



107th Foundation Day Celebration Special Guest: Shuvaprasanna Bhattacharya



Shuvaprasanna Bhattacharya, widely known as Shuvaprasanna, is one of India's most acclaimed contemporary painters. Born in Kolkata in 1947, he studied at the Indian College of Art and Draftsmanship and went on to become a leading figure in the city's art movement. His works often capture the spirit of Kolkata — it's people, moods, and urban sceneries — blending realism with symbolic depth. Over the decades, he has exhibited extensively in India and abroad, and his paintings are part of prestigious collections worldwide. Beyond his canvas, Shuvaprasanna has played a vital role in nurturing the cultural landscape of Bengal, founding the Arts Acre Foundation to promote art, creativity, and heritage. He is also the recipient of several accolades that includes Banga Bibhushan by the Government of West Bengal (2012), Swarna Samman by Senco Gold (2014), Taj Gaurav award by Taj Association for Art, Culture and Heritage, and the list goes on.





Special Guest: Sounak Chacraverti



Sounak Chacraverti, an independent curator and cultural archivist based in Kolkata, deeply involved in preserving and celebrating Bengal's rich visual and cinematic heritage. His publications include a selection of Bengali poetry from the first Bengali poetry magazine KAVITA [1935 - 1960] established by Buddhadeva Bose, co-edited with the eminent Economist and politician Ashok Mitra. He also co-edited the book [Prasanga: Shakti Chattopadhyay] with the famous writer and poet Sunil Gangopadhyay which is considered as an important critical work. He is the founder of Sensorium - Archiving Popular Culture, through which he has curated exhibitions of rare film memorabilia and ephemera, such as original posters, lobby cards, and film stills, bringing attention to often-overlooked material culture of Indian cinema.

With a strong belief in the power of art to connect past and present, his work bridges the archival, the aesthetic, and the social.

Virangana Programme organised by Women



Countless women have found out the hard way, that molestation and sexual harassment is common in buses, trains, walking alone on deserted streets, at the workplace and even in their own homes. It is practically impossible for any law enforcement agency to deal with these incidents individually.

Eye Camp, Thalassemia Awareness and Snakebite Awareness Camp at Village Chandaa, CD Block DH2, S24 Pgs, 15 Sep 2025

An eye screening camp was organised by the Health Committee in association with NGO Mission Mother and Child that works in the area. About 90 screenings were done and nearly 50 were discovered to be in need of refractive correction. The area appeared to be amongst the least provided anywhere, women were seen to be cooking on wood (collected) fires. It was a Monday and schools were open, numbers started building up a little before afternoon. Mothers and Fathers were very keen to have their children evaluated. Some adults were also examined and prescriptions given. The pictures will give an idea of the complete paucity of passable premises for this activity. Our Optometrists, Sunirmal and Parimal, long standing associates of President Debnath Chattopadhyay, and now our companions in this worthy pursuit carried out a splendid activity despite the heat, humidity, and lack of circulation.

Whilst the Eye Checks continued, a Thalassemia Awareness camp was also organised by the Health Committee. President Dr Debnath Chattopadhyay informed the gathering about this dreaded blood disease that can potentially destroy 2 families (Father and Mother's) to keep a thalassemic child alive with continuous blood transfusion. Prevention is simple, and is rooted in science, which has led to the adage "Microscope before Horoscope" in all marriages. Thalassemia is not curable, but entirely preventable, if only recourse is to science and not mythology. A handbill distributed to the audience is attached.

Post the Thalassemia awareness, an Environment Committee initiative dealt with snake and snakebite awareness. It needs to be said that the area is also the habitat of many snakes, both poisonous and nonpoisonous. Chair for Environment Rtn. Pranab Sarkar informed the audience of strange superstitions, all of it unfounded; a snake's Jacobson's organ that plays a crucial role in finding prey, identifying mates, and also threats. His final take – snakes are an important part of the food chain, keeping rodents and other snakes and reptile populations in check.

Satya Saha, of Mission Mother and Child, then informed the audience about identifying snakebite, and from the bite marks and other symptoms, identifying which snake, to go into a hospital as soon as possible for taking the necessary dosage of anti-venom. He also advised some practices of protection from the deadly Palaj (Common Krait) that often intrude (Hello, didn't we humans intrude first?) into living places. An unobtrusive bite, delivering deadly neurotoxic venom. Protection comes from using mosquito nets and using a torch at night for effective avoidance.

Hats off to Mission Mother and Child Satya Saha and volunteers to have stood by in support. Rtns Atin Sen, Pranab Sarkar, PE Anand Sharma, provided heft, in this initiative led by President Debnath Chattopadhyay.


