Annual Children's Treat 10 Dec. 2023: AOS-Community

Ninety-Eight years ago a sunshine project was initiated, which has ever since become a source of joy to underprivileged and orphaned children. In 1925 a programme of entertainment of underprivileged children was conceived by the Rotary Club of Calcutta. It received the immediate approval of all Rotarians and more so of their Annes, who with zest and enthusiasm took active part in its execution.

The 98th Annual Children's Treat was held in NICCO Park on 10 Dec. 2023, the usual excitement and energy evident. About 1200 plus children from 22 Institutions and RCCs participated. The total gathering including 40 Interactors, Interact Co-Ordinators, Volunteers, Ex Rotaractors, Rotarians, R-Anns, and Children's escorts counted to about 1500. IPP Raj, IPS Anand, Rtns Anand Bhuwalka, Yogesh, Ravindra and R Ann Madhu shared the responsibility of dispatching the buses from Rotary Sadan at 6 am! Breakfast and Maaza was served in the Buses. Children who came to Nicco Park directly were given breakfast packs and the beverage on arrival, apart from a health drink sponsored by President Kanak Dutt. Caps were distributed to the children, and all present. Breakfast for the volunteers at Rotary Sadan was organised by Rtn K K Kothari.

Pres Kanak Dutt welcomed all to the of beat of martial music by the Military Band that the children enjoyed thoroughly and inaugurated the program. The Military Band was organised by Secy Sarvani Gooptu.

Chief Guest Lt Gen Rana Pratap Kalita GOC in C Eastern Command arrived around 1145 am and was warmly welcomed by President, Secretary and all Rotarians and R Anns. The Chief Guest then addressed the gathering. Mr. Rajesh Raisinghani, MD Nicco Parks was also present to welcome the Chief Guest. The Chief Guest along with President, Secretary, Rtn Probir Gupta toured the entertainment area in a battery-operated vehicle. After exchanging pleasantries the Chief Guest departed, but not before, at Rtn Hirak Ray's request supported by all others, he agreed to become an Honorary Member of the Club. A mentionable here is that the early branding for Nicco Park was "Escape from Reality" — Rtn Probir mentioned this in his short address on the origins of the park.

Lunch was served at about 1 pm. The veg lunch was prepared by Rtn K K Kothari's organisation under the supervision of Mr. Madan Kothari. Lunch was served by R Anns and other volunteers. The Nonveg lunch was sponsored by The Taj Group and served by personnel from the hotel. Thanks to Rtn Partha Mukherjee for arranging this sponsorship.

Lunch was followed by a magic show much to the delight of the children. And some adults too, populating the ringside seats!

Around 3.30 pm the program concluded, and it was time for the children to return to their respective institutions. Gift hampers that had chocolates, games, biscuits, and soft drinks were handed over to the children. Courtesy PP Heena Gorsia, Ice Creams sponsored by Thakers were distributed. Rotarians, R Anns, and Staff of Rotary Sadan assisted in the handover of gift bags.

Adult Vaccination Camp at Rotary Sadan on 12 Dec. 2023 - Club Service







"Immunisation camp 2" - a fantastic initiative on adult vaccination was organised by the health committee at the Rotary Sadan, Kolkata with the help of Matri pharma and GSK pharmaceutical company. Appropriate adult vaccination strategy has been strongly recommended by several health authorities such as WHO, centre of Communicable

Diseases etc. A total number of 40 members got vaccinated with pneumococcal vaccine, influenza vaccine and the latest herpes Zoster Vaccine. An active participation of all the Rotarians was highly appreciated.

Lakshya Scholarship on 14 Dec. 2023 – AOS: Community; AOF: Supporting Education





On 14th December, 2023, RC Cal organised the award of this year's Lakshya Scholarship Program for 250 students of 9 government aided schools. These students will be able to access BYJU's teaching material through the Learning app for next three years which will add immense value in their education journey.

The scholarship is provided to the tune of Rs. 80,000 per student, allowing them access of three years on the app. RILM will be facilitating the sign-up link to the official email id's

provided at the time of registration, which will be coordinated through the school principal and staff. The students can select the language of their choice to access all the modules for studying. This app is through the CSR wing of BYJU's, so no parents will be bothered with marketing calls if they follow the instructions given. The app will adapt to the student's performance, accordingly they will be able to grasp the content. Representatives of the RILM, including Ms. Ritu, were present to explain the modus operandi of the scholarship program. A nodal teacher will be able to generate quarterly reports to monitor each student's performance.

A Q&A session with RILM reps was fruitful. Teachers also expressed the concern for students not covered under BYJU's scholarship. RILM representatives were kind enough to elaborate about E-Siksha module, which can be accessed through the **rotaryteach.org** website which is free to sign-up for students. A teacher also picked up the importance of mental health support for students. Special Projects chairperson Rtn. Arindam has given his word to connect the concerned teacher with Rtn. Sourish of District 3291 who spearheads the mental health programs for kids. Mrs. Shrimati Ghosh thanked RC Cal for taking the initiative of connecting these schools with RILM. The program ended with Hony. Secretary Rtn. Sarvani Gooptu's vote of thanks and appreciation of green badger Rtn. Sonia Dutt for her contribution towards this Lakshya scholarship. Community Service chairperson Rtn. Yogesh Dassani & Literacy Chairperson Rtn. Sriranjani Joshi were vital in the coordination with schools. 15 members of RC Calcutta were present.


