The event was organized in collaboration with Project Life Force, a registered organisation aiming to minimize blood



shortage in West Bengal. The guest list included Shri Baiswanor Chattopadhyay, Councillor of Ward 91, Shri Sujit Sarkar, President of Silver Point School, Rtn Suranjana Basu Das, District Interact Committee Co-Chair, and Rotarians from the Rotary Club of Calcutta. The program included a welcome speech, an inaugural song and the guests lighting a ceremonial lamp to mark the commencement of the camp. Principal Mrs Sucharita Roychowdhury felicitated the honourable guests with a potted plant which included the message "Let's Secure Our Future."

The event was made possible by the support of 20 Interactors, 10 NCC Cadets and students from Silver Point School who volunteered at the blood donation camp. They assisted 35 donors, including ex-students, parents, teachers and people from the local community. Each donor received a food packet and a certificate; the total number of beneficiaries was 65. The collected blood was sent to the Indian Blood Bank for further use in honour of the visionary ideals of the Late Shri Pannalal Roychowdhury and to reinforce the Interact Club's commitment to serving society.

In these camps, EYE Check-ups are being done with distribution of free powered Spectacles along with Cataract operations at a later date.

In the eye check-up camp done on 1st July, 14 patients were found requiring eye surgery. Out of which 12 patients have availed free eye surgery. 2 cases required cataract surgery, and 10 patients required phaco surgery.

All the beneficiaries have received a good post-operative report and no



complications were detected. The beneficiaries received adequate guidance on post-operative procedures and were provided free eye drops from the hospital as well as a free first post-operative check-up. The beneficiaries and their household expressed satisfaction with the service and applauded the efforts of Rotary Club of Calcutta.
