Sukalyan is a specialist in Neuro Interventional Surgery and presently working as head of the department of Neuro Intervention and Endovascular surgery at the Institute of Neurosciences Kolkata. After MBBS, MD from Assam & DNB from New Delhi, he completed DM in Neurointervention at Sree Chitra Thirunal Institute of Medical Sciences and Technology in Trivandrum and then joined the same institute as Assistant Professor and worked till 2007. He also did his CCST from UK and worked as consultant Neuro interventionist at James Cook University Hospital in UK. He did fellowship in Turkey and courses affiliated to France & Canada. Rotary Club of Calcutta like every Rotary Year launched this Rotary Year's Presidential project of Rotary Balananda Dialysis Centre on 19th October, 2024 at Sri Behala Balananda Hospital Research Centre at Behala. This Dialysis Centre has been well equipped with five numbers of Polymed make machines with a support of 750 litres per hour double pass water RO Filtration plant for removing impurities prior to use for Dialysis treatment. The project like every year was sponsored by our PP Rtn. Vikram Somany through Cera Sanitaryware CSR initiative. The entire project cost was INR 40 Lakhs. All these machines come with a five-year warranty with full AMC. This project will give Free Dialysis to Swastha Sathi and BPL Card Holders. Also a special Dialysis Card has been introduced which is being circulated to all the Rotary Clubs along with a letter from the

Panel Discussion: Sparkle the Magic and Making Rotary More Attractive 29 Oct. 2024: AOS Club

Overview: A panel discussion was held at the last RWM which focused on strategies to enhance the appeal of Rotary to both prospective members and existing members who do not regularly attend meetings. The conversation highlighted various aspects of engagement, relevance, and community impact.

Key Themes

- 1. Understanding the importance of Fellowship Heena Gorsia spoke about the value of Fellowship and its role in building friendship and professional connections amongst members which in turn motivates members to come to the meetings.
- 2. Inclusivity and Diversity: Promoting an inclusive culture that welcomes diverse backgrounds and perspectives, making Rotary feel more welcoming and relevant to both new members as well as retention and active participation of older members.
- 3. Personal Outreach Sanjib Basu talked about the importance of reaching out to members with low or no attendance and personalised invitation from the President to come for a Focus Group so their inputs can be taken to understand what they are seeking in a Rotary experience.









- 4. Format of RWM: Sanjib Basu suggested a less structured setting for some of the meetings where if the members sit in two concentric circles, it may increase engagement amongst attendees promoting camaraderie and reducing barriers to participation. We may also want to change the order of proceedings so that the Guest Speaker starts the RWM and regular matters are discussed later. Ritwik Gupta also talked about use of informal venues for some of the meetings which can encourage higher participation.
- 5. Entry Criteria- Sanjib Basu also said that at this time when we are seeking to increase membership and engagement, we should not increase the entry barriers as in joining and other fees which could be an impediment to this goal.
- 6. Mentorship Opportunities: Ritwik Gupta talked about how he became such an enthusiastic Rotarian. Creating mentorship opportunities that connect new members with seasoned Rotarians, fostering relationships and knowledge sharing.
- 7. Vetting of New Applicants Ritwik Gupta felt that candidates referred for the Club should be given careful consideration to ensure that we are inducting members who will serve and embrace the values of Rotary wholeheartedly.
- 8. Community Impact Projects: Increasing involvement in local community projects rather than in far away locations that resonate with members' passions, thereby enhancing the perceived value of membership.
- 9. Timing of Meetings Abhineet Gupta felt the timing of weekly meetings is not suitable for those in employment as they cannot come to a meeting in the middle of their working day. We must think about implementing hybrid formats that combine in-person and virtual attendance to accommodate varying preferences and circumstances.
- 10. Other Suggestions from Members Present Formation of Satellite Clubs amongst like minded individuals who may then help to increase the membership and participation of our Club. This suggestion has come from Rotary International's President Elect when he visited our Club recently. Offering workshops and seminars that focus on development, personal growth, networking may appeal to a wider group of members.

Conclusion

The panel concluded that by adapting to the needs and preferences of both new and existing members, Rotary can enhance its attractiveness and relevance in today's fast-paced world. Continuous evaluation, feedback and adaptation of strategies will be essential to ensure engagement and growth within the organization. This discussion underscored the importance of innovation and flexibility in attracting and retaining members, ensuring that Rotary remains a vital force for good in communities.
