
22/02/2025: Many of our Ro-

I felt our members also can benefit by this. I am grateful to Rtn. Dr. Ravilkiran for his permission to reproduce it in this bulletin. Here is the article for you:

"With the due respect to everyone's views n knowledge of fellow Changemakers,

When it comes to membership of Rotary,

We are stagnant since 28 years nly we but its the same case with majority of NGOs, historical n statistical data says that >60% members leaves Rotary in first 3 years of joining. The selection process itself needs refining as the moment we induct new members, they should be given thorough info n knowledge about Rotary and the repetitive learning processes are required to enhance their will n need of service to uplift their spirit unless few leaders induct members just to grab the award making their year memorable, We should also acknowledge that everyone wont join Rotary for service itself but for other reasons like personal development, friendships, extended family, professional connects and we should respect all as they are part of our Rotary's Core Values (Service, Fellowship, Diversity, Integrity & Leadership).

Extending Rotary knowledge to new members n existing members need of hour that's where our RLI {Rotary Leadership Institute} & Learning Centre courses comes into picture where they gives us immense of knowledge which covers all about rotary be it avenues, soft skills or leadership or what not, all these are self explained modules and one can take benefit by glancing through them (if we take these courses outside rotary then each course charges around INR 40,000). There are 200+ certifications that we can do it at Learning Centre, i myself have done 200+ certifications covering entire Learning Centre [Standing at 1st Rank in D3131, Global ranking of 270th] and in RLI on other side, as our tagline says We convert Members into Rotarians which is the sheer example of most of the Rotarians who has undergone this learning curve, which covers one prime base of Inducting Valuable n Quality members and the other being the toughest task i.e. RETEN-TION. Ppl neglect the newly joined Rotarians in most of the cases without knowing exactly what's there interests and likings so that accordingly we can take their ideas n knowledge n expertise to execute our projects, highly inclusive n interesting meetings. We need to tap these untapped potentials where most of the people concentrates only of collection of TRE donations.


I used the word Highly inclusive becoz, on average, the members attends their regular meetings are hardly 30% which is the disturbing factor across the globe and we must also admit that failing in getting younger people is purely bcoz existing members needs to adapt to new changes that Rotary world is going through so that they feel our newly adopted form i.e DEI

Despite of allowing the women members in Rotary way back in 1987/89, we were able to add around 30% of them and significantly we lost the same amount of members stating that we need more retention strategies to be implemented across the globe.


