Celebrating Teachers Day Rtn. Dr. Krishna Sen

India has a long tradition dating back from Vedic times of the guru parampara, or a lineage of illustrious teachers who transmitted the sacred knowledge and were revered by their students or shishyas. Today India is one of around 110 countries that celebrate Teachers Day on various dates to honour their educators and commemorate their service to society, but we have a very special connect with this event since, as we all know, 5th September is not a randomly chosen date. It marks the birthday of our second President, Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan, and instituted in 1962 at his own request. Dr. Radhakrishnan was indeed the most befitting emblem of this day. An eminent philosopher, scholar and educationist, he held the coveted Spalding Professorship in Eastern Religion and Ethics at Oxford University from 1936. But we in Kolkata have an exclusive link with this towering personality. Dr. Radhakrishnan occupied King George the Fifth Chair of Mental and Moral Science at the University of Calcutta for ten years from 1921-1931, before moving to Andhra University as Vice Chancellor. But the paradigms of teaching from the primary to the tertiary levels have drastically changed since then. Gone are the days when teachers expounded and students listened. With the onset of globalization, the exponential rise of an aspirational Indian middle





class, the introduction of India's National Education Policy (NEP) in 2020, and the onslaught of technology and Al tools like Chat GPT, one needs to embrace innovative parameters in teaching if Teachers Day 2025 is to be celebrated in a meaningful manner.

To celebrate this occasion, Rotary Club of Calcutta will be honouring the Coordinators of Interact Clubs and Teachers from NCLCL on 9 September, 2025.

Panchali : The Bengal Narratives Rotary Colts Spark a Night of Inspiration in Kolkata

It was an unforgettable evening at Rotary Sadan on August 28, when the Rotary Satellite Club of Calcutta Colts — the vibrant youth wing of the 105-year-old Rotary Club of Calcutta — hosted the inaugural edition of Panchali: The Bengal Narratives. Proudly sponsored by Rotary Calcutta, the event brought together an inspiring crowd of changemakers, including District Governors, senior Rotarians, cultural icons, and community leaders, all united in celebrating Bengal's spirit through stories of courage and creativity.









The evening was graced by Chief Guest Aparna Sen, legendary filmmaker, actor, and editor. With over five decades of contributions to Indian cinema, multiple National Awards, and an unwavering voice against social injustice, Sen's presence set the tone for a night of reflection and resolve.

A powerful panel followed, bringing together voices as diverse as Bengal itself:

- Ratnaboli Ray, psychologist and human rights defender
- · Monideepa Banerjie, veteran journalist
- Seema Sapru, Principal of The Heritage School
- Sharmila Biswas, Odissi dancer and choreographer
- Doma Wang, Kolkata's celebrated "Momo Queen"

The dialogue, moderated by Josh Prakash Majumdar, Head of the Veera Foundation, explored identity, change, and the rethinking of traditions.

What stood out most were the small but powerful stories shared:

 Ratnaboli Ray urged clarity in distinguishing stress from clinical depression, reminding us that courage lies in choosing the right path over the easy one.

- Monideepa Banerjie offered "stories untold" truths beyond headlines that reveal Bengal's deeper social and political realities.
- Seema Sapru emphasized the irreplaceable value of parental presence, noting, "No privilege can replace the simple gift of presence."
- Sharmila Biswas illuminated histories of women who, despite stigma, chose independence through art and work, reframing freedom as something to be claimed, not privilege granted.
- Doma Wang shared her entrepreneurial journey, proving that persistence, one plate at a time, builds legacies.

The evening was seamlessly anchored by Secretary Rtn. Arijit Sen, with Chairperson Rtn. Mrinalini presiding. Behind the scenes, the young Colts team — Yash, Yashovardhan, Ishaan, Shreyashi, Rajeshwari, Sukrit, Swetashree, Jaysheel, and Anita — worked tirelessly to bring the vision to life. Scoping for Thalassemia Awareness project site with E Rly., Diamond Harbour Venue: Diamond Harbour, Date: 29th Aug., 2025, Time: 8.15 AM







At the invitation of E Rly., a team from R C Calcutta visited Diamond Harbour on 29th August, 2025, to scope for a suitable site for extending a Thalassemia Awareness event. The R C Calcutta team consisted of President Rtn. Dr. Debnath Chattopadhyay, PP Rtn. Dr. Ashoke Basu, Hony. Secy. Rtn. Ashok Basu (Ab4), Community Chair Rtn. Udit Mitra, and Rtn. Amit Ghosh. The team assembled at Sealdah Station at 8.15 AM and was warmly greeted by Dr. Subhankar Hom, CMO, Dr. Kalpana Mondal, Chief Med Superintendent, Dr. Sanjib Choudhury, Asst. CMS, and many others, all from B R Singh Hospital.

