

# Report on the Launch Ceremony of the Each to Teach Mentorship Programme











What if one click could connect two Indias — the mentor who guides and the mentee who dreams?



On November 13, 2025, the 6-month Each to Teach Mentorship Programme, powered by the Youth Service & Tech Knowledge Committee along with Pathanam and The Education Trust (TET), was launched at Vidyanjali International School. The program aims to empower rural students



through English and digital fluency, with guidance from urban student mentors. The launch was conducted on Google Meet at 1:00 PM, where student mentors and teacher coordinators from 5 Interact Club schools, Asian International School, Mahadevi Birla World Academy, DPS Howrah, Silver Point School, and Vidyanjali International School, were connected one to one with rural student mentees and their headmasters from 10 schools, Nizamee Model Nursery School (Khargram, Murshidabad), Netaji

Subhas Academy (Palsonda More, Murshidabad), East Point Public School (Kheadaha II, Narendrapur), Aurangabad Angels Academy (Mahendrapur, Murshidabad), Evergreen Model School (Narayanpur, Kakdwip), MGP Child Academy (Canning, South 24 Parg.), Sishu Bharati Path Bhavan (Chandaneshwar, South 24 Parg.), Srijani Nursery & K.G. School (Noorpur, Ramnagar, South 24 Parg.), Suryakiran Nursery and K.G. School (Pathar Pratima, South 24 Parg.) and Vivekananda English Academy (Haroa, North 24 Parg.). More than 100 students from both rural and urban sites joined the Google Meet session to mark the beginning of this initiative.

To officially start the program, one mentor logged into the Pathanam Learning Management Portal with their assigned ID, while a mentee did the same from the rural side. The launch was supported on the ground by Rtn Ashok Basu, who visited East Point Public School, and by Rtn Dr Debnath Chattopadhyay, Rtn Dr Krishna Sen, and Rtn Saswati Mukherjee, who were present at Vidyanjali International School and shared their views about this programme. District Interact Chair Rtn Arpita Chatterjee shared her thoughts on the importance of bridging the digital gap through mentorship. Mrs. Saswati Datta, Principal of Vidyanjali International School, also spoke about the significance of connecting students from different backgrounds.

This programme is not just education;it is about mentors sharing knowledge, mentees finding purpose, and together taking a step toward closing the digital learning gap.

Mrs Malobika Roy from Kult X shared the history and heritage of the ghats and explained their importance in our lives. RtnAnindita Shoma Basu highlighted the murals and wall paintings near Champatola Ghat, an initiative taken up by RC Calcutta in 2022.
