Sudeshna Roy was the Chairperson and Advisor of the West Bengal Commission For Protection Of Child Rights. She has been associated with the Commission since 2017.

She is also a journalist, script developer, story writer and filmmaker. She, along with Abhijit Guha, her co director, has made 23 full length feature films and over 30 films for television and OTT platforms. She concentrates on youth centric films with a touch of humour. She is also a columnist with several papers and e-magazines.

Sudeshna Roy also acts on television and in cinema. She however started life as a teacher, then went into journalism and forayed into the world of audio visual.

Her concentration for the last seven years had been in protecting children. She is also a member of the selection committee of the Kolkata





International Film Festival. In the last five years she has curated exhibitions on Soumitra Chatterjee, Satyajit Ray, Amitabh Bachchan, Dev Anand, Goddard, Mrinal Sen, Tapan Sinha, Arundhati Devi, Marcello Mastroaini, Marlon Brando and Harisadhan Dasgupta for the Kolkata International Film Festival. She has edited and put together books on Satyajit Ray, Mrinal Sen, Soumitra Chatterjee and Amitabh Bachchan which were published by the In CA department of the Government of West Bengal.

Her films have been showcased at various national and international festivals. Her latest film Aapish is just released and was showcased at Kolkata International Film Festival and Asian Film Festival at Mumbai.

She is a proud alumni of Loreto College and Gokhale Memorial Girls' School, Kolkata.

Mega RCC Health Camp at The Refuge A Resounding Success



On 28th July 2025, the Rotary Club of Calcutta, in association with Taj Bengal Kolkata, organized the first Mega RCC Health Camp of the Rotary year 2025–26 at The Refuge Orphanage, which has been serving the

community for 125 years. Despite the rain, the event witnessed an inspiring turnout of 163 beneficiaries, including 200 orphan children and 25 elderly residents from The Home for the Haves and the Havenots. The camp provided eye check-ups (130 screened, 25 spectacles distributed by Titan Eye, Taj Bengal), dental care, and general health consultations with medicines. Notably, pediatrician Dr Avinash Yadav and general physician Rtn. Dr Rajib Ghose was present to ensure comprehensive care for the children and elderly. RCC Convenor Mr. Biswarup Dey and his team were instrumental in managing the large number of children with efficiency and compassion. Activity Report of Silver Point School – 28th Foundation Day Celebration, July 26, 2025

The event served as a meaningful platform for 170 underprivileged children from diverse NGOs to showcase their talents while commemorating the school's enduring legacy. The event had





several key goals focused on service and celebration. Its main aim was to create a lively platform for children from different NGOs to show their talents, helping them build confidence and feel included. The 35 Interactors of the school were actively able to connect with those in need, promoting empathy, leadership, and a better understanding of service among the student volunteers.

The day began with a welcome speech by Interactor Baishnabi Prasad, followed by a soulful welcome song performed by the students of Silver Point School. The traditional lighting of the ceremonial lamp by esteemed guests marked the formal inauguration of the event. Among the prominent attendees were Dr. Debnath Chattapadhyay (President, Rotary Club of Calcutta, RID 3291), Rtn. Arpita Chatterjee (District Interact Committee Chair, RID 3291), Rtn. Sulagna Daw (Interact Advisor, RID 3291), and Silver Point School trustees and Founder Mrs. Bani Roychowdhury and Mr. Purnendu Roychowdhury. Principal Ms. Sucharita Roy Choudhury felicitated NGO founders and educators for their dedication and service. A total of 125 children from the NGOs received curated gift bags and lunch packets to celebrate the occasion. The event concluded with a heartfelt vote of thanks by Mr. Arnab Roy followed by the School Song and the National Anthem, leaving behind a powerful message of unity, empathy, and service.
