Alokananda Roy Guest of Honour



Smt. Alokananda Roy, a celebrated Indian classical dancer, choreographer, and social reformer, has pioneered the use of dance therapy for rehabilitation. A gold medallist from Shri Shikshayatan College, she trained in Bharat Natyam, Odissi, Rabindra Sangeet, classical ballet, and pianoforte. Since 2000, she has used dance to transform lives in West Bengal's correctional homes, founding 'Touch World' in 2010 to rehabilitate prisoners and support their families. Her initiatives now extend to juvenile offenders, specially abled children, Parkinson's patients, the transgender community, and acid attack survivors.

She has represented her work globally, speaking at TEDx, IIMs, IITs, and international forums. She has choreographed for Kolkata Police and India's Border Security Force and has collaborated with prisoners in the U.S. Her groundbreaking efforts have helped nearly 200 inmates reintegrate into society, earning

1. Ajay Mittal : Ajay Mittal is a changemaker and independent consultant driving impactful climate action and sustainable development. Formerly the Director of Climate Change Programs for India & South Asia at EARTHDAY.ORG, he now leads high-impact

collaborations that catalyze systemic change. A recipient of prestigious global honors, Ajay is recognized as one of the EE 30 Under 30 by the North American Association for Environmental Education, a Water Hero by India's Ministry of Jal Shakti, and a Lead 2030 Grant Winner by One Young World.



2. Utpal Panda : Utpal Panda, a pioneer in thalassaemia treatment, empowered parents to lead the fight for better care. Unlike conventional models, his initiative mobilized caregivers, turning passive sufferers into changemakers and revolutionizing patient-led

healthcare. For over 40 years, his unwavering commitment has sustained hope in Bengal, striving for a Thalassaemia-Free society. At 75, he remains dedicated to advocacy, dignity, and inclusivity for thalassaemics, proving that true change comes from perseverance and responsibility.



3. Gour Chandra Sardar : Mr. Gour Chandra Sardar, a Govt. of WB teacher from South Sunderban. As the founder president of NGO Harishpur Mahajati Sangha, Gosaba, he has led impactful projects, including Installing four Tata Swachh safe drinking water projects for

1,200 households. Providing tailoring training to 120 tribal girls & women. Offering free coaching to tribal students, securing admissions for 64 in Parivaar residential school. A guiding force for underprivileged students, he envisions skillbased education for self-reliance. He received the Birsa Munda Award 2024 for his contributions to tribal empowerment.



4. Mithu Banerjee : Mithu Banerjee is a vocational instructor and providing vocational training at Behala Bodhayan, empowers individuals with autism to gain practical experience and job-specific skills. She trains autistic and special children by teaching them

all kinds of handwork. Therefore, contributing notably to society by teaching these children to be independent and self-sufficient. With her help more than 600 autistic and special children have been benefited at Behala Bodhayan.



5. Dr. Aditi Bandopadhayay : Dr. Aditi, a physician with over a decade of critical care experience, specializes in neurophysiology and Dance Movement Therapy (DMT) to aid individuals with Autism and developmental disorders. She is the founder and Managing

Trustee of SAMYA Foundation, advocating for the rights of differently abled persons. Through her foundation, she conducts workshops across India, integrating DMT for cognitive development and skill-building.



6. Suhrid Chandra : Suhrid Chandra, dedicated to sustainability, leads eco-friendly initiatives like Hari Mitti Agro Pvt. Ltd., Hari Mitti Foundation, and Feel Green. Raised in Sodepur, Suhrid's love for nature has shaped him into a silent climate activist. His impact

includes 13 Miyawaki forests with 24,312 trees, 5,650 bamboo plantations, 6,200 fruit trees, and 1,350 rooftop gardens. He supports 1,560 marginalized farmers in Birbhum with sustainable farming.



7. India Autism Center : The Indian Autism Center (IAC) is running a world-class ecosystem that provides comprehensive care and fosters self-reliance for individuals with

autism and related conditions. Their centre in Sarat Bose Road not only provides schooling but also provides vocational training to unlock the potential of each child by overcoming their challenges. This inclusive environment offers free education, specialized training, and vocational development, ensuring personalized care with a 2:1 staff-topatient ratio.



8. Rimo Saha : Rimo Saha, diagnosed with Post Poliomyelitis Paralysis in his right lower limb, has defied all odds to become a certified swimming coach and lifeguard. An international champion, he holds five national

records in the Indian Book of Records and Limca Book of Records. Honored with the prestigious Khel Samman Award by the Indian government, he has won 50 gold, 38 silver, and 19 bronze medals in various global tournaments. His inspiring journey is a testament to perseverance and his commitment to empowering others in the world of competitive swimming.



9. Iswar Sankalpa : Iswar Sankalpa, established in 2007, is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing psychosocial assistance to the urban homeless. In the last 17 years, they have reached out to more than 9000 persons psychosocial

support. Its vocational unit, "Saksham", focuses on skill development and empowerment through tailored vocational training programs. Under the leadership of Chaiti Chakraborty, the Vocational Unit Programme Coordinator, Saksham offers training in sewing, stitching, culinary arts, art and craft, block printing, and tie & dye.



10. Hanshi Premjit Sen : Recognized with the Times Men of the Year Award 2022 and Times Bengal Icons 2023, he has elevated karate's prominence in West Bengal, placing it alongside major sports. Through martial arts training, he empowers women and children with self-defense skills, confidence, and physical fitness, fostering a safer and more

resilient society. His contributions as an athlete, coach, and mentor have brought accolades to the country while uplifting students. He has also created job opportunities in the martial arts sector.

13. Sewli Trivedi: Sewli Trivedi, owner of Sri Sparsham, has dedicated over 25 years to empowering rural women through handloom and handicrafts. She has provided livelihood opportunities to around 100 female artisans across Bengal, helping them gain financial independence and national recognition. Sri Sparsham works closely with women artisans in Birbhum and North 24 Parganas, nurturing their craftsmanship and connecting them to larger markets.
