Ms Alokananda Roy is a classical dancer, actor, reformer who conjures an image of grace and elegance. Her versatility comes through in her innovative dancing styles and creative stage productions. Taking immense pleasure in being involved with varied creative activities, she did never refrain her from extending genuine care and compassion to the society at large. As far back as she can remember, she always wanted to dance. Her aspiration was well appreciated and supported by her parents. She got associated with the CLT (Children's Little Theatre) at an early age and this was her favourite place to be in. Bengali film buffs will recall her strong and defining role in Ray's Kanchenjunga. She went through an intense spiritual experience as she met Shri Aurobindo and Ma in Auroville at the tender age of 17.

She has chosen to work in the secluded world of convicted individuals in the Correctional Homes of West Bengal, for their welfare, through Dance and Music. Her <u>organization Touch</u> World operates to care for the





children of the convicts, deprived of family support. That made her initiate Inspiration Foundation, an initiative that trained underprivileged children in dance, music, recitations, and art.

She has been decorated with numerous awards and honours, including Rajya Sangeet Academy Award (2014), Tumi Ananya (2014), Bharat Nirman (2008), Sharbabharatiya Sangeet —O-Sanskriti Parisad (2014), Michael Modhusudan Award, Bongo Bibhushan (2014).

Of course, the reward she treasures is the unconditional love of the millions she received and is still receiving.

RI Orientation Workshop

The novel & unique orientation workshop was organised by RC Calcutta at the behest of RID Aniruddha Roychoudhury. President Kanak Dutt inaugurated the program, and Rtn Roshni Ganguly led the National Anthem. President welcomed each of the 6 PDGs (including our very own Rtn Prabhat Rohatgi) and felicitated them. In his opening remarks, RID Aniruddha emphasised 'How Rotary is Changing' as the genesis of the programme and designed this structured workshop for club leaders of 'The 'Old No. 1', referring it to a Fountainhead.

- 1. RID commenced with a self-introduction by all club members, (i.e., Leaders) present, enquired as to the reasons for Membership decline, and opined that Leadership could be the primary issue.
- 2. PDG Ravi Sehgal in his presentation described the challenges of membership decline, and attributed it to:
 - i) Over 50% members are in age bracket of 60+ years and constitutes rich knowledge & experience.
 - ii) In newer & younger members there could be lack of one-toone contact, resulting in lack of encouragement.
 - iii) For addressing attendance, he suggested organising projects in members' location, enabling participation.
 - iv) He proposed forming satellite clubs to support members from different & diverse locations.
 - v) He emphasised membership. He indicated a lack of structured engagement mechanism leading to absenteeism, and cited example of RC Purulia expanding from one solitary eye hospital to three now including a multi-speciality hospital and enhancing club admission fees to Rs. 4 Lacs to ensure funding for future projects on an on-going basis.

For the Old No. 1, it needs to "Leave a Legacy".

3. PDG Rajani Mukerji stated that the Rotary website where Rotarians are referred to as "People of Action", necessarily implying 'execution on the ground' (citing example of an e-club being the 1st to send disaster relief to Uttarakhand flood victims) and indicated 40% of club members must fall in this category. He proposed conducting a structured Satisfaction Survey, format of which is available in Rotary India website, and based on survey findings constituting a formal Committee for Strategy, focused on

addressing the shortcomings revealed in the survey findings. He assured support required in conducting this survey will be given by his District office.

- 4. PDG Prabir Chatterjee in his address detailed the "rotary.org.Rotary Club Central" website updation, nuances encountered, data generally omitted due to oversight, and consequential defects for Presidential Citation Award. The end use of data in rotaryindia.org with rotary.org was elaborated, the former being specific for India, whereas the latter gives an overview on a global perspective. He too assured help & support in execution in data updation.
- 5. PDG Binod Khaitan expressed 'service to community' by the philosophical phrase Tan-Man-Dhan, (i.e., with energy, application of mind and money), resulting in 'giving' in the Rotary perspective. The giving must be compassionate, without any expectation of a reciprocation. He further differentiated Output and Outcome, and that it must not hinder in receiving by the beneficiary.
- 6. PDG Sudip Mukherjee, (current DRFC), explained Rotary's resource is the Foundation, and urged contribution to the TRF as against directly to the project, emphasising that in Foundation the project funding multiplies four times, (as in case of Global Grants). This ensures undertaking big projects which would not be possible by club funding only. He cited example of the RC Calcutta that over last 10 years (2013 to 2022) against a giving of \$ 0.9 Mn the club has received funding from the Foundation of \$ 2.1 Mn. He gave glimpses of various grants and the new addition of scale grant, which is \$ 2.00 Mn, awarded one grant per annum on a global basis.

All the addresses by PDGs were extensively supported by detailed powerpoint presentation. At the request of the President Kanak, RID Aniruddha Roychoudhury committed he will repeat this type of session/workshop again after 6 months if the club so desires. President Kanak thanked all PDGs for their time and the highly informative deliberation & interaction, adjourned the workshop and invited all present to an elaborate High Tea.

July being the month for Mother & Child Care, on behalf of the Club the President Rtn Kanak Dutt organized a camp at the Institute of Child Health at 11, Dr. Biresh Guha Street, Park Circus, Kolkata 700017 on 20th July 2023 at 10.30 am for sharing some Love and Care for the Paediatric Patients of the Institute. This camp was organized by our senior member of the Club Dr. Ashok Basu, who is a Board member of the Institute mentioned above. We offered each Child patient of the Institute a Gift hamper containing Fruits, Horlicks, Biscuits, Cake, Chocolate, some munchies, and juice. There were around 250 beneficiaries. The Children who are mostly extremely sick some cancer patients were happy to receive such hampers and love from us.

Dr Deepshikha, the lady in red dress, oversees the cancer ward. The Director, Dr J Roy, told us that Deepshikha treats the patient-children as her own children. It was so reassuring to hear such a thing in an overriding ambiance of doctor-bashing. I spoke at length with the mother of a 3-year-old boy. They are from Sonarpur. The boy had kidney cancer, is cured now, and they will go home tomorrow. Her elder child, a nine-year-old girl, also had identical kidney cancer a few years ago and was cured here. I asked her: Do you have any idea why both siblings had a similar cancer? She said, "The doctor said it is genetic. Must be so." Her husband owns a shop that sells angling equipment and accessories in Sonarpur. The husband is looking after the daughter at home. They are entirely satisfied with the hospital. I salute the founder of the hospital, the late Dr Kshirode C Chaudhuri, the present director, and other doctors. My respect goes to our fellow Rotarian, Dr Ashok Basu, a renowned paediatrician who is a board member of the hospital, for organizing the event. Even in the middle of our visit, Dr Basu ran to the OT to attend an emergency query from a doctor. I am totally humbled by the visit.
