CDC aims to encourage quality public speaking amongst students and chairs the largest open Debate in India. He is a healthcare activist and a popular speaker on English and Bengali TV Channels. He is one of the most followed speakers on health and social issues on Social media and has authored the book 'The Sickness of Health' (his first), an authoritative read on the status of healthcare in India. He started one of the first health apps from Kolkata. He relentlessly pursues the goal of accessible healthcare in India and has conducted more than 500 free health camps across Bengal.

The incumbent DG of RI Dist. 3291, Hira Lal Yadav, is a member of the Rotary Club of Hooghly since 1995, served as its President from 1998 to 2000. He is a Plywood Manufacturer and a graduate of Calcutta University. He successfully revived a struggling Rotary Club of Hooghly, which had faced closure, and established the Rotary Hooghly Eye Hospital in 2000 with just eight members and a rented building. Its success led to

the construction of a three-story building in 2013, making it a renowned Eye Care Centre in Rotary District 3291. Yadav's impact extends beyond Hooghly. He has helped establish Eye Hospitals in 18 clubs in India and 2 clubs in Bangladesh. Currently, he serves as the Chairman of several Rotary Eye Hospitals, performing thousands of surgeries and treating hundreds of thousands of patients. He has also contributed significantly to completing 82 Global Grant Projects for various Rotary Clubs in India, Bangladesh, Singapore, and the UK. Additionally, he facilitated the construction of tubewells in remote villages, arranged heart surgeries for underprivileged children, established a primary school at Hooghly Railway Station, and supported an orphanage called "Vivekananda Ashram" for over two decades. He actively collaborated with the District Administration of Hooghly, participating in the implementation of Central Government Development Schemes. For his outstanding service, he is recognized as a Major Donor and has received the prestigious "Service Above Self Award" from Rotary International.

HMC Rotary Blood Center AOS : Community; AOF Fighting Disease 16 Feb. 2024

The first Blood Center in Rotary International District 3291 was opened on 16th February, 2024 by Shri Arup Roy, Hon'ble Minister In Charge, UD & MA Dept, Govt. of West Bengal in presence of Hon'ble Chairman Shri Dr. Sujoy Chakravarty, Howrah Municipal Corporation in the name and style of HMC Rotary Blood Center. Eminent Guests RID Rtn. Anirudha Roychoudhury, DG Rtn. Hira Lal Yaday, PRIP Shekhar Mehta and PP Rtn. Vikram Somany also graced this ceremony. As the Old Number One, Rotary Club of Calcutta in every Rotary Year has a Presidential Project with a big ticket totally sponsored by the members of the prestigious club. This year under the leadership of President Rtn. Kanak Dutt, the club implemented this project with a project value of Rs 1.10 Crores. Our member and PP Rtn. Vikram Somany partnered this grand project through the CSR of Cera Sanitaryware Limited. HMC Rotary Blood Center is fully digitized modern state of the art Blood Center established at 50, Panchanantala Road, Howrah located beside a Thalassemia Childrens Transfusion Center which will be a great benefit for the children and their parents. This blood center is the first in the entire District of Howrah and it will be a great benefit for the people of the other neighbouring districts of Hooghly also. The HMC Rotary Blood Center is a fully digitized center with a capacity of storage of 800 bags every month. The modern equipment is connected to a server which will be controlling the total system and will be collecting the data and uploading to the Govt. Health Department on daily basis. Blood Storage refrigerators, Blood Plasma refrigerators, Centrifuge Machines, Elisa Readers, etc. are all state of art machines. The HMC Blood Center will also have a Blood Transportation and Collection Van donated by Rotary Club of Salt Lake City Calcutta initiated by President Rtn. Oindrilla Guho. What a way to work in Rotary by joining hands and making this project a grand success. This HMC Rotary Blood Center will be a great benefit to all the Rotary Clubs of RID 3291 where all members will get blood upon request letter from the sitting President of the Club. Rotary Clubs upon doing Blood Donation Camps will invite the HMC Rotary Blood Center for participation and collection of Blood pouches. In return, Donor Cards will be given to the clubs for helping the community. Project Cost : Rs 1.10 Crores Time Taken : 2 months (Starting to Implementation)

Ravindra Khandelwal's account of HMC – an account and appreciation!