The assembly point was a "Salon Car" provided by E Rly. for the trip to Diamond Harbour & back. For many amongst the RC Calcutta team, it was a first ever journey by a Salon Car, a memorable trip, starting at 8.50 AM and reaching destination by 10.00 AM, with snacks & refreshments provided during the journey within the salon.

Adjacent to the Diamond Harbour Station, at the EMU operators training centre & night halt facilities, E Rly. had arranged the day's event. R C Calcutta had a 3-pronged objective for this event, viz.

- Building a relationship with E Rly.
- II. A Health Camp limited to E Rly. staff & their families stationed at Diamond Harbour
- III. An introduction to Thalassemia, scoping a suitable site for a Thalassemia mapping project jointly with B R Singh hospital.

The Health Camp commenced at 10.30 AM, and had a registration counter with routine check-up for height, weight, BP etc, an eye-check- up counter (manned by Dr. Arnab Mitra), a counter for pulmonary checks (manned by Dr. Navendra Jena), all doctors from B R Singh hospital. Approximately 80 persons attended the Health cum Medical camp.

Once the camp was in operation, a talk on Thalassemia was delivered by PP Rtn. Dr Ashoke Basu, to explain the disease, how it is transmitted only through the blood-line, its gravity from patient's mortality and family's financial burden point of view, finishing off with the tag-line "Microscope before Horoscope" as the only means of its eradication. A video on Thalassemia Awareness was forwarded to Railway Protection personnel in uniform, who will arrange for presentation to railway staff (at Diamond Harbour or other railway township under E Rly.) and Dr. Hom, CMO will share feed-back with R C Calcutta to agree the future initiatives.

On conclusion of the day's proceedings, the team were escorted to the luncheon site, (via a detour through Purna Lakshmi Resort on the riverbank, for a tour of the facilities and the river view), to a restaurant pre-arranged, and served with a sumptuous Hilsa lunch. Post lunch, and after extending thanks & gratitude to all E Rly. people, we travelled back to D H Station and took the return journey in the salon car, along with B R Singh hospital doctors.

Report on STEM Awareness Seminar – Youth Service, Tech Knowledge Committee









The Rotary Club of Calcutta Youth Service and Tech Knowledge Committee, in association with JSR Eventers, organised a STEM AWARENESS SEMINAR on August 31, 2025, at Rotary Sadan. The initiative aimed to inspire young minds by highlighting the critical importance of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) in solving real-world challenges and exploring innovative opportunities and pathways.

A total of 55 students (Classes XI–XII) and 10 teachers from 7 schools across Kolkata participated in the seminar. The seminar featured two distinguished speakers. Dr. Jaideep Talukdar, Vice-Chancellor of Silicon University, Odisha, shared his extensive expertise from over four decades in both academia and industry. Holding a Ph.D. in Engineering from UNH, USA, his specializations include environmental engineering, renewable energy, and fibre-optic sensors. He was joined by Mr. Rajarshi Roy, an experienced educator specializing in mathematics, quantitative aptitude, logical reasoning, and data interpretation. With over 18 years of experience preparing students for national-level competitive exams, Mr. Roy currently serves as an Assistant Professor of Mathematics at Tutopia Learning App. The seminar provided several key takeaways, including a deep understanding of the problem-solving approach central to STEM education. Participants gained insight into the scientific method as a structured way of inquiry, which emphasises careful observation, the development of testable hypotheses, and rigorous experimentation. The seminar also highlighted effective, quick problem-solving techniques in mathematics, which are essential for competitive exams such as JEE (Mains), SAT, GRE, and GMAT. Finally, the program focused on fostering the critical thinking and analytical skills that are vital for academic success.

The workshop began with the national anthem, led by students, followed by a welcome speech by Rtn. Saswati Mukherjee. Mrs. Ananya Majumdar of JSR Eventers moderated the event. In a special gesture, District Interact Advisor Rtn. Sulagna Daw was felicitated with an Uttariya. The distinguished speakers were also felicitated by members of our club. President Rtn. Dr. Debnath Chattopadhyay and PP Rtn. Nilima Joshi addressed the audience with words of encouragement. The seminar was also honoured by the presence of several dignitaries, including Dr. Geetanjali Mukherjee, Joint Secretary of the National Education Forum, and Dr. Rekha Vaishno from the Rotary Club of Dehradun.

The registration desk was managed by volunteers from JSR Eventers and Lopamudra Dutta (JU). This seminar would not have been possible without the essential support of President Rtn. Dr. Debnath Chattopadhyay, Hon. Secretary Rtn. Ashok Basu and the dedicated staff of the Rotary Club of Calcutta. The program was honoured by the presence of several Rotarians, including PP Rtn.
