

Rotary Protocol and Decorum

Every Rotary Club has to organize a number of functions and meetings. There is a certain protocol to be observed to organize dignitaries, to show them love love and respect of the organization. A proper observance of protocol enhances the prestige of the concerned club and also brings decorum. A few hints on protocol are:

- 1. Any Rotary meeting hosted by a club, and / or a regular meeting of the club should be presided over by the President of the club. The meeting should be called to order by the President and not by the Master of Ceremonies.
- 2. Any Rotary meeting hosted by the District or District Committee will be presided over by the District Governor. Governor will call the meeting to order.
- 3. The protocol to be observed in order of precedence of greetings is District Governor, Past District Governors (seniority wise), District Governor Elect, District Governor Nominee, District Officers, President, Past President, President Elect, and Secretary and so on.
- 4. The General Rule is that current position takes precedence over past position, past position takes precedence over future position, accompanying spouses will have the same ranking.
- 5. Once protocol is observed in a meeting initially, the subsequent speakers need not repeat the protocol. This will help save time and avoid possible foul-up of protocol.
- 6. If the Mayor or the First Citizen of the town is present in a meeting, he should be invited to the dais and should be recognized first.
- 7. In any Rotary meeting if the Governor is present as the Chief Guest, he should speak last. After the speech of the Governor, there should be no further speeches. The only item after his speech should be acknowledgments and vote of thanks.
- 8. During the official visit of the Governor to the Club, there should be no other Chief Guest, Governor being the only one.
- 9. All Rotary club meetings, except training or normative sessions should be concluded as far as possible, within one hour. Care should be taken to ensure that that standard and values of Rotary are not diluted or compromised at meetings.

The functions of Master of ceremony, if at all necessary, should be limited only announce the item of the agenda to be followed. He / she is not expected to make comments on the speeches or assure anything on behalf of the club, which should only be the prerogative of the Presiding Officer.

ATTENDENCE REQUIREMENTS IN ROTARY

Rotary clubs have attendance requirements to ensure members are involved in the club's projects and fellowship. These requirements include:

Attendance percentage:

Rotarians must attend at least 50% of regular meetings in each half of the year, and at least 30% of their home club's regular meetings in each half of the year.

Consecutive meetings:

Rotarians cannot miss or fail to make up four consecutive meetings.

Make-up meetings:

Rotarians must make up missed meetings within 14 days before or after the regular meeting time.

Membership termination:

Failure to meet attendance requirements may result in membership termination.

Rotarians can receive credit for attending board meetings, committee meetings, and volunteer opportunities.

We Did It

While serving in Indian Air Force, I got an opportunity to be a member of Disaster Management Group during a natural disaster.

On 26 January 2001, being a national holiday we were glued to Television to see Republic Day parade. At about 0930 hrs we received a message about an earthquake in Bhuj, Gujarat. At around 1030 hrs an emergency siren was blown which is an indication for the available personnel to assemble at Station Headquartes for emergency briefing. All the personnel inside the unit assembled and we were briefed about natural calamity at Bhuj. Air Force Station Bhuj is a flying station and personnel there also suffered the losses. A total of 15 airmen from different division took off in a MI-8 helicopter at 1200 hrs and reached Bhuj at 1430 hrs.

Inside the Air Force unit extensive damages were witnessed in domestic area. Though the runway had some damages the air strip was usable. The Bhuj city was full fo rubble and debris. The aftershocks of earthquake were felt every now and then. We established our Disaster Management Cell at a corner of Runway. Co-ordinated with civil authorities established contacts with front end and declared runway as opercfiional. The relief materials started to pour in which was sent to different parts of affected areas. We spent our days in the corner of Runway with make shift tents as godown for keeping and distributing the disaster relief materials.

Most of the personnel on posting at Air Foce Station were transferred to some other location to come out of the trauma. The disaster caused by earthquake on that day was massive.

We left for Mumbai after 40 days when things were returning to normal. I got my next posting to a moble Radar Unit in Utarlai Rajasthan in 2003. In 2004 being in a mobile unit, I got a chance to participate in a Exercise at Bhuj area and to my surprise my unit got deployed at a place near to epicentre of earthquake. After four years I could witness the changes that has happened in the place. Bhuj city has been rebuilt or refurbished to such a level that no remnant of earthquake was there. Kudos to people for their resilience and the government of the day for their will.
