Know your fellow Rotarian - Rtn Aditi Nundy (2025)



This week, we are pleased to share a new column on "Know Your Fellow Rotarian".

Rtn Sarvani Gooptu, Jt. Editor for Chaka sat down with Rtn. Aditi Nundy to uncover her journey, interests, and what inspired her to join the Rotary Club of Calcutta.

SG: Aditi, though you are still a green badger, you have already added value to our Rotary through your enthusiastic participation. Congratulations for that. We are keen to know more about you. Tell us a bit about your educational and professional background.
