Joydip Kundu



Joydip Kundu is a distinguished wildlife photographer and conservationist based in Kolkata. Alongside his wife, Suchandra, he co-founded the Society for Heritage and Ecological Researches (SHER) in 2011, an organization dedicated to mitigating humanwildlife conflicts, particularly in the Sundarbans region. Their collaborative efforts have been instrumental in promoting sustainable coexistence between local communities. Without formal training in wildlife photography, Joydip and Suchandra have relied on their innate passion and deep connection to nature to capture compelling images of animals in their natural habitats. They firmly oppose photographing wildlife in captivity or under controlled conditions, emphasizing the importance of ethical practices in the field. In addition to his photographic pursuits, Joydip serves as a member of the West Bengal State Board for Wildlife, contributing his expertise to regional conservation





initiatives. Through SHER, the Kundus have implemented various community-based programs aimed at reducing human-wildlife conflicts and fostering environmental awareness. Their work includes skill development initiatives, health and hygiene campaigns, and educational outreach to promote a harmonious relationship between humans and the environment. Joydip's commitment to conservation and ethical wildlife photography has made him a respected figure in the field, inspiring many to appreciate and protect India's rich biodiversity.

Ready Response Rescue - First Aid Training
