This workshop commenced with Pres. Subrata De welcoming all the participating Rotarians and Speakers to this live International Positive Peace workshop. On video, RIP Stephanie complimented R C

Calcutta's efforts to help promote an understanding of the importance of creating peace for friends, families, communities and societies. PRIP Gordon, on video, candidly put it across "I know that many attendees begin to question whether or not peace is possible. I do not exclude myself". However, optimism is demonstrated by the Rwandan 'genocide memorial' in Kigali, for Peace & Reconciliation. At the Memorial working together were Janet (Tutsi) and Tasselly (Hutu), relating their own past memory of hatred, pain & suffering and now working together in rebuilding a future for Peace. Ranganathan, Rotary Peace Activator, Asia Cohort language and communication skills, attitude, group harvest as the main engine for positive peace framework in Rotary. PDG Shyamashree Sen very poignantly spoke of the dangers of increasing Polio cases in the world posing challenges to peace. PP Gill de Warren, Rotary Club of Battersea Park London encouragingly spoke of several ways in which women and girls in Afghanistan are overcoming severe odds including secret schools; enhancing income sources through fine traditional embroidery, Female Mobile Vaccinators network reaching into the villages with advice on health care and vaccinations. PP John Hickey and Margi, Rotary Club of Wilmington, presented on video their interventions in Ukraine such as thermal clothing, clean water solutions, food, water, medicines, shelter boxes, blankets, mats for underground schools. Rtn. Suman Mukerjee, Rotary Club of Calcutta spoke of regional development imbalances within India and warned of Balkanisation and therefore the need to have an all-inclusive approach particularly in respect of the seven sister states in the Northeast. Rtn Adeep Mehta, AG, District 3070, Kashmir detailed some Rotary initiatives in a conflict prone region. PE Debnath Chattopadhyay spoke on a multi geography Rotary team that served over 1000 patients for eye care in Leh in October 2022. PRIP Shekhar Mehta, PDGs Angshuman Bandyopadhyay, Rajani Mukerji, Ravi Sehgal, Prabir Chatterjee, DG Krishnendu Gupta, and PPs Purnendu Roychowdhury, Raj Agrawal were all unanimous in praising this unique and first of its kind initiative and hoped for more such workshops in future.

Rotary Club of Calcutta continues its Mega Project of 50 camps for EYE Check-up in the Rotary year 2024-25. In these camps, EYE Check-ups will be done with distribution of Free powered Spectacles along with Cataract

operations will be done. These camps are conducted as per SOP, and beneficiaries are identified for correction by spectacles or surgery, and the processes are thoroughly explained to them. For spectacles, they are directed to the spectacle desk and contact details of those requiring surgery are noted for follow up. Rotary branding is prominently put. In total, 206 beneficiaries were screened in the camp, of which 131 required spectacle correction and 36 required surgical correction. The beneficiaries expressed their gratitude to Rotary.
