




Chaka Report on NetSafe Ninjas : A Cyber Security Workshop for Human Minds

The Youth Service and Tech Knowledge Committee, in association with the Rotary Club of Calcutta Metrocity, Calcutta Labanhrad, and Encourage Pathways, successfully organised a hands-on cybersecurity workshop titled "NetSafe Ninjas: A Cybersecurity Workshop for Young Minds" on July 30, 2025, at Rotary Sadan. The initiative aimed to equip participants with essential knowledge and practical skills in cybersecurity, covering topics such as cyber threats, password safety, device security, digital footprints, malware, phishing, and ransomware.

A total of **58 students (Classes IX–XII)** and **15 teachers** from **9 vernacular schools across Kolkata** participated in the workshop. The program was divided into two sessions:

• Session I : An interactive lecture on cybersecurity fundamentals, safe digital habits, types of threats, and cyber ethics and laws, conducted by Prof. Dr. Moutushi Singh from the Institute of Engineering & Management (IEM). The session concluded with a concise quiz to reinforce key concepts.





Patra, Dr. Susovan Jana (IEM), and Rtn. Dr. Saswati Mukherjee (Jadavpur University), where participants engaged in activities such as password strength checking, secure browsing, system hacking, and mobile device tracking to retrieve call history. Research scholars from IEM and Jadavpur University provided technical support throughout the session.

To support the hands-on activities, 30 laptops were arranged, and Alliance Broadband provided high-speed internet with 500 Mbps Wi-Fi. Because of the limited number of laptops, the number of participants had to be restricted.

The workshop began with the **national anthem**, led by students, followed by a **welcome speech by Rtn. Saswati Mukherjee**. The event was smoothly moderated by **Rtn. Ruchika Majumdar** and **Rtn. Amrita Basu** from


