotaract club. The non-nominating Rotary clubs will still be recognized and achieve the Rotary Citation goal.

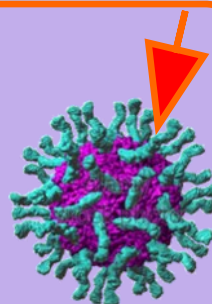
Rotaract clubs must be chartered or updated no later than 30 June 2020 to be eligible for nomination. This will allow enough time for Rotary International staff to process new charters and / or changes before completing this nomination.

All nominations must be completed by 15 August 2020. Nominations received after this date will not be considered.
