

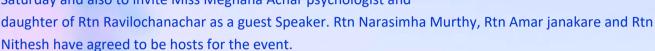

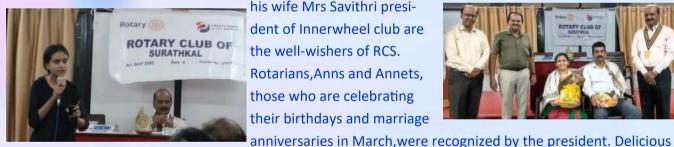

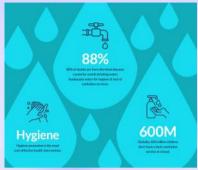

Rotary's efforts in providing clean water and sanitation to all

Rotary International has been at the forefront of efforts to improve access to clean water and sanitation worldwide. Recognizing the critical importance of these resources for public health, Rotary has undertaken numerous initiatives aimed at providing clean water and sanitation facilities to communities in need.

One of Rotary's flagship programs in this area is the Rotary Foundation's Water and Sanitation Rotarian Action Group (WASRAG). WASRAG works to facilitate collaboration between Rotary clubs, districts, and partners to implement sustainable water and sanitation projects. These systems use innovative technologies to purify water from local sources, making it safe for drinking and cooking. By addressing both access to clean water and sanitation, these projects have improved public health and quality of life for thousands of people in rural India.
- **WASH in Schools:** In various parts of the world, including India, Rotary clubs have partnered with local schools to implement water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) programs. One such project in India involved the construction of gender-segregated toilets and handwashing stations in a rural school. Before the project, many students, especially girls, faced challenges in accessing safe and private sanitation facilities, leading to high dropout rates. With the support of Rotary, the school now provides clean and accessible toilets, along with hygiene education programs. As a result, attendance rates have improved, and students, particularly girls, are better able to focus on their studies without the fear of embarrassment or health risks associated with inadequate sanitation facilities.

These examples highlight Rotary International's commitment to improving water and sanitation access in diverse communities, including those in India, and demonstrate the transformative impact of their projects on public health and education.
