

Sri Mahalingeshwara English Medium School Interact Club Shines in

ESGRAG Ozone Quest 2025:

The Interact Club of Sri Mahalingeshwara English Medium School, Surathkal, proudly represented District 3181 in the Ozone Quest 2025, a pan-South Asia quiz organized by the Environmental Sustainable Rotary Action Group (ESGRAG) in collaboration with Rotary International. The event was conducted online on 17th September 2025, to mark World Ozone Day.

The Ozone Quest, themed around World Ozone Day (observed annually on September 16), aimed to educate and engage students on pressing issues such as ozone layer depletion, the Montreal Protocol and climate action. Aligned with the 2025 global theme "From Science to Global Action," the event was hosted on the interactive MyQuiz platform, featuring real-time multiplayer rounds that drew participation from schools across South Asia.

Representing District 3181, the Sri Mahalingeshwara team affiliated with the Rotary Club of Surathkal was one of only four schools from the district to qualify for the semifinals, alongside:

- Canara Urva (Rotary Mangalore Metro)
- Government PU College Mulki (Rotary Mulki)
- SDM English Medium School Dharmasthala (Rotary Belthangady)

Finishing among the top four schools in the district, the Interact Club showcased exceptional dedication to ESGRAG's mission of promoting environmental sustainability through youth-led initiatives. The team comprised three talented 9th Standard students: Mohd. Taheem, Havish J. Moolya and Manvi K. Shetty, under the guidance of faculty Interact Club Coordinator Mrs. Keerthi Dayanand.

The team's achievement in reaching the semifinals emphasized the value of participation and learning over competition. This experience underscored that youth involvement in such initiatives is vital to fostering environmental consciousness.

The event concluded a series of Ozone Day activities, including quizzes on the Montreal Protocol and ozone dynamics, which engaged thousands of students across the region. Sri Mahalingeshwara School's spirited participation stood as an inspiring example of how young leaders can drive awareness reminding us that, as the campaign slogan aptly stated, "There is no Planet B."

Interact—Some Facts

- Origin (1962): Rotary International created Interact Clubs to involve school students in meaningful service and leadership.
- First Club: The first Interact Club was chartered at Melbourne High School, Florida, USA, marking the beginning of a global youth movement.
- Age Group: Interact is meant for students aged 12 to 18, encouraging them to take up social responsibility at a young age.
- Name Significance: "Interact" is derived from International + Action, highlighting the vision of globally active youth.
- Sponsorship: Each club is sponsored and guided by a local Rotary Club, ensuring mentorship while allowing student-led initiatives.
- Membership Reach: From a single club in 1962, Interact has grown to thousands of clubs in over 150 countries, reflecting Ro tary's global vision.
- Service Projects: Every Interact Club undertakes at least two major projects annually—one for the local community or school, and one fostering international goodwill.
- Leadership Training: Members develop leadership, organizational, and communication skills, preparing them for future chall enges.
- Values: Interactors practice teamwork, integrity, and responsibility, reflecting Rotary's motto "Service Above Self."
- Youth Development: The program instills confidence, empathy, and civic awareness among students.
- Avenue of Service: Interact forms a vital part of Rotary's Youth Service avenue, connecting young leaders worldwide.
- Pathway to Growth: Many Interactors continue their journey into Rotaract and later Rotary, ensuring continuity of service.
- Global Network: With Rotary's support, Interactors gain exposure to international friendship and cultural understanding.