Our President Shri Kanak Dutt had a dream, and everything fell into place. With the intention of setting up a blood bank, Rotary Club of Calcutta decided to look beyond the periphery of Calcutta and identified that Howrah did not have a blood bank. This opportunity to serve was taken up by Special Projects Committee Chair Arindam Roy Chowdhury. Bhoomi Puja was conducted on 8th of December. HMC Chair Dr. Sujoy Chakravarti was kind enough to allot the space on 2nd floor of the new block of the premises in which Dr. Sital Chandra Ghosh Laboratory is also situated for Thalassemia patients in need of regular transfusion. Chair Arindam RC extensively mobilised members who pooled in their resources. Subsequently, contractors were called for quotations and identified through discussion with HMC. More than 50 donors from Rotary Club of Calcutta volunteered to donate for this mega project. Furthermore, even members of other clubs of Rotary Dist. 3291 came forward. Rotary Club of Salt Lake City, led by Rtn. Oindrila Guha came forward to offer a Blood Transportation Van for transport of blood pouches from camps to the Blood Centre. Various jobs in setting up the infrastructure of the blood bank like false ceiling, CCTV, civil jobs, sink installation, painting, lights, switchboards, air-conditioners, electrical lines, and power channel distribution for high-capacity machines were all completed within 31st January. All materials that entered the premises was monitored by HMC representative recording all material in/out movement. HMC Chairman Dr. Sujoy C. was keeping a close eye on the developments and conducted an inspection of site before fitment of machines and instruments. The machines of the blood bank arrived on site on 9th February at 10 pm, including Centrifuge (which separates the components of blood), Plasma freezer, Platelet incubator, Blood refrigerators, Plasma expresser, Thawing bath, Elisa reader, Ph meter, Laminar air flow, Donor couch and all other supporting instruments. Co-chair Ravindra was there at site on 9th Feb. from 9 pm to midnight to receive the shipping consignment from Labtop Instruments Ltd., Maharashtra and ensure the safe lifting of instruments from truck to 2nd floor with forklift and labour support, in coordination with HMC representatives and electrical contractor and blood bank consultant.

On 12th February, Labtop Instruments sent a representative for installation of all machines and instruments which was completed in two days and monitored for two more days. On 16th February, the grand inauguration ceremony was conducted at the site with a ribbon cutting ceremony by Shri Arup Roy, Minister in Charge. The stage was set at Bankim Park for the handover ceremony. Shri Firhad Hakim, MIC, UD & MA dept., Govt. of WB was present through a video call at the event due to his hospitalisation. Both Shri Arup Roy and Shri Firhad Hakim congratulated and thanked Rotary Club of Calcutta for the gift of Blood Centre to the citizens of Howrah. They repeated how Rotarians are always jumping on the opportunity to serve humankind without a second thought. The MC also invited our DG Hira Lal Yadav, RID Anirudha Roychoudhury, PRIP Shekhar Mehta and President Kanak Dutt to speak at the event. Shri Smrutiranjan Mohanty, IAS, Commissioner of HMC, offered the vote of thanks. In the end the HMC Rotary Blood Centre is handed over to Howrah Municipal Corporation to operate with capacity of 800 pouches of blood, an essential boost to the citizens of Howrah who didn't have the privilege of availing emergency services in times of need.

For the benefit of the readers of The Chaka, I as the author of this report would like to mention some names here. We cannot be grateful enough to our principal donor Rtn. Vikram Somany ji for the purchase of all machines and instruments. His support has made this a reality without any grants. It is his contribution that brings fruit to most of our service opportunities. Rtn Sonia Dutt has been a pillar of support for the smooth execution of the Blood Centre including overseeing of all coordination with vendors and related parties. All signages and branding has been taken care of by her with the guidance of the committee. Rtn. Arindam RC would not agree with this special mention, but the credit of seeing the project to implementation till launch stage goes to him. His active leadership of the Special Projects Committee has inspired many in the team to learn from his leadership. This level of service is contagious to the Special Projects team. Last but not the least, I cannot forget to thank the able leadership and guidance of our President Shri Kanak Dutt and our Hony. Secretary Dr. Sarvani Gooptu. Their vision is unparalled while being sohumble and diplomatic in their approach. We have much to learn from the individual personalities of such leadership in The Old Number 1!
