SO MANY ROLES TO PLAY

Among the fundamental questions we tend to ask ourselves at some point in our stint in a Rotary club is "What is my role now and in the future?" A person who is seeking to understand service does not belong to any country, religion, political party or some other system. He is concerned with the total understanding of human beings.

An individual cares for his family and as a pan of the society, shares affection with his neighbours. A person deeply wedded to the concept of service, sees the whole world as the family. However, we have been taught to fulfill individual roles as well as universal roles. This has to be done without any conflict. Remaining universal inside and assuming identities and roles outside which is relevant to the situation is the skill Rotarians should develop.

Every person is remembered by the role he played during his lifetime. A leader's role in Rotary is to bring everybody to play a part in developing the club and also make the members yearn for more knowledge about Rotary and how it functions worldwide. It is said that a guru's expression is based on place, time and situation and at the same time he is totally detached.

Many people complain that the Manual of Procedure is a complicated book which only the mandarins in Rotary can decipher. If you want to change the system in favour of the majority which is below the lachrymal line you have to do few things as a priority. One among them is to stand up against what is perceived as wrong by a vast majority of Rotarians in the district. If the system of electing leaders or office bearers in the club is unconstitutional, then everyone must voice their concern. The language of the rules should be made simple, lucid and understandable enough for the member.

Those who decry the system of nominating committee saying that it is concealed exploitation and is formulated by the creamy layer of Rotarians, can debate about introducing neutral members from some other districts. These members can be nominated by RI and assigned to districts only at the last minute. An acceptable system that can produce good leaders in an inexpensive manner can ensure stability to our selection process. If we must cut down on the time, energy and money spent in selection of leaders then everyone has a role to play in shaping how Rotary will be tomorrow.

Rotary gives the opportunity to merge your skills with your ideals. It encourages you to go for more avenues of service and understand people. With Rotary diversifying its activities, service is not restricted by geographical boundaries. Today Rotary wants volunteers to be on the move and work across the globe. It encourages every member to accept challenging roles in bringing in world peace. The need of the hour is to manage virtual teams, invest in trusted relationships, be sensitive to cross-cultural issues and also learn continuously. It is important for a Rotarian to have true appreciation of the differences that exist across continents. Rotarians must have the capacity to rethink boundaries, consider diversity as an asset and view uncertainty as a natural part of service. These are some of the roles you have to play. Are you ready for it?
